We faced number of challenges during our journey from 40 bedded eye hospital to tertiary Eye care center.

First of all, we faced the shortage of trained paramedical staff, so we have started training programme for local youth & after the training, we recruited them as our technical staff and they are performing well.

Then another challenge was the shortage of space as the workload increased drastically as there was no other eye care facility in the area & our quality work, good infrastructure facility & vehicle support to transport the patients earned good Reputation. To overcome this challenge, we have constructed another building behind the hospital with training centre, staff quarters and dormitory - kitchen facility.

We applied the strategy of continuous training-technical as well as soft skill training which has been boon to improve the behavior & technical skill of our staff.

People appreciate the conduct of our staff which is a matter of pride for us. With the help of positive attitude & humane behavior of our staff, we are able to overcome all the challenges.

With all limitations and challenges, we have performed more than 85000 surgeries including 12816 surgeries during the year with the grace of GOD and co-operation of staff & well-wishers.

It took a very long time to convert agricultural land to non-agriculture purpose at Amalsadi near Mandvi so when we face shortage of space, the management of 'Poonamwadi' generously helped us to accommodate the patients. We are thankful to them. Now, that the conversion of the land to non agriculture purpose is completed and drawings are also approved, we plan to start construction work as soon as possible. However, due to CORONA pandemic, the dates are not yet final. We hope that whole hearted support of well wishers will continue for the Amalsadi campus project also. Thanking you for your continuous support.

The Dream came true



"Dream is not what you see in sleep, is the thing which doesn't let you sleep." - APJ Abdul Kalam

After achieving M.S. degree in Ophthalmology in 1991, it was dream of Dr.Uday Gajiwala to establish an eye hospital in which all types of eye care services are available under one roof for all people without discrimination of caste – creed on charitable basis.

He had a vision "Nobody should become needlessly blind" and tried to achieve it relentlessly.

With this dream, soon after completion of M.S, he joined SEWA Rural - an organization working for rural tribal community of Bharuch district in 1991, worked there for 20 years and put in tremendous efforts to make Bharuch district avoidable blindness free.

Divyjayoti Trust Mandvi, Dist- surat was established in Jan 2010. After registration of the trust, an unused building of "Luster Diamond co" was obtained on rental & renovated the same and converted in to a 40 bedded Eye Hospital. The Hospital was inaugurated on 22nd May 2011.

The workload in the hospital progressed very fast due to clarity of vision, experience of 20 years and need of the community. Over 9 years, we have achieved unexpected milestones.

Initially, there was only one Ophthalmologist doing cataract surgeries mainly, but the trustees, Dr. Bakulbhai Trivedi and Dr. Amishbhai Patel started visiting the Hospital monthly or twice in a month as oculoplasty Surgeon & Retina Consultant respectively. In addition, Dr. Madhviben Sheth - Retina consultant, Dr. Meenaben Doshi – Glaucoma consultant , Dr. Bijalben Mehta & Dr. Prakashbhai Nayak – Cornea consultants, Dr. Nitinbhai Jain - pediatric ophthalmologist & Dr. Nileshbhai Naik, DR. Jagdeepbhai Joshipura & Dr. Parinbhai Shah – as Phaco surgeons used to visit once or twice a month regularly .

Dr.Khushboo chaudhari joined us from January 2012 as retina consultant and within a short time, Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority donated equipments for retina clinic under their CSR activity. Due to availability of latest equipment & expert consultant, the retina treatment activity picked up very fast.

During visit of these consultants, we observed tremendous load of OPD patients which showed the necessity of other expert ophthalmologists.

Availability of latest state of art equipments, presence of ophthalmologists & quality treatment to eye patients geared the wheel in such a way that we performed more than 3600 surgeries during first year, which reached to more than 13000 during 2019-20, cumulative total number of eye operations has reached more than 85000.



Year 2011-12 (2nd Year)

From the experience of last 20 years, it was very well understood that the main reasons for blindness are poverty, illiteracy, lack of information regarding treatment (health issue), unavailability of transportation facility from village to health center & nobody to accompany.

Looking to above issues, diagnostic eye camps in the surrounding 100 km radius areas are considered a priority activity of the trust. Actually, diagnostic camps were started before actual activity of the hospital was started.

On the day of inauguration i.e. 22nd may 2011, one 40 seater Eicher bus (Thanks to Asian Star co., Mumbai) & 7 seater Tata Sumo, (Thanks to shri Lavjibhai Dalia) - both vehicles were procured and started using them for transportation of patients and for publicity of camps respectively. Both vehicles proved a boon for the quick pick up of the activity.

Camps organized by the trust earned a tremendous popularity among the community as quality of operations was good, transportation facility, lodging & boarding facility were provided & regular presence of Doctors was ensured.

One more facility in the form of Janseva Medical & optical store was added to provide medicines at 15% discount & spectacles at reasonable rate compared to market rate from 2nd October 2011. The surplus generated from both the stores is utilized for free medicine & spectacles to the poor patients.

Over & above treatment of eye diseases, activities to prevent blindness, research works on eye disease were also planned. For that purpose, Dr. Rohanbhai Chariwala was sent to London in September-2010 for one year, to study Masters in Community Eye Health course run by International Center for Eye Health, London. He completed his one year course in September-2011 & joined as community ophthalmologist in Oct. 2011. During his study, he did a blindness survey in July-2011 for which he visited India & conducted the survey in seven talukas of surat District-Kamrej, Palsana, Mangrol, Bardoli, Mandvi, Mahuva & Umarpada. The data collected from this survey will be useful as baseline, after 10-15 Year of hospital being functional; the impact of the activity to prevent the blindness will be known comparing these data. Also the improvement in lifestyle of the community will be measured.

At the end of the year, 3588 surgeries were done.





Year 2012-13 (3rd Year)

To widen the horizon of the eye care services to the community, two C.H.C.s - one at Netrang & other at Zankhvav were taken under public private partnership with government of Gujarat. Daily OPD is run by our ophthalmic assistants at both the centers and surgical work is being carried out by our ophthalmologist & technical staff visiting there twice a week.

Community based rehabilitation for the blind is an ultimate activity for any eye care institute. The first project was started from April 2012 in Mandvi Taluka. 133 Villages of Mandvi taluka were divided in to 8 clusters and 8 CBR workers were recruited- one for each cluster. The workers did survey in each village & screening of 40+ persons was done.

During this screening, if anyone had cataract or other eye related problem, he / she was referred to Tejas eye hospital for treatment.

The persons who were found incurable, were given training to make them self-reliant & confident. Elderly blind were given mobility and ADL training, children were included in integrated Education scheme and youngsters were given vocational training.

Over and above all, our CBR workers assisted blind persons avail blindness certificate, pension for elderly under Sant Surdas Yojna, bus pass & scholarship for children under different Govt. Schemes.

The CBR workers did school Screening of school going children of Mandvi Taluka.

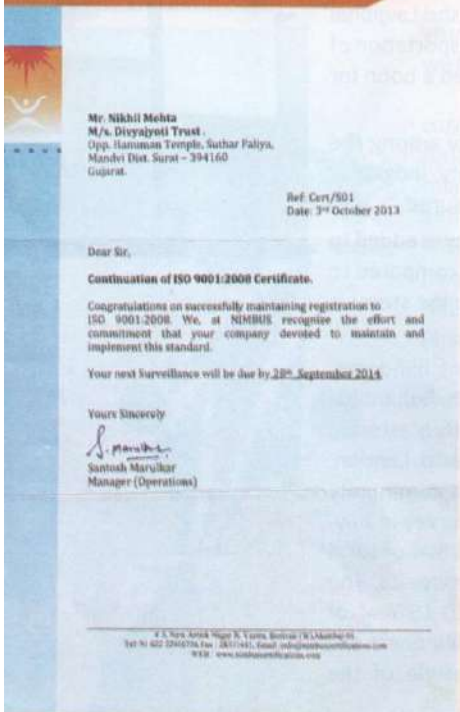
During this Year (2012-13), we got equipment for corneal transplant under matching grant project with the help of Rotary Club of Surat Roundtown & Rotary club of Bergen Highland, New Jersey, USA & retina clinic equipments from kakrapar atomic power plant, Anumala. Thus, it became easier to treat retina & cornea patients in large numbers. This Year hospital got ISO certificate - ISO 9001:2008.

During the year, solar street light & solar water heater were installed & rain water harvesting (water recharge bore-well) was done as an environment friendly activity.

During the Year, we imparted phaco training to 1 doctors, SICS training to 1 doctors. Over & above the representatives of different organization were trained in OT protocol, Optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

The corneal transplant of a 6 month old child was done for the first time.

At the end of the year, 5870 surgeries were done.



Year 2013-14 (4th Year)

Divyajyoti Trust got empanelled with KAPS authority for consulting and treatment of eye disease of KAPS staff & their family members.

To prepare tailor made spectacles, optical fitting machines were procured to give the ordered spectacles within 2 hours to the patients, so that they need not visit the optical shop from far off villages to collect the spectacles.

One more facility to the patients was added by providing towels to them. Industrial washing machine was purchased having 25kg capacity for daily washing of used towels, bed sheets & clothes.

Free diabetes checkup was initiated for 40+ OPD patients in OPD. Low vision clinic was inaugurated.

During visit of glaucoma consultant from Mumbai- Dr. Meenaben Doshi, it was revealed that number of glaucoma patients is very high, so we arranged 2 months short term glaucoma training for Dr. Sheetalben at H.V. Desai Eye Institute, Pune. Now she is taking care of glaucoma patients regularly.

The Annual meeting of Community Ophthalmology Society of India (COSI) was held at Mandvi. Doctors from Delhi, Rajasthan, Kerala, Visnagar & Dahod participated in the same.

Lions club of Surat silk city distributed wheel chair, tricycle, hearing aid & calipers to the disabled – the programme was held in our premises & our staff helped them in the venture. From this year, Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority started sponsoring one mega eye camp. Rotary club of Gurock Island- UK sponsored 4 days Maga camp.

As a new experiment, we took up challenge to run a well-equipped hospital at chorwad, Dist- Junagadh which was closed for quite some time. As per the request of hospital trust board, this activity was taken up. First of all cleaning, some renovation & maintenance was done. After that, necessary medicine, equipments etc. were procured and started sending one ophthalmic assistant to Chorwad for one month- turn by turn. During this time, we imparted training to three young staff of Chorwad hospital as ophthalmic assistant / ophthalmic nursing / optical fitting. After completion of training, they started their job and one closed hospital started. Now it is working properly.

One more feather added in the cap by starting hostel for blind children in Mandvi from June -2013 for the children aged less than 12 Years. We selected blind children from poor families in the surrounding area and enrolled them in a regular primary school in Mandvi. They learn with regular students during day time & in the evening, we teach them Braille, Computer (with special software installed), Music & other life development skill. This venture is to make blind children self-reliant & confident.

Surat Manav Seva Sangh 'Chhayando' took up a project for overall development of two villages- Peterkui & Pipalvan near Mandvi. The activity included repairing or installing submersible pump or hand pump, distribute school uniform to children or to help them with educational loan.



Number of staff members reached 67, we prepared a booklet "Margdarshika" to give guidance about rules & regulations as well as benefits offered to them by Divyajyoti trust.

Rapid Assessment of Visual Impairment (RAVI) survey was conducted as a part of research activity & screening of more than 4800 people was carried out and 454 spectacles were distributed for presbyopic correction.

During the year, we imparted phaco training to 4 doctors. Over & above the representatives of different organizations were trained in OT protocol, optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

At the end of the year 2013-14, total surgeries performed were 6886.



Year 2014-15 (5th Year)

For this year, a proud moment was to receive international XOVA award. This award was conferred upon Divyajyoti trust for carrying out an innovative activity to screen the 40 + people of 213 villages of Umarpada & Mangrol taluka for Diabetes, Blood Pressure, glaucoma as well as blindness. The award ceremony was held at Istanbul, Turkey, which was attended by Dr.Udaybhai & received the same.

The CBR programme which was started from April 2012 in Mandvi taluka was completed in Dec-14. New Project was started in Mangrol & Umarpada talukas from Jan-2015 & as mentioned above, an innovative idea of screening for diabetes, B.P, glaucoma & Blindness was implemented.

We got permission to collect donation from foreign countries under FCRA in June -14 for 5 Years. The permission to get donation as corpus fund under 35 AC (100% Tax deduction) act was also granted to the trust for 3 Years.

Generally, people working as farmers or cow boy - are more susceptible to get injury from vegetative material like leaves-seeds, pesticides, or animals tail-horn etc. To enable them to prevent such injuries, we started selling safety goggles – covered from all sides at Rs. 30/- each, which is useful for two wheeler drivers as well. This is useful for post-operative cataract patients also, hence it is very popular.

As described above, such type of injuries and negligency leads to the corneal diseases & because of rural area, cornea patients are in big numbers. Looking to the situation one year long term cornea fellowship is now being offered & Dr.Darshan Kansara joined as cornea fellow.

The short term Phaco, SICS & Medical Retina training has been started for doctors as competent doctors to provide training, large number of patients, latest State of art equipments & other infrastructure facility are available. During the year total 12 Ophthalmologists availed this training.

New 5 storied building just behind the hospital was constructed to add administrative office & eye bank on ground floor; kitchen library, classroom- dormitory on first floor; guest room & staff quarters on 2nd floor & other staff quarters on 3rd – 4th & 5th floor. The new building is Eco friendly as we used kota stone instead of tiles, aluminium, reused wood, glasses & granite to avoid plastic or fiber material. For hot water, we installed solar water heater, to generate electricity - solar electricity

generating plants have been installed. In addition, bio gas plant and rain water harvesting system are installed. To save water, bath water recycling work was done, so as to use recycled water in flush system.

The new building was registered under "Indian Green Building Council" & it received Platinum rating which is first in category of Eye Hospital in Gujarat State.

During the year, we purchased Phaco Machine of Alcon co., Green Laser & IOL Master of Ziess co., Forus fundus Camera, Vision Screener, Autoclave machine, Rebound tonometers, Tonopen, Slit Lamp, 27 seater mobile Van & offset printer which enriched the hospital.

The government declared that an ophthalmic assistant can collect eye donation, so we sent Pradipbhai Patel & Yatin Mistry to learn enucleation. Now they are looking after the same.

One New type of surgery-suture less Pterigiym surgery was done using Glue. We started doing Lamellar Keratoplasty also.

Dr. Udaybhai as a resource person joined the team who prepared operation theatre protocol with Government of Gujarat and conducted workshops for the doctors of Gujarat Government - is a matter of pride.

Diabetic Retinopathy protocol was prepared as a part of Vision 2020 Right to Sight India's Operational Research Project and one meeting at Delhi was planned by us with leading Retina Consultant of the Nation.

Low vision manual was prepared by vision 2020: Right to Sight India. Dr.Uday has written one chapter in the manual.

Dr.Rohan Chariwala attended annual meeting of American Academy of Ophthalmology at Chicago & presented scientific paper based on findings of RAVI survey.

One awareness programme of health education was initiated by sending health worker on every Saturday night to nearby villages showing video on eye disease & followed by question answer session.

Videos on various subjects such as pre & post-operative care, hygiene, Medicines, restriction of food, health education etc. were prepared and are being displayed regularly in OPD area.

A calendar of CBR activities was prepared showing different activities, Govt. support to the blinds & rehabilitation activities.

During the year, we imparted phaco training to 9 doctors, SICS training to 3 doctors. Over & above representatives of different organizations were trained in OT protocol, Optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

At the end of the year 2014-15 total surgeries done was 8482.

Year 2015-16 (6th Year)

As soon as new building became functional, the hospital facility reached 100 beds from 40 beds during initial period.

Inauguration of newly constructed "Smt Chandraben Piyushbhai Kothari Training Center" was done by Swami Shri Sarvasthanandji of Ramkrishna Mission Rajkot. 19 semi furnished staff quarters were allotted after "Shanti Havan" done towards the end of June 2015.

On 16th August, one well-wisher couple - Shri Vijaybhai Dalia & Smt.Nipunaben Dalia declared donation of their 4 acres of agricultural land at Amalsadi - 4km away from Mandvi for hospital activities.

Eye bank located on the ground floor of the new building was inaugurated & named "Divyachakshu Eye Bank" and on the occasion, Trust offered a special card to the family of eye donors to get their eye checked free of cost.



The equipment for Umarpada & Dediapada vision centers were procured from the grant of "Arvind Mafatlal Foundation" Mumbai and both the vision centers become functional.

As per the request of R.P. Center, AIIMS, Delhi, we got involved in conducting a survey at Jhabua, Madhya Pradesh. Before carrying out the survey, training of technical staff was done by sending them to "Mahatma Gandhi Eye hospital" Lucknow & after completion of training, a team of a doctor, para-medical worker, data entry operator & one driver with a vehicle were sent to Jhabua. This was an exciting experience for the team.

Prof. Ravichandran- Faculty from Indian institute of Management, Ahmedabad visited Mandvi to study the progress of Divyajyoti trust within 5 years and had a session with core group members. Based on the details gathered from these members, he prepared a case study.

One Day-care ward facility was added to the infrastructure to provide comfort to affording patients with additional facility of chair-sofa, T.V. & Tea-breakfast.

During the year A-scan, hand held Keratometer, Fundus camera with auto refractor, HRT machine, I-care tonometer, Ultrasound bio-microscope, OMS surgical microscope and slit lamp were purchased.

Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authorities provided funding for the purchase of Glaucoma clinic equipments under their CSR head. Now, Glaucoma clinic is well furnished and patients are benefited in a big way.

From this year we have started sending our retina consultant to Shrimad Rajchandra hospital- Dharampur & Gramseva trust - Kharel twice in a month for ROP screening & treatment.

During the year, we imparted phaco training to 13 doctors, SICS training to 6 doctors & Medical retina training to 2 doctors. Over & above, the representatives of different organizations were trained in OT protocol, Optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

During the year total 163 diagnostic camps were arranged & 26643 patients were screened for eye problems. The operation of camp patients done were 4224. Total 10446 operations were performed during the year.

Year 2016-17 (7th Year)

The hospital completed 5 years on 22.05.2016, so annual day was celebrated differently. A get together of camps sponsors, well-wishers & donors was arranged in the morning & in the evening, a cultural programme followed by dinner with staff & family was arranged. The staff & doctors working since five years were felicitated with a token gift of melamine dinner set.

A vision building workshop for future planning of five years was conducted by Mrs.Elizabeth Kurian - chief executive officer from Mission for Vision. Another workshop for strategic planning was conducted by Dr.Col.M. Deshpande & his team. The selected staff members participated in above two workshops.

Three new vision centers at Dediapada, Sagbara & Umarpada and one satellite center at vyara were started during the year.

The video shooting by professional agency has been done to prepare videos on various subjects like (1) Activity of Divyajyoti Trust, (2) Operation Theater, (3) Refractive error, (4) C.B.R. activity, (5) Cataract Surgery & (6) Green Building.

Public Health Foundation of India, Hyderabad initiated a national level project on diabetic retinopathy, in which 11 districts each from eleven states of India were selected. In this project, Surat district of Gujarat was selected & the responsibility to run this project was given to Divyajyoti trust.



As per diabetic retinopathy project, four C.H.C.s of Surat district Areth, Mangrol, Zankhvav & Umarpada were selected. The responsibility to train the ophthalmic assistant of these 4 CHCs; retina consultant & lab staff as well as nursing staff of surat civil hospital, ASHA workers and physician of Surat city was given to Divyajyoti Trust. As a part of the project, we purchased equipments for diabetic retinopathy treatment & forwarded to all 4 CHCs & Surat civil hospital. The fund was provided by "Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee Trust, London".

Regular meetings regarding progress of this project were arranged with district collector Surat as well as with Health director (ophthalmology) Gandhinagar.

We had purchased equipments for retina treatment with the funding from Lions Club International. The equipments for Glaucoma clinic were purchased with the funds from KAPS authority. Having added more equipment to Retina & Glaucoma clinics, Tejas eye hospital is one of the best equipped eye hospital in Gujarat.

During the year, we purchased steam cooking vessels and one automatic roti maker preparing 860 roti/hour.

The trust won award for eco-friendly activity – Emerson cup award which comprises of Rs.50000/- cheque & a memento.

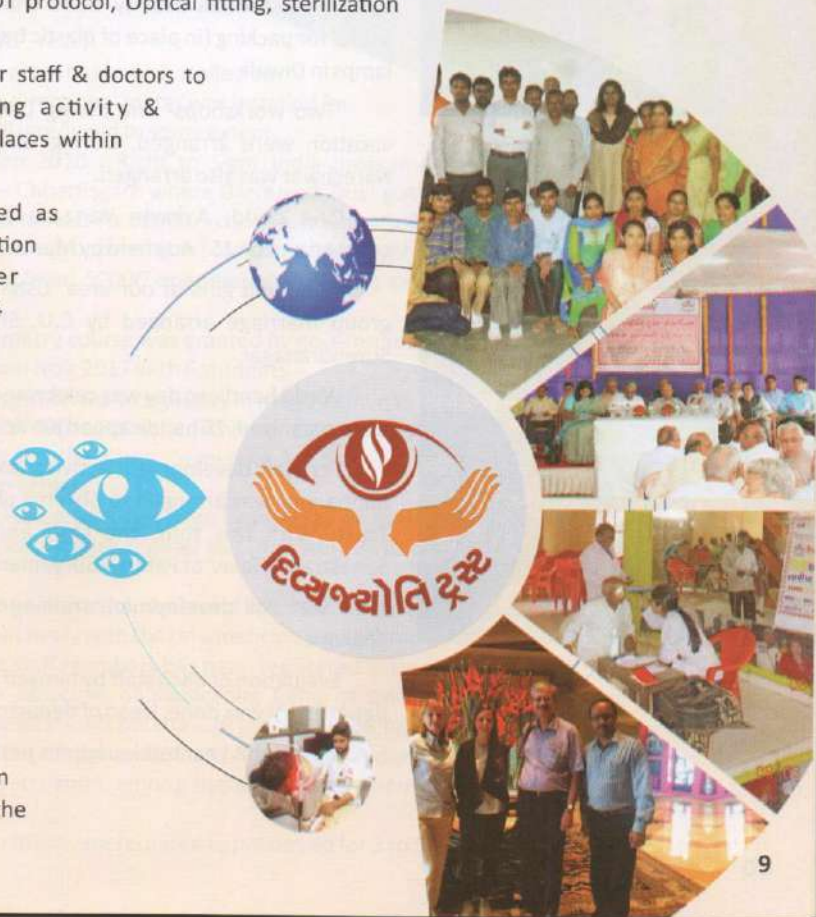
During the year, we imparted phaco training to 14 doctors, SICS training to 8 doctors & Medical retina training to 3 doctors. Over & above, the representatives of different organizations were trained in OT protocol, Optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

We also regularly send our staff & doctors to attend workshops - training activity & conferences held at different places within the nation.

Dr.Udaybhai is considered as national level expert on infection control & operation theater protocol. So he was invited by 14 organizations for consultation & evaluation.

Continuous efforts are in practice to improve capacity of the staff. For training of staff, we have joined hands with H.V.Desai Eye Hospital under "SCALE" project; the funding for scale project has been allocated by "SEVA" USA.

This year, in addition to regular eye camps, we have organized one day camps in Mangrol - Umarpada area with the





help of CBR staff. Total 319 camps were conducted & 5239 cataract surgeries were performed on the patients referred through camps.

Total OPD patients screened at various vision centers as well as satellite centers reached approx. 37000. If these patients would have to come for their eye check up to Mandvi, they would have spent at least Rs.200-/person approx. So, we can say that we have saved approx. 74 lakh of rupees by providing this vision center facility.

School screening of 21418 students was carried out in 293 schools, among them 2488 were given spectacles & 649 were referred to Mandvi.

182 incurable blinds were found during CBR programme, among them we helped 95 blinds avail blindness certificate, bus pass to 86 persons and 54 blinds to get pension under 'Sant Surdas Yojna'. 132 blinds were given ADL training.

We helped 3 young blind people with interest free loan to start their own business and 9 children were enrolled in integrated education project.

As written earlier, we run a blind children hostel to help them to be self-reliant & confident individuals. As a part of extracurricular activity apart from routine activity, blind children made paper bags which is useful for packing (in place of plastic bags) medicines. They made candle lamps in Diwali.

Two workshops- one during Diwali & the other during summer vacation were arranged. During Diwali camp, a one day picnic to Nareshwar was also arranged.

One child, Ashwin Vanzara participated in patriotic song competition on 15th Aug held by Mandvi Nagarpalika.

Two blind girls of our area, Usha & Kokila got married at Morbi-group marriage arranged by C.U. Shah Andh Kanya Prakash Gruh, Surendranagar.

World handicap day was celebrated on 3rd Dec. Various competitions were organized, 76 handicapped participated & won prizes.

For staff development activity, one educational tour to Deesa and Radhanpur was arranged to observe philanthropic activities of Bhansali Trust. With this tour, the staff enjoyed the visit to 'Rankivav & Sahastraling Talav' at Patan & Suryamandir, Modhera.

Soft skill development training was conducted by Dr.Nileshbhai Thakore.

Evaluation of each staff by himself / herself, co-worker & head of the department was done. Head of department did it for subordinates.

During this year total surgeries performed reached 12648.



Year 2017-18 (8th Year)

The solar power generation plant has been installed on the roof top of new building & bi-directional meter was installed for old solar plant, now electricity bill is reduced to some extent.

Annual conference of vision 2020 : Right to Sight India programme was arranged on 3-4 June at Raipur – Chhattisgarh where Divyajyoti Trust got 'LOTUS' arward for its holistic approach which comprises Rs.50000/- cheque, memento & certificate. The award was accepted by selected core group members including Dr.Udaybhai.

On 20th June, we have completed 50000 operations which was celebrated by gala lunch with staff.

The permission to run optometry course was granted by government authority to us, so we have started the college from Nov. 2017 with 6 students.

A motorcycle rally was arranged on world sight day in Mandvi town to raise awareness about diabetic retinopathy. Almost 400 to 500 school children participated in rally at village Lakhali, taluka - Vyara to celebrate the same. Screening for diabetic retinopathy was arranged at Vyara & Bardoli vision centers.

From Nov. 2017, Electronic face reader has been installed to mark the attendance of staff on experimental basis with attendance register but from April 2018 onward it will be used on permanent basis.

Two more vision centers - one at Bardoli & second at Uchchhal were inaugurated in July 2017 & December 2017 respectively with the telemedicine facility provided there.

The co-operative society for staff members has been registered in December 2017 to help staff members with main objective of inculcating habit of savings among staff members & to provide loan at low interest & purchase of grocery - cooking oil etc.

School screening for 'Shell' Co., Hazira under its CSR project was done in Hazira area. Total 9818 school children were screened, among them 188 were given spectacles & 76 referred.

The medical records of the patients are required to preserved for 3 to 5 years as a trust

hospital, but it requires more space to preserve them in hard copies, so all the records of 3 to 5 years & old cases were converted in to electronic record by scanning them.

The eye screening of 63 truck drivers sponsored by Bridgestone tyre Co. was done, among them 7 were provided spectacles & 7 referred.

Total 369 camps were conducted and the OPD of camps was 46735 & 5243 cataract surgery of camp patients was done.

The students of Maliba University were screened.

Looking at the OPD load and number of indoor patients, we have posted full time ophthalmologist at Vyara from Sept. 17, due to which OPD cases increased further.

During tribal week celebration, total 49 cataract surgeries were done sponsored by the district authorities.

The CBR programme at Umapada & Mangrol talukas was completed in Dec.17. New CBR project at Vyara has been started from Jan. 2018.

CBR workers distributed vitamin 'A' and 'Sukhadi' to the children of sugarcane labourers in co-ordination with an organization named "vitamin angels".

One well-wisher of Mandvi sponsored a picnic to Ambaji for blind children. Our Trustee Shri Ramnarayan Chandakji sponsored a trip to Haridhwar & Rishikesh for blind children & guruh mata. All of them availed a chance to participate in 'Ganga Arti', 'Ganga Snan' & 'Krishna Katha'.

Under the aegis of IMA Mandvi two CME sessions were arranged on different subjects & 15 Medical practitioners of Mandvi had participated in the same.

An educational tour for all the staff members to "Dristi Netralay Dahod" & "Muni Sevashram", Goraj-Vadodara was arranged & one day picnic to poicha was also organized for staff & family members.

Our male staff nurse-Dipak Vasava died suddenly at very young age. The Trust had procured group gratuity scheme & life insurance policy. Minor daughter of Dipak is legal heir so the amt. of Rs.6 lakh was deposited in her bank account.

During the year, we imparted phaco training to 14 doctors, SICS training to 7 doctors & Medical retina training to 2 doctors. Over & above, the representatives of different organizations were trained in OT protocol, Optical fitting, sterilization protocol & counseling method.

Total 12467 surgeries were performed during this Year.

Year 2018-19 (9th Year)

This year, we could procure bi-directional meter for solar system installed at the roof of new building (Chandraben Piyushbhai Kothari Training Center).

This Year, annual day was celebrated differently. We had arranged blood donation camp & collected 28 bottles blood, 'Ganesh Poojan' & cultural programme followed by dinner for staff & family members.

Dr.Rajesh Kapse & Ms.Mitashri from H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune visited us & guided for NABH accreditation relevant changes. Some changes were done & some will be done after we shift to Amalsadi campus (proposed).

On 29th July, first annual CME was arranged for ACOIN (Association for Community Ophthalmologist of India) Gujarat chapter.

In the month of May 2018, registration for NGO Darpan was done. Audit for ISO 9000:2015 was conducted in Sept. 2018.

Three new vision centers at Kim, Kosamba & Khapar were started. As there is no eye care facility around Khapar area &





because of our prestige, the work load at Khapar center is increasing. Similarly people surrounding Uchchhal avail good benefit of the vision center.

As a part of outreach activity - vision testing, Blood grouping & Diabetes screening of 2500 truck drivers with Sightsavers was carried out under their 'RAHI' project.

Dr. Sheetalben Chaudhari - our senior most ophthalmologists completed 10000 surgeries on 08.03.2019. Similarly Dr. Rohanbhai completed his 10000 surgeries in June 2019. We felicitated both of them by handing over Rs.51000/- cheque on 8th annual day as a token of our appreciation.

We have started fast track OPD for paying patients to reduce waiting period. Here one staff escorts the patients for refraction, doctor's opinion, required test on express basis. This new change received a good response.

We have helped the ophthalmology department of Mohan Dayal Hospital Pardi - by sending our ophthalmologist & technical staff twice in a month for performing surgeries as requested by their administration & we also trained their OT staff.

Paediatric ophthalmologist Dr. Anshuli Sood joined us from May-2018, hence no. of paediatric patients have increased substantially.

This year, 181 corneal transplants have been done.

Under the aegis of Diabetic retinopathy project, the CME of family physicians of Surat city was conducted in four sessions. District level & State level co-ordination meetings were arranged. The training of ASHA workers was also completed. The evaluation of the project was carried out by an external agency on completion of project.

Efforts were made to create peer group of diabetic people so that they can meet periodically & understand each others' problem & mode of treatment. However, we did not succeed due to very low awareness among patients.

Surat Manv Seva Sangh - "Chhayando" publishes a magazine "Seva Suvas" each year. This year in June-2019 article - on Diabetes, Diabetic retinopathy & the other on activity of Divyajyoti Trust was published.

Total camps during this year, were 458 & total OPD of 44935 patients. 5797 cataract surgeries were performed on camp patients.

From this Year, camps publicity was done through two wheeler instead of four wheeler with a driver. Even local persons were involved in publicity of camps as well.

The Phaco Training of 15 doctors, SICS training of 8 doctors & Medical Retina training of 4 doctors was done.

Total surgeries during the year reached 13191.



The Year at glance

19th May was nearest Sunday to foundation day 22nd May, it was celebrated with blood donation camp in the morning and cultural programme in the evening. The children of staff were felicitated for their academic progress.

Routinely, the course of vision technician and nursing starts from July of each year. The interviews of students are conducted in June. This year "Mission for Vision" has sponsored 10 students. They have suggested Rs. 1000/- stipend per month for these students. The remaining students were sponsored by Divyajyoti Trust offering Rs.1000/- stipend. In addition, Mission for Vision requested to conduct camps at Daman, so the diagnostic camps were conducted from September – 2019.

The inspection for optometry college was done during July and permission for 3rd year was granted. 12 students were enrolled for the same.

Dr. Udaybhai received Dr.G. Badrinarayan oration award at Hyderabad, given by Association of Community Ophthalmologists of India. Divyajyoti Trust feels proud for the same.

Dr.Udaybhai attended the meeting at Delhi to develop sterilization protocol guideline & cluster infection task force – arranged by All India ophthalmology society in the month of August.

Independence Day was celebrated. Mrs. Jignaben Chaudhari wife of pediatrician Dr.Shaileshbhai Chaudhari hoisted the flag.

Divyajyoti trust has made rapid progress in less than 10 years - to guide us for future development, Dr. Col. M. Deshpande & Mr. Nagarajan visited Mandvi during 18 to 20 October and had the meetings with core group members, management staff and trustees.

As per their suggestion, trustees Dr. Udaybhai Gajiwala, Shri Nalinbhai Shah & Shri Vijaybhai Kania visited Sadguru Seva Trust, Chitrakoot during 6 to 9 December and observed the herculean task being accomplished with efficiency. The Sadguru seva trust performs more than 1 Lakh eye surgeries during the year. This visit will be helpful for our future development.

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Mr. Kirti Pradhan, representative from 'Vision Spring' & our good old friend, visited Mandvi & had a lecture with optometry students on "Eye care & necessity of spectacles". He also discussed the topic of internship and placement procedure. Similarly the representatives of 'Essilor' company visited us and gave guidance on marketing and internship placements to our optometry students.

We had planned programme of survey of Diabetic Retinopathy and RAAB in Vyara taluka and the field work was done by optometry students & CBR workers, they were accompanied by one Ophthalmologist also. Their scientific training was arranged in November 2019. The only WHO certified RAAB trainer of our country, Dr. Shamanna from Hyderabad was invited to train our team. After completion of training, the survey was started & data collection was completed by 7th March.

The ethics committee meeting was arranged on 10th November. As Divyajyoti Trust is planning to get involved in some clinical trials also, training of technical staff is mandatory. Technical expert Dr. Kiran Marthak from Lambda therapeutics and research was invited to train our staff on 16th February and he handed over the certificates to them after training.

We have received renewal of our ISO certificate 9000/2015.



Miss Sweta Patel from Mission for Vision visited us to review the training of our vision technician & nursing students and to conduct audit of the activities of Khapar & Vyara vision centers sponsored by Mission for Vision.

Dr. Udaybhai is a member of advisory committee of Vision Foundation of India - he attended the meeting held at Mumbai.

Rotary club of Surat roundtown sponsored the project to eliminate avoidable blindness from one village, so we selected Umakhadi village of Umarpada taluka and completed the work in the month of February 2020 (the detailed statistical information is given in separate table)



The blind person can also work like a normal person if given proper training. As a proof of this fact, we have recruited one blind lady as housekeeping staff.

For training of our housekeeping staff & kitchen staff, we had invited Miss Ashwini Rakhe. She conducted half day workshop.

From March 20, we have started sending our retina consultant to Jhagadia – Sewa Rural for ROP Screening.



A get to gather of camp organisers was arranged on 15th March. A healthy discussion on the camp activity, changes in publicity pattern of camps, expectation from community took place and we showed our gratitude to them for their co-operation.

During the year, we got permission for NA at Amalsadi, deposited the premium amount & even drawings are approved. We are ready to start construction work soon.



Hospital



During the year, Dr. Yash Oza joined as comprehensive fellow from June 2019. Dr. Dhaval Patel joined as Retina Consultant from July & Dr. Ishwar Mistry joined as general ophthalmologist from August 2019. We have recruited Dr. Mitul Patel on temporary basis for 3 months from February onwards.

Dr. Nirali Patel & Dr. Alka Gupta completed their two years tenure with us and left. Dr. Rohan Chariwala was relieved from December 2019 as he wanted to start his own NGO.

Our Paediatric Ophthalmologist Dr. Ansuleeben Sood is on maternity leave from November 2019 onwards.

A cardiologist, working in New Jersey, U.S.A., Dr. Rameshbhai Kania sponsored 100 cataract surgeries with foldable intraocular lens. The surgeries were done during June 2019.

The two surgeries to remove intraocular worm were done during October 2019. These are rare surgeries. We will try to document these surgeries well.

We have performed 3 multifocal toric IOL implantation during the year.

Rotary club of Udhna, Surat sponsored 100 cataract surgeries in December 2019.

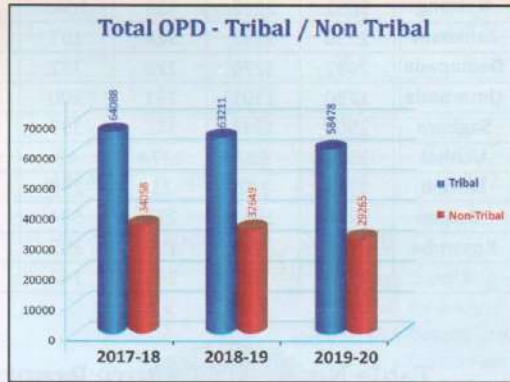

We gave her anesthesia & operated. Similarly second eye was also operated. This way, we helped her regain her lost vision.

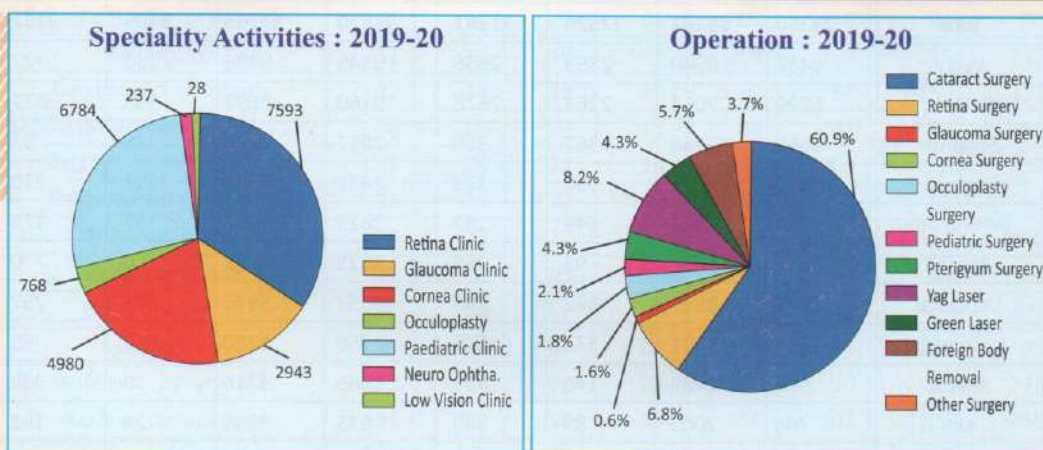

Worm removal

26 Year old, Prabhaben Sunilbhai Vasava is native of village Nani Devrupan, Ta. Sagbara, Dist. Narmada. Once she had some insect bite and eye was red. So, in the morning, she visited Sagbara vision center. From there, she was referred to Mandvi.

Prabhaben was examined by our cornea consultant and gave some medicine & called her after one week for follow up. After one week, she visited again & on examination it was found that there was a live worm in her eye, so doctor advised her for immediate Surgery.

Prabhaben was alone, so she denied for surgery but doctor explained the risk of worm as it may grow & move in body which may cause serious life threatening situation. So she agreed and after removal of worm she felt relieved and surprised on seeing live worm. She said, such type of operation could be possible here was not known to them and the hospital is really a boon for ophthalmic patients.

Gibuben Dohariyabhai Vasava is native of village Bogda, Tal. Akkalkuva, Dist. Nandurbar. She is 80 Years old & was suffering from blindness since last two years.

Divyajyoti trust had arranged a diagnostic Camp at village Khapar & her son carried her to the camp for eye checkup. In camp, our doctor diagnosed cataract in both eyes & advised surgery. Gibuben arrived at Mandvi hospital with other camp patients through our bus.

At first, she was afraid of the surgery but after counseling, she agreed for the surgery. Her right eye was operated first and on next day, when she realized that vision was restored, she agreed for left eye surgery.

Looking to her financial condition, both operations were done free of cost. Now she is self-reliant and her family members are also free from the responsibility of taking care of Gibuben. All are happy & congratulate the hospital staff.



Diabetic Retinopathy Project

The diabetic retinopathy project started from February-17 for two years, was supposed to end by March-19. But as the project was implemented well and there were funds available, so PHFI extended the same up to June-19. The activities done are given here under.

Dr. Udaybhai attended the project steering committee meeting held at Hyderabad.

Dr. Swapnil Pachchigar delivered a talk on T.V. 9 to give information about diabetic Retinopathy.

The training of ophthalmic assistants as well as CCDR cycle IV for doctors took place in May-19.

The CME on diabetic Retinopathy was conducted during May & June for the doctors of Vyara & Bardoli medical association respectively.

With the extension of the project, additional facility was provided at 5 more CHCs & 2 civil hospitals - Bardoli, Songadh, Kamrej, Valod & Tilakwada CHCs were provided at Non mydriatic fundus camera. Similarly, two district level hospitals - Rajpipla civil hospital & Vyara general hospitals with 'Green Laser' & OCT machines were installed.

The machines for Vyara general hospital were handed over to them in presence of minister Shri Yogeshbhai & Diabetic Retinopathy clinic was inaugurated by him.

The ophthalmologist recruited at Vyara hospital Dr. Parth Tandel was trained in medical retina at Divyajyoti Trust.

New posters for creating awareness about Diabetic Retinopathy were distributed to all the Govt. centres.

Diabetic Retinopathy screening camps were conducted in good numbers in the project area.

With the help of Bardoli Lions Club, one CME for DR awareness was organized for laymen education.



Diwaliba Optometry Collage



The students of optometry collage participated in the international conference held at Anand. The second year students won second prize in poster presentation & the first year students won consolation prize in poster presentation. This is a matter of pride to us.

From this year, all students attend the soft skill development sessions at Maliba campus, Uka Tarsadia University. We are thankful to the centre for humanities at the university for giving this opportunity to our students.

We got permission for third year optometry course after inspection and so 12 students availed admission and their academic sessions have started.

Senior optometry students (3rd year) got offer for internship from vision spring – an NGO & Essilor Co. These students have to prepare a thesis as a part of their curriculum and hence one survey of RAAB, Diabetes & Diabetic retinopathy was carried out in Tapi district. The field work & data entry for the same were done by optometry students.

The data collected from this survey will be used for publication also.

- Over & above this, Dr.Udaybhai attended the meeting at Gandhinagar, held by Government of Gujarat on 'outbreak policy formation'. Further to this, Dr. Udaybhai and Dr.Amishbhai conducted webinars on Infection control for medical staff of Gujarat government on 24.04.2019, 08.05.2019, 12.06.2019, 12.07.2019, 08.12.2019, 08.01.2020 and 12.02.2020.

Outreach Activity

As per request of Sahiba Textile Mills Pvt. Ltd, Kadodara, screening of all the staff members was done.

Generally truck drivers remain travelling, hence it is difficult for them to get their eye checkup done. So we had arranged eye checkup campaign for drivers. The eye check-up of 84 bus drivers of Mandvi bus depot was also done.

School screening of Umarda Ashramshala & Sathvav Ashramshala was done. 74 & 128 students were screened respectively.

School screening of Vyara Taluka schools was done & spectacles were distributed by "Vision Spring Co." to needy students.



Camps



Diagnostic camps are very important activity among all the activities. Because of the facility available during camps & quality work, the camps have earned very good reputation among the community. So the number of people availing benefit of camp is increasing.

One mega camp is regularly sponsored by Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority under their CSR activity during March. The beneficiaries of this camp are also increasing each year. This year total OPD was of 643 patients, which is a record break number, 400 Spectacles were given & 200 patients were referred for surgery.

Total 465 camps were organized during this year & 41155 patients were screened, among them 5502 cataract operations were done, 872 patients were referred for speciality work.

Netrang - Zankhvav & Vyara Satellite Center



OPD work as well as operations are being regularly done at all these 3 satellite centers. At Netrang center, we observed increasing load of OPD patients & space was falling short, we procured second room for OPD work from January 2020 with kind permission of the superintendant.

At Vyara centre, the regular presence of ophthalmologist & support of Janak Smarak hospital, noticeable work is being done. This year total 727 cataract operations were done. Over & above regular sale of spectacles, 387 spectacles were distributed on 04.10.2019 to school students.

At Zankhvav satellite center work is increasing slowly.

Little Dilip's lid tear was repaired

Little Dilip with his father visited their farm one day. He got wooden stick injury while playing with other children. Immediately they rushed to Dediapada Civil Hospital as there was bleeding from his injured eye. From Dediapada Civil Hospital, he was referred to Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital.

At Mandvi Hospital, our doctor diagnosed lid tear and advised for surgery. Dilip's father was hesitant as he was unable to pay the fees. Our counselor assured him of free surgery, so he agreed for the same.

We arranged for anesthetist & surgery was done. On the next day when bandage was removed, it revealed that his lid was repaired and vision was unaffected.

One child could be saved from blindness which gives us a feeling of great satisfaction. Dilip's parents are also very happy & pray the almighty for progress of Tejas Hospital.



Vision saved for Mohamad Isha

22 days old child Mohamad Isha – daughter of Usman Abdul Chaudhari had fever with cough & cold. So her parents carried her to the Doctor. The Doctor referred her to an ophthalmologist, so her parents visited Drishti eye hospital, Ankleshwar.

The doctor examined her & diagnosed congenital glaucoma & referred her to Mandvi – Tejas Eye Hospital.

At Mandvi, Glucoma consultant examined her & advised for Surgery. Isha's mother was afraid but after Counseling & assurance of reasonable charges, she agreed for the surgery.

After both eyes surgery, doctor prescribed eye drops for further treatment to save vision. The family is very happy as a girl is saved from becoming blind. They blessed our hospital for future progress.

Dediapada, Saghara, Umarpada, Uchchhal, Bardoli, Khapar, Kim & Kosamba vision centers



All 8 vision centers are functional since last year. The OPD is seen by the ophthalmic assistant posted there. For detailed examination & speciality checkup, patients are shown to the Ophthalmologist at HQ through telemedicine regularly.

All the vision center staff used to visit head quarters on each Saturday for weekly meeting, reporting & to obtain indent material since beginning. After the visit of Dr. Deshpande Sir & as per his suggestion, the system has been changed. From now onwards, we are calling them on monthly basis. To deposit the daily cash income, we have opened bank account in local bank nearby our vision center. To supply their daily need, we have arranged to send the material through field supervisor. By changing this, now we are able to run OPDs on Saturday also.

During the year, we had to shift the place of our Khapar vision center in July-19 & Kosamba vision center in Feb-20.

Narayanbhai's vision restored

Narayanbhai Prabhubhai Rathod (age 55) is native of village Sayan Tal. Olpad, Dist. Surat. He is a land labour. Once while working in field, he had some injury in his eyes and eventually lost vision as he didn't care.

Divyajyoti trust arranged diagnostic camp at village Sayan & Narayanbhai with his son visited the same. He was examined & referred to Mandvi for further investigation.

At Mandvi, Tejas Eye hospital, Retina consultant examined & diagnosed Retinal detachment in both eyes.

First, his left eye was operated and he got HM vision, after wards it improved up to 3/60. In Right eye, the improvement was very less.

Narayanbhai & his family members are very happy as now he can do his routine activity independently and others will also go for earning as they are now free from Narayanbhai's responsibility.

They pray to Almighty for hospital progress.



Childhood blossomed

Amjadkhan & Sabanabanu residing at Vapi have a Son - Majid. When Majid was 1 month old, they realized that Majid could not see. They are native of Jharkhand, so they visited a hospital there. At that Hospital, doctor examined Majid and diagnosed that he has congenital eye problem & could not be cured, so they didn't try for treatment for long time.

After 3 years, some hospital referred them to Mandvi and here our cornea consultant examined him and advised for corneal transplant surgery.

Majid's left eye was totally spoiled but for right eye, we arranged to collect good cornea and our consultant Dr. Rohan Thakkar did corneal transplant surgery. On next day it was realized that now Majid could see. Amjadkhan & Sabanabanu had no words to express their feelings. Amjadkhan is working in pvt co. & Sabanabanu does tailoring work. Looking to their financial condition, the surgery was done at reasonable rate. Majid could be saved from blindness. Now he will enjoy his Childhood.

Community based Rehabilitation programme for the Blind (CBR Program)



The CBR programme was started from January - 18 for Vyara Taluka.

The CBR workers conducted door to door screening for blindness; school screening for schools of Vyara Taluka & distributed spectacles to the needy students. The spectacles distribution programme was conducted in presence of honorable resident District collector, Tapi district, Trustees of Janak smarak hospital & trustees of Divyajyoti Trust. Similarly they did publicity for 1 day camp sponsored by Fullerton/DBCS/VFI in the project area.

Over & above this, they participated in a RAAB + diabetes and diabetic retinopathy survey carried out in villages of Vyara, Valod, Dolvan, Songadh, Uchchhal, Nizar & Kukarmunda Taluka during the year along with Optometry students.

The data collected from this survey will be useful to assess the prevalence of blindness, Diabetes and Diabetic Retinopathy in rural areas of Western India.

In addition, it will be useful to prepare thesis of Optometry students as a part of their curriculum as well as thesis to be prepared by Mrs. Shivani suchal for her M.Optometry course.

World handicapped day was celebrated on 3rd December. 71 handicapped individuals participated in different games, competition & won the Prizes.

CBR workers carried out school screening of Sabridham School of Dang district and distributed spectacles.

Ms. Tejalben Desai from Surat visited us & taught recitation of "Dutt Bavni" to these blind children. "Hanuman Chalisa" recitation has become a routine Practice for these children. On 31st December, blind children had been invited to Surat in the programme of recitation of Hanuman Chalisa, arranged by Manas Mandal, Surat as done every year. Manas Mandal donates handsome amount every year on this occasion for the blind children.

Blind children participated in "Khel Mahakumbh" & won prize worth Rs. 42, 000/- at District level. They also participated in state level competition.

Three children & Braille teacher Manishbhai participated in music competition arranged at Kutchh & blind girl Sangeeta won the prize in folk song category.

Dr. Suhal Shah from USA gifted school bags to these children & citizens of Mandvi donated blankets & clothes to them.

Evaluation of Divyajyoti Trust by Mission for Vision



Mission for vision is an Organisation to support eye care activities. It has been supportive to Divyajyoti trust since beginning for its various activities like vision centers, to sponsor V.T. & V.N. students, to organize diagnostic camps etc.

The representative from Mission for vision came to Mandvi & carried out one study / survey to know the outcome of various activities, method and impact of these activities on local community.

For that purpose, the representatives visited camp place, met students, asked questions to the patients at their home after their surgery being carried out and interviewed indoor patients.

The result derived from the survey and suggestions are listed as under.

First of all, to determine baseline, the representative had an interview with Indoor patients.

After that, he interviewed the patients and asked questions about their vision after 6 months of surgery & how the quality of life is after the vision has been restored.

They included 44 patients in this interview & found that 93% of the patients (i.e .41 Nos) have pin hole vision of 6/6 - 6/18. 2 patients have 6/18 to 6/60 vision & only one patient has less than 6/60 vision. This result is better than the guidelines determined by WHO for cataract surgeries.

The patients reacted with a great satisfaction that over all everything is good. Which include - health education on eye diseases through audio- visual-aid & given instructions were clear. The Food quality & Quantity available in communication kitchen is satisfactory. Bed sheet were clean. The toilet & bathroom are clean. Counseling before & after surgery is also effective. When they asked questions about quality of life after surgery, the patients responded with a positive remark; saying, now they do their daily activities independently and they are now self-reliant as vision has improved after the surgery.

• **The survey regarding camp facility revealed the following outcome.**

- The camp site selected is very well known to patients, so the response is good.

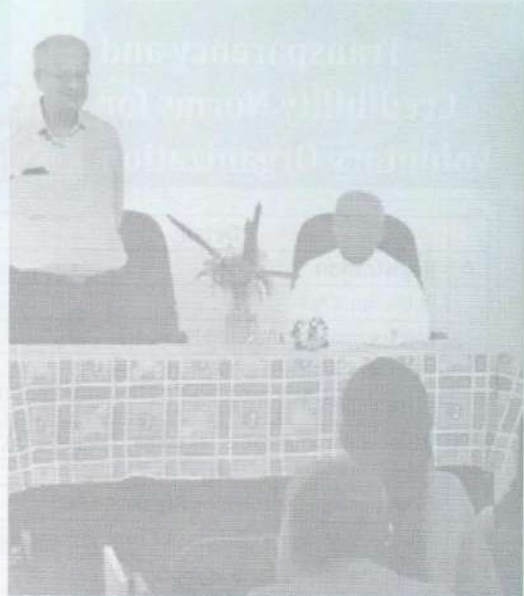
- Board & Banners are displayed showing time & venue of camps.
- Camps are mostly arranged at ground floor which is easily accessible for elderly people and sitting as well as drinking water facility is being made available. Registration process is simple and identity paper is taken from all patients.
- We should provide breakfast to patients if possible.
- Screening of patients is being done by Optometrists as well as Ophthalmologists, and spectacles are dispensed at the camp site only for needy patients.
- The counseling & transportation facility is made available.

• **Hospital facilities :**

- The registration process at hospital is simple.
- The facility of Television in ward area is provided.
- Bed sheets are being daily replaced with a clean-washed one.
- Drinking water facility is available in ward area.
- The toilet – washrooms are clean with a facility of Tumbler & bucket.
- There is an audio system for counseling.
- The hospital is associated with other general hospital for any emergency situation.
- The kitchen is neat & clean.
- To & fro transportation facility during camps for patients is provided.
- Post-operative follow up is done twice & spectacles are being sent to nearest vision center to the native of patients.

• **Suggestion:**

- Hand wash liquid / soaps to be refilled by housekeeping staff.
- The patient's relative should not be allowed to seat on patient's bed.
- Kitchen staff must wear hand gloves, hair cap.
- Surgical gowns should be provided to patients.
- Anti-slippery matt should be procured for washroom-toilets.

Financial Outlay

We are very happy to note that even in the Eighth year; we have performed 67 % operations totally free. The rest were either subsidised or paid. However, it is important to note that our charges are heavily subsidised against the prevalent market rates.

Total expenditure of the trust including hospital, diagnostic camps, training centre, research activities, C.B.R. programme, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva Medical & Optical store and staff welfare during the year was Rs.6.45 crore including recurring and non-recurring expenses. Total recurring expenditure was Rs. 6.03 crore whereas total non-recurring expenditure was Rs. 42 lacs.

Patient income has remained almost the same against the last year which came to Rs. 2.12 crore. It comes to 33.8% of the total recurring expenses. Apart from that, we receive support from District Blindness Control Society – reimbursement for free surgeries and from Rashtriya Suraksha Bima Yojana (RSBY scheme) – the insurance taken by the Govt. for the BPL families. Other than that, organisations like Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision, Helpage India, Combat Blindness Foundation etc. are of great help.

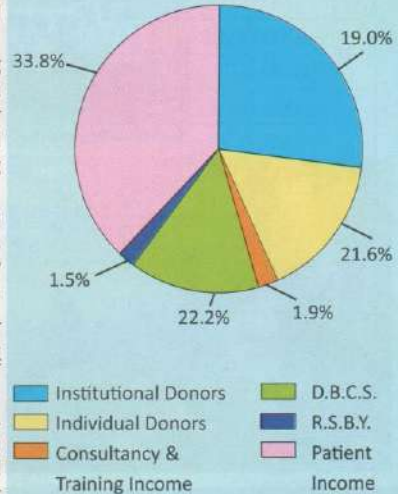
Kasturi bhojanshala which caters to the indoor patients & relatives, staff, blind children, guests and outstation OPD patients is getting support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Total number of dishes prepared and served is increasing year after year. Similarly, the expenses for Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan comes from Poddar Tyres, Mumbai under their CSR programme. We sincerely appreciate continuous support received from them every year. However, local support from the Mandvi town is also significant for blind children.

The turnover of Janseva medical store has also increased and more and more patients are getting the benefits of the subsidised facility available here. Whatever little surplus we generate from this activity, is utilised to provide free spectacles and medicines to the poor patients. Training and consultancy services makes a small contribution of 1.4 %. We have started Diwaliba Optometry College from 2017 under Uka Tarsadia University. All the expenses will be born by us for the college. As the number of students is less, we had to give substantial amount of money to the college. All the remaining expenditure is managed through donations. We received 19.0% from Institutional donors and 21.6% through Individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust, Mumbai for eco-friendly activities on a regular basis every year.

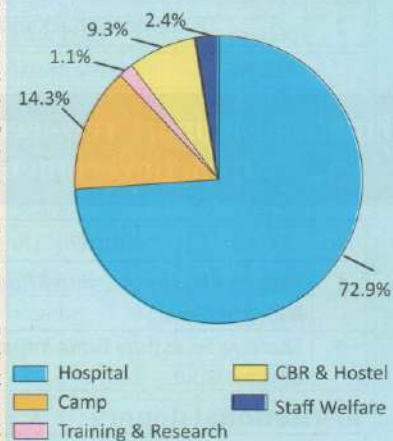
Of the total recurring expenditure, we spent 72.9% on the hospital activities, 14.3% on camp activities, 1.1% on training and research activities, 9.3% on Community Based Rehabilitation activities and 2.4% on staff welfare activities.

With the grace of GOD, all these eight years, we never had a problem with the recurring expenses. We have to put in some efforts to generate donations BUT we are able to meet ends. We are sure, the same support will continue from donors and well wishers like you and many others even in future. We are going to take up a major project to create a campus at Amalsadi soon. It will be a big expenditure of Rs. 32 crore in first phase and for that we will need support from all possible corners of the society.
