Dear Friends,

It gives us immense pleasure in presenting this second annual report to all of you. This was the first year of running the hospital. Getting the building on long term lease, renovating in time were all done by our team in such a short time. The physical infrastructure has come up well. We have been able to equip the hospital well (ours is one of the few very well equipped eye hospitals). Then comes the manpower - all the staff members are hard working and sincere - and the competence levels are also growing fast. To have five full time doctors in the first year of operations is also GOD's grace only. They are all taking good care of the patients. AND finally, the poor patients for whom we are here, should take the advantage of the services offered. We have performed 3600 operations in the first year, even we did not expect that we will do this much work. This proves our belief that there is a great need in the area. Genuinely poor patients are walking in to the hospital daily, giving us a deep sense of satisfaction. Some training activities have also been started for Ophthalmic assistant, ophthalmic nurses, optical fitting person and OT boy. We hope to put these training activities on a stronger footing next year. Research activities have also been started with Dr. Rohan completing his M.SC. in Community Ophthalmology at ICEH, London. More research & documentation will take place in coming years.

As we are serving the poor and needy community in the area, 75% of the operations have been done totally free of cost. We depend on donations for running the hospital. In spite of our sincere efforts and time lag of one & a half years, we have not yet received the one time permission to receive donations from Share and Care Foundation, USA. In this situation, we are facing some financial problems, however, our donors & well wishers have donated generously through out the year allowing us to run the hospital smoothly. We are very thankful to all the donors. We are sure, this positive response will continue in the next year also.

The Govt. of Gujarat has entrusted the surgical work at Netrang PHC and Jhankhvav CHC to us from 1st April. This will be another step in the direction of providing services at the doorsteps of the patients. Our surgeons will provide operative services twice in a week to these places on a regular basis.

From 1st April, we have started the "Community Based Rehabilitation" programme for Mandvi taluka. So, even the incurably blind people will be provided rehabilitation services under the project and young blind individuals will be trained to do some economic activity also. Blind children will be enrolled in the regular schools and our special teacher will teach them braille at their door steps.

The hospital infrastructure is already falling short and we need to construct training centre and residential quarters for the staff in the land behind the hospital which we have purchased. We will need funds for this construction activity also. We request all our donors and well wishers to visit the hospital and encourage our staff in the work and also to donate generously for the cause.

Once again, we appreciate the whole hearted support received from all the corners of the society from the depth of our heart.

## The year at a glance

The second year of Divyajyoti Trust - April 2011 to March 2012 passed in a flash and with that the first year of the hospital also.

Once the building for the hospital was selected, the date of inauguration was also fixed at 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2011, we had to take care of several things-renovating the building in time, procuring the equipments and selecting and training the staff of all the cadres and also getting the necessary permission from various Govt. offices for the hospital.

First of all, the building was procured on long term lease from M/s. Luster Diamond. They were graceful enough to give it for a token rent of Rs. 100/- per month after completion of the legal formalities for the same. The next step was preparing the necessary drawings for the 40 bedded hospital with the help of Shri Kamalbhai Parekh; our structural engineer.

The renovation work was started on 10<sup>th</sup> Sept. and also additional 6000 sq. ft. area was constructed. Trustee Shri Vijaybhai Kania and his team took lot of trouble to execute the whole project in time. Trimurti Associates, our labour contractors also worked hard. Shri Nalinbhai our trustee & secretary used all his local contacts to make sure that the work continued uninterrupted. With all these efforts, we could finish the renovation work by 19<sup>th</sup> May.

In the mean time, procurement of equipments, furniture, hospital furniture, all the items for bhojanshala and electrical and plumbing items were done in time to make sure that all these items were installed before 20<sup>th</sup> May and we were ready for inauguration.

The staff were selected in advance and sent to SEWA Rural, Jhagadia for training . We appreciate their support - no fees were charged for the training of all these workers. The hospital administrator was sent to Aravind Eye Hospital, Madurai for training. All these activities were planned in such a way that the training was also completed before the inauguration.

### **The inauguration function on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2011:**

The big moment came and we were all so much excited. We were preparing for this moment for almost a year. Rev. Swamiji Shri Nikhilshwaranandaji Maharaj from Ramkrishna mission and Vivekananda memorial, Vadodara had come to Mandvi. The hospital was inaugurated by Rev. Swamiji and formally the hospital was made available to the public for services. Our M.P. of the area & union cabinet minister for state Dr. Shri Tusharbai Chaudhari, State minister Shri Mangubhai Patel, Trustee and past president of Share and Care Foundation Dr. Bhadraben Shah, renowned retina specialist Dr. P. N. Nagpal sir, President of Mandvi Nagarpalika Shri Natubhai Rabari, Local MLA Shri Prabhubhai Vasava, President of "Chhanyado" Shri Popatbhai Vyas, President of Jain Shwetambar Terapanth Sabha, Surat- Udhana Shri Sanjaybhai Surana were our guests of honour for the function. Saints from Swaminarayan sampraday and Terapanth Samaj also graced the occasion and gave blessings.

On the same day, the 40 seater bus from Eicher needed for transportation of the patients was handed over to us by M/s Asian star co., Mumbai and the jeep Tata Sumo needed for publicity was donated by Dalia family of Surat.





Word of mouth publicity of the available facility and spread of information through well wishers is now resulting in more and more walk in patients.

'Janseva' medical store and optical stores were inaugurated on 2<sup>nd</sup> October -"Gandhijayanti" after the drug license was received. All the drugs are made available to the public at 15% discount and surgical items are provided at greater discount. Spectacles are sold at almost half the price of the market. General medicines are also made available now and laboratory is also opened up for general public. We have tied up with Jaymala pathlab run by Chhanyado for tests which are not done here. The samples will be sent to Jaymala lab in such cases.

A vision mission workshop for the staff was also conducted to orient them to the vision and mission of the organisation and to give them an idea about why such kind of social activities should be done and what benefit they have when they are working in a charitable institution. Followed by discussion on the same with small groups of staff. Many other staff development activities were also undertaken during the year like one day picnic to Tithal, flag hoisting ceremony on 15<sup>th</sup> August and 26<sup>th</sup> January, staff get to gather, Diwali celebration etc. And now, in the month of May, all the staff will visit Aravind Eye Hospital, Madurai for three days in two batches. This will give them an exposure to the world's largest eye care facility and also provide an opportunity to see huge work being done in a very disciplined manner.

A get to gather of our major donors was organised on 29.10.2011 to felicitate them and convey our feeling of thankfulness towards them. Rev. Swami Savitanandaji from vil. Tarsada graced the occasion. The donors were given a memento ensuring that the memory of their support for the work remains permanently with them. It is these donor's unconditional support which has sustained the work even when the foreign donation has not come. Home ministry is taking unduly too long for the prior permission under FCRA for getting foreign donation.

Many visitors came during the year. Everybody appreciated the infrastructure in one voice. Patients are appreciating the facilities, the services and the behaviour of the staff.

Towards the end of the year, Govt. of Gujarat has issued orders to transfer the responsibility of conducting operations at Netrang PHC and Jhankhvav CHC to Divyajyoti trust which was under SEWA Rural till date. This will give us an opportunity to provide surgical facilities at the door steps of the patients in that area.

Dr. Udaybhai was awarded "Vision Award" by the Vision 2020: The Right to Sight India programme during the world sight day celebrations at Udaipur on 12<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2011. This is the first vision award given by them. All the hard work done over last 20 years was appreciated and his contribution to the cause of eye care in the country was recognised through this award.





## THE HOSPITAL

The hospital is located at the outskirts of the Mandvi town. The surrounding area is quiet and some open space around the hospital provides opportunity for parking of the vehicles.

Right from the beginning, the OPD patients' load has remained high. Average 70-75 patients are coming daily. We are afraid the waiting area in the OPD will soon start falling short.

Surgical work started a little late from 7<sup>th</sup> June after the inauguration as the cleaning work was pending as the renovation was completed just before the inauguration. Looking at the workload, we realised that we will need another Ophthalmologist. Dr. Sheetal Chaudhari from Vyara joined us from June'11. Her enthusiasm & efficiency have taken the work to one step above. With two diagnostic eye camps and other administrative burden, Dr. Uday was not able to take care of clinical work on a round the clock basis and so we needed another Ophthalmologist. Dr. Kamini Patel another Ophthalmologist from Vyara joined us in August.

At the same time, the workload also picked up fast. The no. of surgeries rose to about 10 per day on an average. Dr. Rohan coming back from London and joining us in Oct. was a big relief. Particularly during winter months, the average surgeries reached nearly 20 per day. We had 63 patients in the wards on one day which is the maximum occupancy on a given day in the year.

However, our focus is on the poor and lower middle class people, paying patients have also started coming. Our charges structure is prepared in such a way that the lower middle class can also afford. All the services are offered totally free to all the BPL card holders and poor patients. Even the speciality services are offered free of cost to the poor and needy patients.

The subspeciality services were also started almost from the beginning and like minded consultants in various sub specialities started coming regularly once in a month. Gradually, their services are also being utilised in a big way by the patients. When Dr. Khushboo Doctor a trained vitreo retinal surgeon joined us and we spread the message about her joining among the colleagues, good no. of patients are now taking benefits of her services. Now, we are looking for the posterior vitrectomy machine which is required to perform major retinal surgeries. As we provide these services at a very subsidised rate and free to the poor patients, referral is increasing. Fortunately, towards the end of the year, we have received approval for the same from Kakrapar Atomic Power Station under their CSR activity. Similarly, we have received approval for the equipments required for corneal transplant work from Rotary Club of Surat, Roundtown under a matching grant project. This will greatly facilitate the work.

Through the blindness survey done by Dr. Rohan as a part of his thesis work, we knew that corneal blindness is more in the area and as such we wanted to do corneal transplant work, Dr. Hetal has been sent to Aravind eye hospital, Madurai from June'11. We have done 34 transplant operations by now. We get corneas from Lokdrashti Eye Bank in Surat. The awareness about eye donation in the area is low, still we have received three calls for eye donations from the area during the year. We have already registered ourselves as "Eye Donation Centre" with the Eye Bank Association of India and applied for registration under the "Human Organ transplant Act".





### **Facilities available in the hospital :**

We are using 16000 sq. ft. area in the hospital. Original 10000 sq. ft. Area of the building was renovated and additional 6000 sq. ft. area was added by covering the terrace. However, the physical infrastructure is already falling short.

## NOW THE DREAMS WILL COME TRUE

Philanthropy is deep rooted in our culture. Donation of food, clothes and free education are known to us for ages BUT the modern science has now made it possible to donate blood and eyes and other organs like kidney, heart, skin, liver etc.

This is the story of 21 years old Sunita Padvi from Khapar village of Akkalkua taluka, in Nandurbar district of Maharashtra. There are only two members in the family Sunita and her mother Komalben. Both the mother and the daughter are marginal labourers.

One fine day, Sunita had redness in both her eyes. They went to a near by clinic (not an ophthalmologist), who gave her some drugs. Things did not improve and so they went from one place to the other for treatment, in fact, she was admitted in one hospital for eight days. However, they could treat the infection part of the eye and so eye became quiet BUT the vision did not improve as the corneas had become white during this time.

Tejas Eye Hospital had organised a diagnostic camp in Khapar on 09.10.2011. Komalben took Sunita for examination at the camp site. The Ophthalmologist told them that she will have to come to the hospital and only corneal transplant can bring her sight back. She came to the hospital on 11<sup>th</sup> Oct. and was admitted in the hospital to perform a minor operation to reduce the vascularisation of the cornea called peritomy. After peritomy, we were debating whether we should keep her waiting for the donated eyes or send her back and call her when cornea becomes available! Meanwhile, we received a call from near by village for eye donation of a young donor. The quality of the corneas was very good.

Sunita received the transplant in one eye. The graft was doing well and she had started seeing again. When other patients were called for transplant using the second eye, they refused saying that they did not have time. Ideally speaking when a patient registers himself / herself for transplant, when the donor cornea becomes available, they must come immediately. BUT our patients don't understand the value of donor cornea becoming available free of cost. We had to use the second cornea also within four days, so we decided to perform second transplant on 4<sup>th</sup> post operative day on Sunita's second eye. This is not done as a routine. With the grace of GOD, the second transplant also did well. All the drugs required post operatively, were provided by us totally free looking at the poor economic conditions of Sunita. Naturally, the surgery was also done free.

During the times, when Sunita was blind, mother Komalben had to face many hardships. On one hand, Sunita could not see and hence could not work and on the other hand, Komalben had to stay back home to take care of Sunita, so she also could not earn anything. Mother had to do the household chores and also take care of Sunita. Having spent more than six months in darkness, now there is light in the life of young Sunita, a new life; a new sunrise. Now, Komalben is talking about getting Sunita married. She is physically handicapped too in one leg, so instead of becoming a burden on mother, she wants to become independent. Now, that she has regained her eyesight, she is quite hopeful about getting some gainful work and see to it that her dream comes true.

Looking at the sparkle in the eyes of Sunita and her mother, we feel fresh at the end of the day and get more encouraged to work more for patients like Sunita. We are also praying Almighty to help us become instrumental in Sunita's dream coming true.

### Outreach activities :

As the basic objective of the trust is to reach out to the poorest of the poor, providing services at the doorsteps of the patients was there in the agenda anyway. Even when the surgery is done free, the patient may end up spending good bit of money on transportation.

Outreach activities in terms of diagnostic eye camps have been started right from the beginning. Twice a week diagnostic eye camps on Wednesday and Sunday is a routine. We cover the tribal areas of Surat, Tapi and Narmada districts, parts of Bharuch, Navsari, Dang and Valsad districts are also covered through these camps. A total population of about 25 lacs is getting benefits through these camps. During the year, from June'11 to March'12, 73 diagnostic eye camps were organised successfully.

Planning for the whole year was done in the beginning of the year. Meeting with local leaders and making necessary arrangements is done one month in advance. Then publicity material is printed and publicity of two days with the help of jeep and mike is done just before the camp.

On the day of the camp, the team comprising of an Ophthalmologist, 3-4 Ophthalmic assistants and other staff reaches the campsite at 9 am. Refraction is also done at the camp site and spectacles are provided. All the pre operative work up is done at the campsite to ensure fewer rejections after bringing the patient to the base hospital. The next day, patients under go operations. The following day, after the dressings, the same 40 seater bus drops them back to the campsite. Patient and relative are provided free food during their stay. Post operative medicines and glasses are also provided free to the patients.





We have received very good support from all the local leaders and camp organisers during the year. Particularly from Shri Bahadursinhbhai, Shri Aravindbhai (both from Kosamba) and Shri Bachubhai (Utiyadara). Shri Nalinbhai Shah & Shri Nimeshbhai Shah of Mandvi and Shri Ramjibhai Chandak of Maheshwari Samaj, Surat ( executive committee members), were active in fund raising for the camps.

Statistical details of the camps organised during the year can be seen in the following table.

### **TRAINING ACTIVITIES :**

To start with, the staff selected were sent to SEWA Rural, Jhagadia for training and they joined duties before the inauguration. BUT the workload increased beyond our own expectations and the no. of staff available started falling short. There are no possibilities of getting qualified staff in rural area and even if somebody comes, won't last long. We had to recruit new staff and think about their training. We wanted to start training programme BUT we were forced to start the same in the first year itself. During the year, we have trained ophthalmic assistants, ophthalmic nurses, optical fitting person and OT boy. They are performing well and their competence is developing fast. One of the staff members was sent to Venu Eye Institute, Delhi for one and a half months training in maintenance of equipments.

We got one student from Bihar also for training as ophthalmic assistant. He completed his training in March'12 and has joined his parent organisation.

One training workshop for Sightsavers was also organised during the year on "Evaluation of the hospitals for clinical protocols". 22 participants from all over India (Kanyakumari, Bangalore, Vishakhapattanam, Hrishikesh, Nagpur, Pune, Bhopal etc.) participated in the workshop.

Dr. Hetalben Solanki - our Ophthalmologist is under going one and a half years fellowship in cornea at Aravind Eye Hospital, Madurai. She will complete her training in Nov.'12 and will join us from Dec.'12.

Dr. Khushboo J. Doctor - our retina specialist will go to Aravind Eye Hospital, Coimbatore in July'12 for one month training in Retinopathy of Prematurity.

### **RESEARCH ACTIVITIES :**

During the year, "Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness" survey was carried out in seven talukas of Surat district as a part of Dr. Rohan's thesis.

We are in the process of developing a revised version of "School Screening Manual" for Sightsavers.

Dr. Rohan has already published article on "Suppurative Keratitis- a public health perspective" in the DOS times. Another article is under review. He is being invited as a guest speaker at various fora.

A major blindness survey for Mandvi taluka will be undertaken in first quarter of the next year. Along with that, we are going to conduct blood sugar test to detect diabetes for all the people above the age of 40 years in the community in Mandvi taluka. Approx. 30000 tests will be carried out and all the diabetic patients will be called to the hospital for detailed examination. This will be a unique activity - not done anywhere in the country till date. We will also carry out a study of the financial status in the community.

One more study - "Rapid Assessment of Refractive Error" will be conducted in the area provided we get funding for the same - likely to be a multi centric study and we may do the co ordination of the study.





## RAPID ASSESSMENT OF AVOIDABLE BLINDNESS SURVEY

Dr. Rohan Chariwala our Ophthalmologist was sent to International Centre for Eye Health, London for a one year course- M.SC. in Community Ophthalmology from Sept.'10. As a part of the study, the students have to submit a thesis. After long discussions, we decided to conduct "Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness" survey in our project area. The purpose was many folds- to get the prevalence rates of blindness in our service area, establish a baseline for comparison at a later date to find out if our interventions have made any difference or not. And Dr. Rohan's thesis also gets completed.

First of all, Dr. Rohan took ethical clearance from ICEH, London and we also cleared the project from our side. Next, we collected census data of Mandvi taluka. Dr. Rohan selected 44 villages from the seven tribal blocks of Surat district on a random basis using special software developed for the same.

Each village was visited before the actual survey. The village leaders were explained the procedure and consent was taken. On the day of the survey, team consisting of one Ophthalmologist, one supervisor, two paramedics, two enumerators and one driver went to the village. By and large, we visited two villages with the help of two teams every day.

Most of the villagers co operated without any questions, however, at times, people asked questions who are you? Where are you coming from? Why are you doing this? Who is providing funding? Etc. were the questions commonly asked. Occasionally, people refused also, sometimes the team was requested to come at a later moment during after noon. One old lady asked- are these doctors experienced or they are students? One lady who was drunken, abused the team also. One or two people said that Govt. had provided funds to be distributed and why we were not giving that money to them! Many leaders made arrangements for lunch of our team also.

Those in the need of surgery, were brought back to the hospital on the same day in our vehicle. When the result of the surgery was good, the elderly patients expressed their pleasure.

The whole activity had to be done in monsoon as that was the time assigned for the work by ICEH. Our team had to visit villages on kachcha roads, had to pass through mud filled areas, there was water logging in many places, at times our vehicle could not reach the village and the team had to travel on foot BUT the team was committed to finish the survey in time as Dr. Rohan had to finish the survey and go back to London to complete the study. Data entry operators had to take care of data entry late at night after Dr. Rohan would cross check all the forms. Many times, we had to take care of surgical work early in the morning because the same doctors had to go out in the field for the survey work. The team took all kinds of trouble to finish the survey in time. When the people at ICEH London came to know that we had finished the survey in time, they were surprised that how did the team manage to do such a major task in such a short time! The team has provided a very good example of team work and we hope that we will continue to do the same in future also.

The results of the survey have shown that the blindness in our service area is comparable with the overall blindness in the country. This means that not much work has been done in the area. (We were expecting these results, that was the reason why we established the hospital in tribal area of Surat district). The other major finding that came out from the survey is that the blindness due to corneal diseases is 8% of the total population against the 4% national average. This means that we will have to do more work to reduce corneal blindness by doing more corneal transplant operations. For this reason only, Dr. Hetalben has been sent to Madurai for cornea fellowship.





## **CAMPS FOR ORTHOPAEDIC HANDICAPPED PEOPLE AND HEARING AID DISTRIBUTION CAMP :**

Lions club of Surat Silk City joined hands in one eye camp in the area. Later, they came forward with a suggestion to hold camp for orthopaedic handicapped people and hearing aid distribution camp.

Since our aim is to reach out to the poorest of the poor people, we thought that if we can help these handicapped people, we are reaching out to the genuinely poor and needy section of the community only. So, we agreed with the suggestion of Lions club. Both the camps received very good response.

Shri Ramjibhai Chandak - our executive committee member mobilised funds to distribute uniforms and school kits to 1000 children in Ashramshala of Umarpada area. Students of 1st to 7th std. Received the benefits on 25/09/2011 and 02/10/2011.

## **SUPPORT TO OTHER CENTRES:**

Dr. Uday was previously working as the head of eye department at SEWA Rural, Jhagadia and so he has continued to provide administrative support by going there once in a week. However, it is becoming more and more difficult to go out once in a week regularly in view of the increased workload and additional responsibilities in Mandvi.

Vision centres run by Adivasi Eye Care Trust in Dang district were initially evaluated by Dr. Rohan and Mr. Pradeep as the chief of their funding agency Mr. Jashvantbhai Mehta wanted us to carry out an evaluation. Evaluation was followed by a meeting with Shri Jashvantbhai Mehta and Mr. Motibhai Chaudhari and an action plan was chocked out to bring about an improvement in the response. The vision technicians from Dang are planning to come here for a couple of days for refresher training.

## **OUR DONORS AND WELL WISHERS:**

First major donation was declared by Share and Care foundation, USA. Unfortunately after one and a half years of making the application, we have not received the clearance from home ministry and hence that fund has not yet reached us. When the Jain Shwetambar Samaj, Surat -Udhana came to know about the good intentions, they also agreed to provide big amount. Followed by many organisations like Dhun Pestonji Parakh Discretionary trust-Mumbai, Asian star co.- Mumbai, Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust- Mumbai, Vision Foundation of India-Mumbai, Pentagon Charitable Trust- Mumbai, Uka Tarsadiya Trust-Bardoli, Hariram Charitable Trust-Surat, Woods Enterprise-Surat and Dhanera Diamonds-Surat etc. Many individual donors also came forward like Shri Jay Chhaira & his group-Surat, Shri Indubhai Shah & his group- Valsad etc. Jeevan Akshay Charitable Trust, Vadodara and Hari Om Seva Trust, Vadodara are helping us in conducting eye camps regularly.

Part of the payment of all the equipments purchased and renovation work done is still due as the foreign donation has not come. BUT the traders and construction people know that we are doing genuine charity and their money will come once we receive the permission to receive foreign donations, they are quietly waiting and we sincerely appreciate their patience and support.

Our proposals submitted to the Rotary Club of Surat, Roundtown for corneal transplant related equipments and to Kakrapar Atomic Power station for retina surgical equipments are approved and funds will be released early next year. This will make the hospital much better equipped.

## POVERTY IS A CURSE

Ramanbhai Patel of Dedvasan, Ta. Mahuva, Dist. Surat is economically poor. He produces vegetables in small piece of land that he has and goes for farm labour to sustain the family.. He has two sons 14 years and 17 years old. Thus he runs the family of four with meager resources in a difficult situation.

Naturally the family faces lot of difficulties. The labourer - always facing injustice and less remuneration, generally ends up with some bad habits. Once Ramanbhai lost his temper on the younger son Milan under the effect of alcohol and bet him with the wooden stick. Milan sustained serious injury to his eye.

When the family realised the seriousness of the injury, they started running from place to place for his treatment. Milan developed cataract in his left eye due to injury. BUT due to lack of financial arrangements and proper guidance, they just kept moving to different places. Unfortunately, surgery could not be done for more than a year. In all, he went to Bardoli 3-4 times and once to Navsari. Somewhere they were given an estimate of Rs. 30,000/- for the operation which they won't be able to afford in any case. So, they stopped taking treatment. After more than a year, he came to Mandvi with his mother Gitaben by which time, the eye was damaged to a great extent.

We did several operations on Milan- once cataract removal, than anti glaucoma operation and so on. BUT the intra ocular pressure is still remaining high with three anti glaucoma drugs and visual recovery is also not up to the mark.

Since we had to perform many procedures, he stayed in the hospital for long periods and he is a cute child so the doctors and staff developed affection and sympathy for him. Milan and his mother helped us in the kitchen while they were in the hospital. When we told Gitaben to take remuneration for the help in the kitchen, she said, I don't want to take anything because I am getting this opportunity to help other poor people. However, by explaining her, we did pay the remuneration due to her. BUT we feel the generosity of the poor people in the behaviour of Gitaben and are humbled by her words. Both Milan and Gitaben felt the warmth and affection in the hospital against the difficulties that they are facing in life.

Milan had scored 75% marks in 7<sup>th</sup> std. BUT in the 8<sup>th</sup> std. due to this injury and related running around, he could not focus on his studies and had to be promoted to 9<sup>th</sup> std.

Milan has become favourite of all the staff and so with the consent of our trustees, we decided to provide him lodging and boarding facility in the hospital and take care of his educational expenses. We hope that with the grace of GOD we will be able to help this promising young boy to achieve academic progress.

### OUR VISITORS :

Many people - donors, well wishers and guests visited the hospital during the year. Guests from Jain Shwetambar Terapanth Sabha, Surat-Udhana, President Mandvi Nagarpalika Shri Natubhai Rabari, Administrator of Tribal subplan, Mandvi Shri P.K.Desai, Members of Sargam Builders-Surat, Sidhdhshila apt.- Surat, Jyotibhai-Maliniben and Swatiben from Valod, Shri Jayantbhai Shroff-Smt. Yoginiben Shroff & Dr. Bhartiben Malik from Share and Care Foundation-USA, Retina specialist Dr. Bhavin and Dr. Miral Patel- Surat, Dr. Vasantbhai Desai- Valsad, Shri Rajendraji-secretary Kishorebharti- Madhya Pradesh etc. Visited us. Camp sponsors Shri Pravinbhai Modi - Shri Balvantbhai Modi - Smt. Meetaben Doshi- Jinendra Foundation- Smt. Varshaben Doshi-Kolkatta, Shri Karsanbhai Bhakta- Shampura, Shri Kiritbhai Modi, Shri Pankajbhai Patel also visited us and met the patients from their sponsored camp and encouraged us in our work. Dr. Rishi Mathur and his team visited us for inspection of our facility for permission as base hospital, for eye donation centre grant and for FCRA permission.





## STAFF WELFARE ACTIVITIES :

Our staff members are instrumental in successful implementation of the activities. Their thoughts, deeds and polite and humble behaviour is the key to the good outcome. All the workers are working hard and giving extra time late in the day also to cope up with the high workload. Staff members have set very good examples and proved their honesty by rejecting gifts offered by patients and by depositing the lost / found items from ward and OPD to the administrator.

Diwali was celebrated with the family members of the staff. Children enjoyed fire crackers followed by dinner together. On 15th August and 26th January - flag hoisting ceremony were organised. Staff with their family members were sent to Tithal for a one day picnic on 15th August after the flag hoisting ceremony. A get to gather of all the staff with their family members was organised on 29th Dec. - a short cultural programme given by the staff members was followed by dinner. This kind of get to gather will be organised twice a year on a regular basis. Shri Ramjibhai Chandak our executive committee member raised funds for distribution of school kits and uniform to all the 22 kids of the staff. Two other donors gave sarees to all the female staff members.

All the clinical staff was vaccinated against hepatitis. A health check up of all the staff was done and this will be done regularly every year. Staff members and their family members can avail the hospital facilities free of cost. Medicines are also provided free from the medical store. Spectacles are provided at a subsidised rate.

We have paid premium under the workman compensation act. One of the staff member working in the kitchen developed fracture while working in the kitchen and she got the benefits of the scheme.

Planning for savings and credit activity for staff members is on. We will start this activity soon.

## Future planning :

We are going to start the "Community Based Rehabilitation" programme for the incurably blind individuals in Mandvi taluka from April. The whole population of Mandvi taluka (Approx. 2 lacs) will be covered. The taluka will be divided into 10 clusters and one worker will be selected per cluster. A door to door survey of blindness will be conducted. Along with that, screening of all the individuals > 40 years of age for diabetes will be done approx.- 30000 blood sugar tests will be carried out. A survey to find out the financial status of the community will also be combined with this survey. The rehabilitation work will include social rehabilitation, mobility training, activities of daily living skills training, economic rehabilitation for the young individuals and integrated education activity for blind children.

We want to start formal and regular training of Ophthalmic assistants, ophthalmic nurses, Optical fitting person and OT boys. The first batch of Ophthalmic assistants has completed the training and are already working BUT we want to put this activity on a stronger footing. At appropriate time, we want to start the training of Ophthalmologists in SICS and Phacoemulsification also. Once we complete three years of working in the hospital, we will apply for permission to run the residency programme - DNB in Ophthalmology under National Board of Examinations.





## PAINFUL REALITY

When we decided to establish a trust and work in rural tribal area of Surat district, naturally the first thing that comes to the mind is financial arrangements. Initially we thought, we will start in a small way and expand gradually when the funds become available and the workload increases.

We started looking for funds and discussions were held with some potential donors. We contacted Share and Care Foundation, USA ( an NGO established by NRIs for the welfare activities in India), they immediately agreed to provide major funding in the tune of 300000\$. Their assurance made us rethink our strategy and we decided to set up a reasonably big sized hospital so that we don't have to think of expansion at least for five years. Accordingly, we planned a 40 bedded hospital and all the other ancillary arrangements were also planned for that size of the hospital.

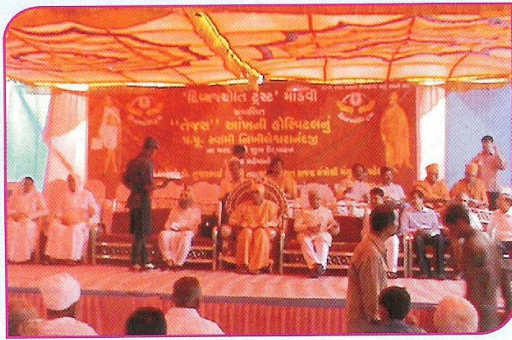
However, for getting funds from foreign source, we have to apply to the home ministry, Delhi for permission under FCRA (foreign currency regulation act). Permanent FCRA no. is allotted only after three years of existence. Ours was a new trust, so we had to apply for a one time permission.

We applied online on the home ministry website on 26.10.2010. Before that, we wrote to the district collector, Surat also. Hard copy of our online application with the necessary annexures was sent in first week of November 2010. Ideally speaking the home ministry has to decide within 90 days of application. Where as in our case, the first receipt of application came in January 2011 from home ministry saying that a decision will be taken within 90 days. In april again the home ministry said that some more time will be required and that the application was under process. In july, we wrote a reminder BUT in Oct. 2011, we were informed that the application was forwarded to the urban development ministry for enquiry. In January 2012, we were informed that the application was forwarded to the health and family welfare department for enquiry. The question that comes to our mind is- if it had to be sent to other departments for enquiry, why did they take more than a year to do so? Had it been done earlier, the enquiry process would have been completed long time back.

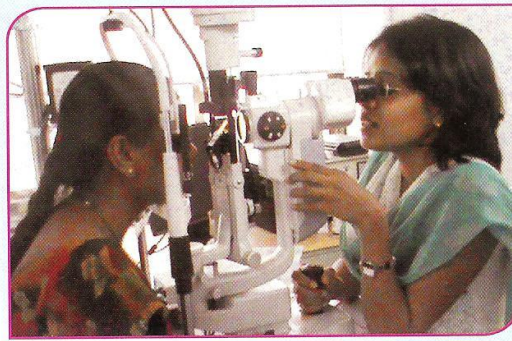
When we enquired with the home ministry, Delhi they said the Govt. of Gujarat has not sent details to them. We went to the home ministry, Guj., they said FCRA activity is handed over to legal dept., legal dept. said that charity comm., A'bad has not sent details to them. Charity com. A'bad said that the asstt. Charity comm. Office, Surat had not replied. Asstt. Charity comm. Office, Surat took eight months time to give us three page report that is required to be submitted along with other papers - the reason being, they did not have staff to do that work. When Asstt. Charity comm. Office, Surat sent their report to Charity comm. Office, A'bad, they said that The Collector, Surat had also not sent the report. Had they informed us earlier about it in one shot, we would have followed up with The Collector office, Surat also. We enquired with the Collector office, Surat. They said that Mandvi prant office had not sent report to them. We enquired with the prant office, Mandvi- they had misplaced the letter which they had received three months back. Upon tracing the letter, it took them three days and repeated reminders to catch hold of it. After that it was sent to Mamlatdar office, Mandvi. They took 15 days to come for inspection as they were busy. Now, their report has been forwarded to prant office and from there to The collector office, Surat. We hope that the prior permission under FCRA will be given to us at least now.

However, due to the lack of money that is supposed to come from Share and Care Foundation, USA, we are facing some financial problems. Our suppliers of the equipments and our construction contractors are not yet given their full payment. It is their kindness that they are waiting patiently even after one year for the balance payment to be released.

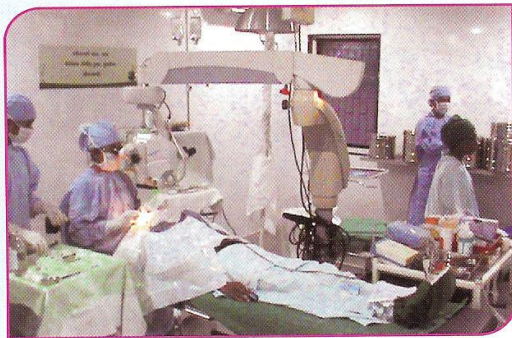

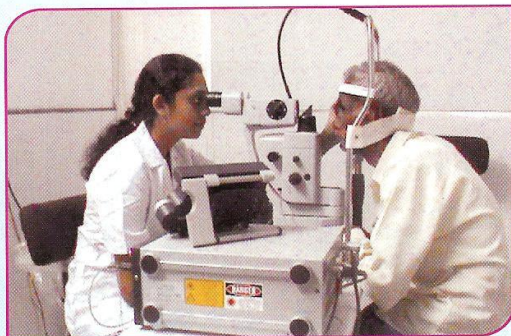

### **NOW PARENTS CAN PLAN FOR SUNABEN'S MARRIAGE**

Karnilal Vasava of Limdha village of Mandvi is a farm labourer. There are three kids and the husband wife in the family of five. The elder daughter Sunaben was having dimness of vision in both eyes since she was in 4<sup>th</sup> std. She was taken to private clinics several times for nearly two years. However, as Karnilal's income was a meager amount, they could not afford to continue the treatment for a long period of time. Still, as she was having dimness of vision, they managed some money for treatment BUT still Sunaben's problems were increasing and her eye sight was getting poorer and poorer. Now, her mother had to stay back home with her to take care of her and Sunaben had to withdraw from the school.

Tejas Eye Hospital in Mandvi was inaugurated on 22<sup>nd</sup> May and a mega eye camp was organised on 23<sup>rd</sup> May. The family came to know about the camp through the publicity vehicle which distributed the pamphlets of the camp. The parents brought Sunaben to Mandvi for check up.

The doctors diagnosed that Sunaben had cataract in both her eyes and also that her retina was weak from recurrent inflammation of the eye in the past which was not treated properly. Initially, she was given treatment for reducing the inflammation in the eye and then both eyes were operated for cataract extraction with IOL implantation at an interval of one month. She is given spectacles also after one and a half months of operation and now, she has good vision in both her eyes.

As Sunaben's father is a farm labourer, she was treated totally free including operations. Now, Sunaben's life is back on track. She is taking care of her younger siblings and also does all the household chores to help her mother. And so, the parents are able to go to the field for farm labour. The parents are now talking about getting Sunaben married as she is 24 years of age.

The family is very happy & expressing thankfulness to the doctors and staff of Tejas Eye Hospital. Their eyes are filled with tears of happiness as their daughter will now be able to lead a normal life.

### **NEITHER 'ROTLA' NOR MY HANDS WILL NOW GET BURNT**

Menaben Dhansingbhai Chaudhari resides in Titoi village of Mandvi Taluka with her husband Dhansingbhai. Both survive on the meager income earned from farm labour. Since they don't have kids, all the household work has to be done by both of them and also go out for farm labour.

Menaben's eye sight diminished over few years as she developed cataract in both eyes. They were ignorant about cataract and the situation was compounded by lack of finance. Now, as Menaben was unable to see, she had to stay back home she would stumble upon objects and was getting her fingers burnt while preparing "Rotla" or by mistake picking up the burning fire wood used for cooking. As she could not go out, her income from farm labour also stopped which added to their problems.

Tejas Eye Hospital, Mandvi had organised a camp in village Ambapardi where Menaben got her eye checked. Doctors told her that by doing cataract operations on both eyes, she will be able to start seeing again. Menaben was brought to the hospital in the 40 seater bus used for transportation of the camp patients. Both eyes were operated one after the other. Menaben was prescribed glasses after six weeks.

Now, as Menaben is able to see with both her eyes, she is very happy. Now, she is able to take care of the household activities comfortably and fast. She is able to go out for labour work also. Since she is now earning also, their financial situation has also improved to that extent.

One of the staff asked her "How did she feel?" Immediately, Menaben showed her hands and said, "My child; see these hands have been burnt several times BUT now, neither Rotla nor my hands will get burnt while cooking as I am able to see again. Now, my burns have also healed and I am very happy."
