Dear well Wisher,

We are happy to present this fourth annual report to you all. We were busy tackling the workload which has continued to increase even in this third year of operations, although, we did not put in any extra efforts. In fact, this year's motto for the staff was "increasing their competence & speed". Still the no. of OPD and operations increased by approx. 15%.

As the workload has increased, the present space available in the hospital is falling short substantially. BUT now, the construction work has started after a delay of almost one year and will be completed in one year time. The fourth OT also will become functional soon. All this will give us more working space and staff and patients will become more comfortable.

Rapid expansion naturally takes its toll. All the key people involved in the day to day functioning are overworked. However, all the efforts are being made to improve the quality - in the last year, operation theatre activities were evaluated by an outside consultant, this year our outreach activities and administrative systems will be audited by outside agencies. A lot of infra structural changes have been made inside the OT :- installation of laminar flow on one OT table & air tight door, touch free scrub solution dispensers are installed and some more changes are coming up in this year. In short, we are committed to quality work.

Here a mention of the efforts at becoming eco-friendly is worthwhile. We have installed 15 KW grid connect & 3 KW battery back-up solar electricity generation plants. This is in addition to 3 solar street lights, 1000 ltr. Solar water heater, bio gas plant, partially solar cooking, use of waterless urinal, installation of LED lights gradually replacing tube lights and CFL lights. Our carbon emission report is also submitted to the United Nations and we hope to bring down our carbon emission to zero level in five years.

All this has been possible with generous support from well-wishers and donors like you - individuals and organisations who have come forward and helped this worthy cause. Our faith in Swami Vivekananda's saying "You start the work and help will come on its own" has turned out to be so true. We are sure, the same support will continue in the years to come. We need financial support for the construction project for the expansion of the hospital and we welcome the smallest donation also for the cause.

The Year at a glance

With the grace of God & due to tremendous local demand, work load has increased substantially. Being the only charitable eye hospital with all necessary equipments in the area surrounding Mandvi, we operated nearly 6800 patients this year. Total surgery performed till date is more than 16000.

Looking towards high demand & speed of expansion, one vision building exercise was carried out between 4th & 5th May this year. The President of vision 2020 Right to Sight India - Col. Dr. Deshpande and CEO Dr. G. V. Rao conducted the same & guided us about how to cope up with increasing work load & roadmap for five years from now was prepared.

On 22nd may 2013, the hospital has completed 2 Years of its functioning so it was celebrated with staff & family members - a get to gather & cultural programme were organised. Executive committee meeting was also held on the same day & celebrated completion of 100 corneal transplant surgeries. By now, we have crossed 200 corneal transplants.

This Year educational tour for our staff members was organised to visit Anjali-Ranasan, Rajendra Nagar - Kushtharog trust, PHC Shamlaji, & Rasiklal Shah Sarvajanik hospital- Modasa. The objective of the educational tour is to develop deep understanding of social work & sympathy for weak & deceased people of the society among staff members.

The demonstration to use fire safety equipments was done by Kakrapar fire safety team.

Initially we purchased tailor-made glasses from Baroda but now our optician got training to prepare spectacles from plain glasses & also we installed the lathe machine, we are trying to prepare spectacles in a couple of hours. This doesn't generate more profit but the time & money of the patients will be saved as second trip for collecting spectacles is saved now.

At present Mr. Vinodbhai Dholakia is involved in regular internal monitoring. In addition, Mr. Aravindbhai Desai comes once in a month regularly to help us. Same way, Dr. Swati Zavar from Tulsi eye hospital, Nashik evaluated our hospital operation theatre & gave us her suggestions. We have made necessary corrections also.

We have installed 15 KVA solar electricity generation plant, bio gas plant for cooking, which will reduce our carbon emission & there by helping eco-friendly activity.

We have purchased lifesaving equipments like ventilator, NIBP machine, ECG machine & Defibrillator from grant released by hon. MLA Shri Prabhubhai Vasava.

Dr. Udaybhai attended annual general meeting of Mandvi primary school teachers



association & delivered a lecture on eye donation.

We published "Margdarshika" to guide staff members about the rules & regulations as well as benefits given to them. To encourage savings habit, we tried to organise bachat mandal (co operative society of staff members) so as to save some money for future requirement.

Flag hoisting ceremony on 15th Aug. was carried out by Mrs. Dipikaben Shah (Social Worker & wife of our secretary Shri Nalinbhai Shah) of Mandvi and on 26th January by Mr. Chaturbhai Vasava (Principal of V.F High school primary section, Mandvi).

Annual meeting of Community Ophthalmology Society of India was hosted by us this year. Managing Director of Venu eye Institute-Delhi Ms. Tanuja Joshi & Dr. Suryakant Jha & Dr. Samixa Chaudhary, Dr. Shashiben Tyagi - GRAVIS- Rajasthan, Mr Mahavir Jain - vision 2020 India, Dr. Tanuja Brito - Joseph eye Institute Kerala, Dr. Mihirbhai Joshi - Visnagar & Dr. Mehulbhai & Dr. Shreyaben Shah - Drashti Netralaya, Dahod attended the meeting. Interesting & useful deliberations on primary eye care took place during the sessions.

One camp for handicapped people was organised by Lions club of Surat Silk City at our hospital & distributed 24 tricycles, 3 wheelchairs, 23 Pairs hearing aid & 6 Pair callipers to needy patients.

During the year Dr. Hetal Solanki, Dr. Saket Saradhia, Dr. Khushbu Doctor & Dr. Pratik Shah left us and Dr. Archana Chaudhari, Dr. Chintan Dholakia, Dr. Parth Joshi & Dr. Dhavat Sukharamwala Joined us. Retina Consultant Dr. Shilpa Patel Joined from 1st Apr. 2014.

Sight restored for Father Son both

Ghanabhai Vadvi - Age 88 years, resident of village Khapar Tal. Akkalkuva was blind due to mature cataract in both his Eyes. Ghanabhai visited Khapar camp with his son Ranjitbhai aged 62 years. In camp, he was diagnosed with cataract in both eyes and our team brought them both to Mandvi for Surgery.

Because of old age and tension of surgery, he was very resistant about the operation. Our staff found it difficult to get case papers from him. He would come out of OT several times from operation table. At last, we called anaesthetist and after anaesthesia only, the surgery was done.

Next day after removal of bandage, Ghanabhai could see everything and his behaviour became normal. The second surgery was done without any problem.

Meantime, his son Ranjitbhai, who knew about his own cataract 6 months ago but due to uncontrolled diabetes, surgery was not done. Now, at the hospital, we gave him drugs to control diabetes and rechecked next morning. As diabetes had come under control, cataract surgery of Ranjitbhai was also carried out.

During Surgeries of both father & son, they stayed in the hospital for 3-4 days and felt the tender care & feelings of our staff. They appreciated the hospitality of our staff. They said that this hospital is a boon for poor people of surrounding area.



Hospital Activity

Average daily hospital OPD is crossing 100. In November, we examined 204 patients one day and in January we did 900 surgeries. This shows that this is really a needy area. To cope up with increasing workload, we are trying our best. Doctors from nearby cities also come on a regular basis and our local anaesthetist Dr. Upendrabhai is also a big support.

Last Year Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority donated Vitrectomy machine useful in retina surgery under their CSR Project. Following this, the medical officers from KAPS run hospital in their township referred eye patients to our hospital & when they were satisfied by our facilities and outcome, they signed an MOU empanelling our hospital to treat KAPS staff & family members. Over & above they sponsored one diagnostic eye camp also.

Generally we instruct our patients to take bath before surgery but many don't, as they have not brought towels with them. We have started providing towel to each patient ensuring a proper bath. Used towels are sent for washing daily. For daily washing of patient's dresses, towels, bed sheets & OT dresses of staff, an Industrial washing machine is procured.

To save commuting time & money of patients, we have purchased lathe machine to cut the glasses & prepare tailor made spectacles here only.

We observed that most of the Patients, visiting the hospital for their eye check-up are ignorant about their diabetes status. So, we have started to check blood pressure, blood sugar & urine Sugar of all the patients aged >40 years coming to the hospital free of cost. Doing this, average ten new cases of diabetes are detected- who are unaware of the same. Both hypertension & diabetes - silent Killers, if detected in early stages & controlled by medicines, major damage can be prevented. Thus this test is very useful for the patients.

This year we got opportunity to do rare/complicated surgeries. An old man from Songadh had live thread worm in his left eye. When he consulted an Ophthalmologist in Vyara, she referred him to Tejas Eye Hospital. Upon reaching Mandvi, after examination and necessary testing, he was taken for surgery immediately. Dr. Rohanbhai removed live worm successfully & Dr Chintanbhai documented the same. Similarly Dr Bakulbhai Trivedi - visiting oculo-plasty consultant removed a tumour from behind the eye in a 3 hours long surgery.

We have completed 200 corneal transplant surgeries between May 11 to April 14. We have also started Micro Incision Cataract surgery (MICS). 75 paediatric surgeries are done this year. (Sponsored by Combat Blindness Foundation). One squint operation was done under topical anaesthesia.



This Year during eye donations fortnight (from 25/8/13 to 8/9/13), we organised awareness activities in four Villages -Rataniya, Ghantoli, Devgad & Bhatkhai. We distributed pamphlets on eye donation, showed video documentary and organised one rally with the help of V.F High school authority - 500 Students joined the rally showing messages for eye donation. Our team joined in the rally organised by Surat DBCS.

Our retina specialist Dr. Khushboo left us in Jan. 2014 upon completion of her two years' commitment. New retina specialist Dr. Shilpa was to join us from April. The gap of three months was filled by Dr. Bhavin Patel-Surat, Dr. Jayprakash Purohit & Dr. Anil Patil - Vadodara and Dr. Amish Patel - Ahmedabad who worked on Sundays in rotation and kept the work going. We sincerely appreciate their support in continuing the work.

Miss. Divya Chaudhari-a qualified ophthalmic assistant has joined us.

Our low vision clinic was inaugurated by Ms. Preeti Chaudhari who herself is low vision patient on world handicapped day 3rd December (a get to gather of handicapped people of Mandvi taluka was also organised). The financial support for low vision clinic is provided by Sightsavers International & monitored by Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital, Delhi.

We observed that glaucoma patients are in good numbers in our area. So we sent Dr. Sheetalben Chaudhari to H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune for two months short term glaucoma fellowship. Now, after her training, she looks after glaucoma patients regularly.

Operation theatre is the heart of any hospital. We strive continuously to improve the quality of OT. Microbiologists Dr. Dineshbhai Khandhadia- Ahmedabad and Dr. V. C. Poriya- Surat are providing their services for the purpose. Dr. Swati Zavar from Tulsi Eye Hospital, Nashik did evaluation of our OT activities and gave useful suggestions.

Little Amisha's sight restored

Twelve years old girl Amisha of Vil. Andhlikuva, Tal. Umarpada Dist. Surat is studying in primary school of the same village. As she was unable to see with her right eye, was using her left eye for doing all the activities. When we knew about her, our Braille teacher contacted her family & advised them to go to our camp held at Umarpada. After check up in Umarpada camp, our doctor advised her to visit Tejas eye hospital for further investigation.

Amisha was examined in details at the hospital & it was found that there is a problem in retina but after vitrectomy she will be able to see again. Initially, it was difficult to convince her family for surgery as they were under impression that it will be costly. But our counsellor gave them assurance that the surgery will be done free of cost. Finally they agreed & we did vitrectomy for Amisha totally free of cost.

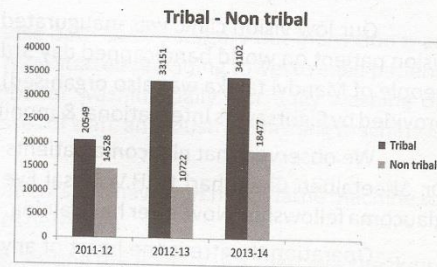
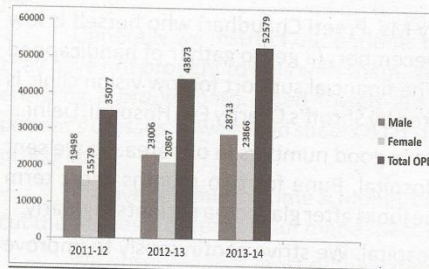

This year Yatin got training in Retinoscopy at Gomabhai Netralaya -Neemach, Madhya Pradesh and now he will teach Retinoscopy to other ophthalmic assistants here. Within short period of 3 years Yatin progressed from peon to ophthalmic assistant to eye bank technician.

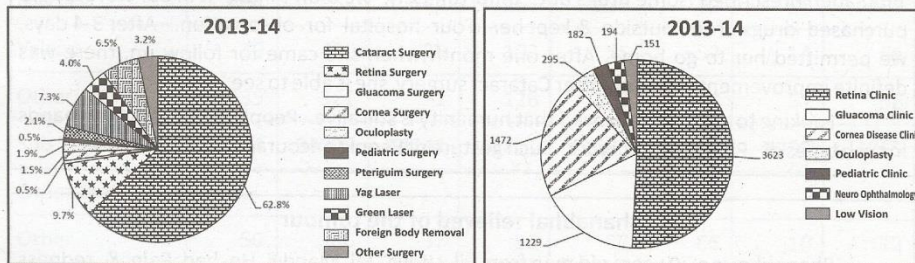

We observed his enthusiasm, speed & understanding and asked him whether he was interested in getting training as an ophthalmic assistant. While undergoing training, looking at his performance, Dr Khushboo took deep interest in training him in retina clinic. Initially he was afraid of using costly machines like O.C.T, laser, B- Scan & FFA machines. But with proper guidance & encouragement from senior ophthalmic assistant Jignesh, he became well acquainted with all the machines. Now Chirag works as angiography technician in Retina clinic to assist Retina consultants very satisfactorily.

From both the cases we can see that a strong determination and hard work is the tool for progress.

We have Started hostel for blind children from June'13 in Mandvi Town. The response from citizens of Mandvi is very warm & encouraging. The village people donate food, clothes, fruits, chocolates etc. frequently for blind children.

During annual function of Mandvi BBA - BCA College, the students planned to present a drama & requested our hostel boy Suresh Vanzara to play the character of a blind. So the college students & Suresh regularly met each other at practice sessions. On the day of celebration, students of the college invited all our blind children to the college ground. At the end of the function, cash awards were declared for best students in academics as well as extra -curricular sports activity. Recipients of cash award donated the same for blind children. Not only that, but one of them, Mr. Viral Tailor promised to teach computers to blind children. Now he regularly comes in the evening after the college to teach computers to blind children.

This proves that our youth carries strong promise to take our country forward.



Humanity is still alive

Ghughraben resides at vil. Jamli, Tal. Akkalkuva Dist. Nandurbar. Ghughraben was examined in the eye camp held at Khapar Ta. Akkalkuva and diagnosed with cataract in both eyes. During further investigation, she was found to have another problem also in her eyes and C.T. Scan was also required to be done. As C.T. Scan is not possible in Mandvi town, we had to send her to Bardoli. But Ghughraben & her attendant had never been to Bardoli, won't understand local language- Gujarati & did not have money. Knowing all this, a gentleman offered to take Ghughraben to Bardoli on his two wheeler. But then, Ghughraben would have to go alone. While all this conversation was going on, one lady who came for her Parents' cataract surgery, generously offered to take them to Bardoli in her four wheeler. Next day, after C.T. Scan was done, we showed the report to Dr. Tanujaben (Neuro Ophthalmologist) who suggested MRI test.

Next day, we sent them to Surat for MRI with our staff. After seeing the report, DR. Tanujaben prescribed some drugs but unfortunately, we didn't have it in our store, so we purchased drugs from outside & kept her in our hospital for observation. After 3-4 days, we permitted her to go home. After one month when she came for follow up, there was definite improvement. And now after Cataract surgery, she is able to see.

Looking to above, it is proved that humanity is still alive. People like to join their hands in such types of Philanthropic work. Such gesture of People encourages us in our work.

Bhanabhai relieved of the tumour

Bhanabhai is a 70 years old man from vil. Uteva, Tal. Mandvi. He had Pain & redness in his left eye since last 6 years. Because of that, the left eye looked abnormally large. Bhanabhai consulted eye specialist for the same at Surat. But as the treatment suggested was very costly, he gave up the same and started taking Painkillers.

One fine day, camp was organised in his village by Divyajyoti trust. Bhanabhai went to see the doctor at the campsite. Here, doctor suggested him to visit Tejas eye hospital, Mandvi. In Mandvi, Doctors suggested that he should see Dr Bakulbhai - Visiting Oculoplasty surgeon coming once a month, who suggested MRI Test. MRI was done at MRI centre, Surat (Run by Chhayando). It was confirmed that there was a tumour behind eye ball which should be removed. The surgery was very complicated, hence long & expensive. The help of Anaesthetist was also needed. After 3 hours long complicated surgery, the tumour was removed successfully. Now Bhanabhai feels relaxed - eye has become normal in size & without inflammation.

Bhanabhai & his family members are very happy & thankful to the hospital. They said that this Hospital in such a small town is like blessing of God for the people around.

Research Activities :-

Divyajyoti trust carried out survey on Refractive Errors RAVI (Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness). The scientific paper on the same was presented at various national & international conferences and was appreciated by everyone. For this survey Dorabji Tata trust, Mumbai provided financial help. During this survey, 454 free presbyopic glasses were distributed and those who needed treatment were treated free of cost.

Out of Total 48,053 people surveyed, 26,778(55.7%) were tribals. Total 662 (1.67%) people were found blind- of which, 475 (71.7%) were males & 183 (28.3%) females. 5619 (11.6%) people had BPL cards while 829 (1.7%) had smart cards and 1299 (27%) people had both.

Results of RAVI survey :-

Prevalence of Blindness, visual impairment, uncorrected refractive errors and Presbyopia are 2%, 27%, 17% and 51.8% respectively. 38.2% people with refractive errors were using glasses for distance and 38.9% people with presbyopia were using glasses for near (Reading glasses). Urban people were using glasses twice as compared to rural people. Main causes of Visual impairment were uncorrected refractive errors (67.4%) and Cataract (27.4%). Main barrier for not accessing eye care was "Non affordability" (37%).

Door to door survey to know magnitude of Blindness

Total of 431 people with low vision were identified. Out of them 269 (62.4%) were males and 162 (37.6%) females - 354 (82%) were tribal and rest 74 (18%) nontribal. Out of these, only 40 had taken treatment - 20 male (50%) and 20 women (50%). 10 people had other blind persons in their home. Only 20 (4.6%) people knew regarding government benefits available to blind people - 14(70%) male and 6 (30%) female. Majority of the blind people were labourer in farms (153 - 35.5%) followed by farmers (135-31%) and Jobless (68 -16%). Before going blind, majority were farmers (165-38.3%) followed by farm labour (102 -23.7%) and jobless (75-17.4%). 357 (82.8%) people were able to move independently without anyone's help, 17 people could do routine day to day activities on their own and 12 people could generate some finance despite their blindness. 12 blinds (12%) had associated handicaps also. 6 people had hearing impairment as well.

As far as the cause of blindness is concerned, 68% (293/431) were cataract blinds, followed by trauma (37/431-8.6%) and corneal ulcers (35/431-8.1%). Out of 431 people, 338 (78.4%) were low vision and 93 (21.5%) were total blind. Odds of low vision are equal among men and women [men 78.8% (212/269), women 77.8% (126/162)]. Majority became blind within 5 years of age (258/431-59.9%) followed by (76/431-17.6%) in 6-10 years of age.

Only 5% blinds (21/431) had Blindness certificate, just 6.5% (28/431) had bus pass, only



2.3% (10/431) were receiving pension and only 0.7% (4/431) were studying despite visual impairment.

Follow Up survey of Diabetes

As part of Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) programme, the blood and urine sugar were checked for all 40+ individuals in Mandvi taluka. Total 793 diabetic people were found in that survey - all these were advised to get their diabetes and eye checked at our hospital. Even after one year, only 110 people came for check-up. So we again approached them to know the barriers which prevented them from seeking eye care even after being advised.

This time, 645 people were examined out of 793 approached (response rate 81.3%). 148 people not examined due to various reasons - 32 were not available, 77 people reported to be normal and refused further questions, 13 refused out rightly and 26 had expired in two years. Majority of diabetics were between 45-60 years. 187 of 221 blood samples of people taken, 84.6% had RBS >150mg%, 15.4% (34/221) were normal. 535 people had nil urine sugar report, 48 people tested positive for urine sugar (6%) and 37 refused,.

Out of 645 people responded, 488 (75%) had consulted physician for their DM. Of the 488 taking treatment for DM, (90%) were taking oral hypoglycemic (OHG) tablets with dietary restriction and exercise. 17 people were on injection Insulin.

Out of 545 people asked whether they are aware of effect of diabetes on eye, 458 (83%) were aware of it of which 261 (56.9%) got their eyes checked up for DR. 187 (72%) people had no evidence of DR, 74 (28%) people had DR. Of these 74 people, 26 did not need any treatment, 9(18.8%) had undergone surgery, 8(16.7%) had lasers, 11(23%) had Inj. Avastin injected in their eyes and 20(41.6%) had laser & Avastin both. 78.6% went to NGO hospital, 12.5% to private hospitals and 8.5% to government hospital for their treatment.

The major barrier for not consulting eye doctor was "Affordability" (95/18950.3%), "No one to escort" (31/18916.4%) followed by "No time/other priorities" (24/189--12.6%). Followed by "fear", "no need" and "other systemic problems". In nutshell "lack of money" and "misunderstanding" are major barriers. However, we take a pleasant note of the fact that awareness is improving through our efforts to educate the masses.

Eye donation awareness (Health Education)

Various efforts are on to make people aware about eye care in villages. We have already prepared pamphlets to impart education on various eye diseases. This year a pamphlet on "Computer vision syndrome" is prepared in Gujarati which will be very useful for laymen.

600-700 Students and staff of V.F. High school and our staff participated in the rally celebrating "World Sight Day" in Mandvi town - the objective was to raise awareness regarding eye diseases and to reduce magnitude of blindness. Approx. 300 students & staff of Areth High School participated in the rally organised to celebrate "Eye Donation Fortnight" in Areth.



Training Activity

1. Training of our staff :-

Training of Kalpesh Chaudhari & Mayank Tamboli as ophthalmic assistant and training of Deepak Vasava as ophthalmic nurse has been completed during the year. One day seminar on infection control for O.T staff was also organised. The training of C.P.R. was given by Dr. Anuj clerk to all Nursing staff. A written test for ophthalmic assistants & nursing staff was also taken. Dr. Sheetal Chaudhari had gone to H. V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune for a short term fellowship of two months in glaucoma. Mr. Chintan Shiroya was sent to Sadguru Netra Chikitsalaya, Anandpur Madhya Pradesh for five weeks for training in Optical fitting. As we do charity work, the training was provided free of cost by them. We sincerely thank them for their support. Mr. Bhavesh Rathod was sent to Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital, New Delhi for one month training in low vision. Now, he will manage the low vision clinic here which is supported by Sightsavers.

Mr. Nikhil Mehta, Mrs. Madhavi Gajiwala & Dr. Parimal Chariwala participated in training of trainers activity (Eye excel) organised by Aravind eye hospital, Madurai. Mr. Pradip Patel, Mr. Yatin Mistry & Mrs. Ranjan Parmar attended three days training in eye bank counselling at thane, Maharashtra. Training for survey on Diabetic retinopathy situational analysis was organised at Indian institute of public health Hyderabad - Dr Rohan Chariwala & Mr. Ajendra Sunva attended the same - we have conducted data collection work in Surat dist.

As part of educational tour, this year our team visited Anjali - Ranasan, Kushth Rog trust - Rajendranagar - Dist. Modasa, Community Health centre - Shamlaji & R.S. General Hospital-Modasa to understand the working of voluntary as well as public health institutions.

2. Training of staff from outside Agency :-

Two staff members of Jeevan Akshay Charitable trust -Vadodara have been trained as ophthalmic assistant. Three staff members of Bhanuben Nanavaty hospital, Chorwad Dist. Junagadh have been trained as ophthalmic assistant. One of them took 4 months training as ophthalmic assistant followed by two months training in optical fitting. Staff from Sonepur, Odisha have been given training in laboratory for 7 days & in OT techniques for 3 days.

Ophthalmologists from Sewa-Rural took training in phacoemulsification surgery here. An infection control webinar was organised for Cipla during the year.

3. Consultancy & Evaluation :-

Dr Udaybhai Carried out evaluation activity for no. of hospitals and organisations during this year which includes Mahatma Gandhi Eye hospital Lucknow U.P; Lions Eye hospital Chorwad, Dist Junagadh, Doshi eye hospital Wankaner, Kanpur Eye hospital Kanpur, Ravishankar Maharaj Eye hospital Chikhodara Dist Anand, B.J.S.S. hospital Barmer Rajasthan & Lepra Society, Sonepur, Odisha. Over & above these, evaluation for eye OT of Maharaja Sayajirao general hospital, Vadodara & M & J Institute Ahmedabad were also done.



4. Workshops and Conferences:

Dr. Uday, Dr. Rohan, Dr. Parimal, Lila and Sunita from nursing staff, Pradeep & Ajendra from outreach group and Mehul & Pratik from office staff participated in Vision 2020: Right to Sight India's annual conference at Sewa Sadan Hospital, Bhopal. This gives the staff an opportunity to understand eye care better and meet others involved in the activity.

Dr. Rohan and Dr. Khushboo attended the Delhi Ophthalmic society's annual conference as resource persons. Dr. Uday attended the DR action plan development workshop in Anand and Refractive error services strengthening workshop at Dahod as resource person. Other Ophthalmic assistants attended the Dahod workshop as delegates. Thus, our work is appreciated by the outside world also.

Annual conference of Community Ophthalmology Society of India was hosted by Divyajyoti trust this year. Very useful deliberations took place on "Primary Eye Care" over two days during the conference. Dr. Nelson Jesudasan from Joseph Eye Hospital, Trichy in Individual category and Drashti Netralaya, Dahod in Institutional category were felicitated with a trophy and locally Dr. Mihirbhai Joshi from Jyoti Eye Hospital, Visanagar in Individual category and Saurashtra Central Mission Hospital, Virangar in Institutional category were felicitated during the conference. Ms. Tanuja Joshi M. D. of Venu Eye Institute, Delhi graced the occasion with her team.

Other Social welfare activity :

One camp for handicapped people was organised by Lions Club of Surat Silk City at our hospital- 24 Tricycles, 3 wheel chairs, 23 pair hearing aid and 6 pair callipers were distributed to the beneficiaries of this camp.

Bhanuben Nanavati Hospital, Chorwad, Dist. Junagadh was lying Idle for 3 years. Their trustees requested us to help and make it functional. Dr. Udaybhai visited the hospital. Then we conducted an eye camp on 21/8/2013 by sending our team of Doctors & Nurses. Then we started running daily OPD by sending one Ophthalmic Assistant in one month rotation to Chorwad. An Ophthalmologist from Veraval started visiting the hospital thrice a week for surgical work. Three young boys selected by Chorwad hospital were trained as ophthalmic assistant at our hospital. Now they have finished their training & are managing day to day functioning. Now OPD of 50 to 60 Patient and 4-5 surgeries a week is going on.

- As Per the request by Gomabhai Netralaya Neemach, M.P, we helped them to select chief executive officer by video conference interview.
- Evaluation of R.N.C. hospital was carried out as per the request of the donors of RNC hospital & helped for future planning of the hospital.
- Dr Udaybhai helped to design Operation Theatre of Rukshmanibai Hospital, A'bad.
- Dr Archana Chaudhari & Dr Pratik Shah Participated in Mega eye Camp organised by Bhansali Trust at Bihar & helped in surgical work.
- Dr Udaybhai has been member of Protocol Committee formed by Govt. of Gujarat & helps in preparing Infection control protocol.

Diagnostic Eye Camp

As stated in previous reports, diagnostic eye camps were started from beginning. This year we organised 131 diagnostic camps. Total 20,080 patients have been checked & from them 2613 patients have been operated. This year we have started giving spectacles as per demand of the patients by fitting at camp site itself. Looking to good response to camps, we organised additional camps in winter. This year we have started post-operative refraction after 1½ months of surgery at the camp site and giving spectacles free of cost in addition to free medicines for operated patients.

Facility of two way transportation in 40 seater bus, surgery, post-operative medicines & spectacles and lodging boarding for the patient & one relative is provided totally free. Due to this facility and quality of work, the patient response is good from beginning.

The donors are also coming forward to support the camp activity. This year Tribal Subplan - Mandvi; Hari OM Seva trust - Vadodara; Dena bank - Mandvi, Ramnarayan Chandak of Surat Maheshwari Samaj; Bahadursinh Chauhan & Aravindbhai Bhatt from Kosamba; Bachubhai Patel from Utiyadara; Sargam Builders - Surat; Vision Foundation of India - Mumbai; Kakrapar Atomic Power Station, Omprakashji Tuteja from Surat & Rotary club of Surat, Lions Club of Surat Silk City as well as Rotary Club of Gurrock-Scotland sponsored camps.

We conducted 13 special camps for diabetic retinopathy in Mandvi block last year. These camps were sponsored by Tribal sub plan - Mandvi. Upon request of Dr Ashok Gohil, one such camp was organised at Kevadiya colony Rajjipla, Dist. Narmada.

Netrang and Jhankhvav CHC Activities:

Daily OPD is being handled by our ophthalmic assistant & surgery is done on every Tuesday & Friday regularly by surgeon visiting from Mandvi. We are taking order for tailor-made spectacles at Jhankhvav CHC also now in addition to Netrang Centre.

From this year we have provided telemedicine facility at Netrang CHC by installing Closed Circuit TV Camera on slit lamp, non mydriatic fundus camera & Computers there. Now, Ophthalmologist sitting in Mandvi will diagnose the patient sitting in Netrang Clinic.

5 camps at Netrang CHC & 4 camps at Jhankhvav CHC also have been organised and operations have been done at the OT of Netrang & Jhankhvav CHC only.

The working of Netrang & Jhankhvav is shown on Page 9 of this report.

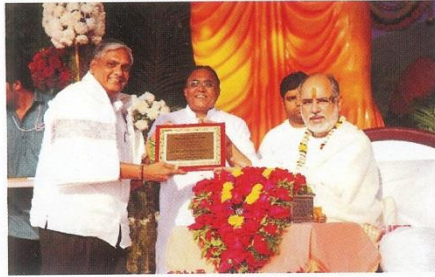

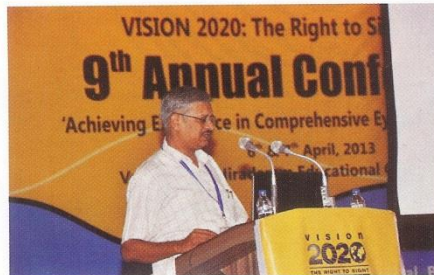

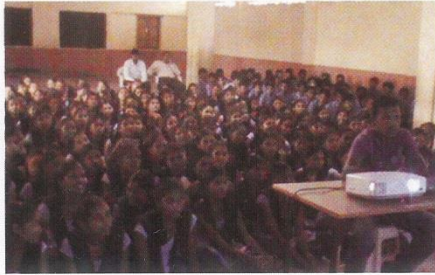

Community Based Rehabilitation Programme (CBR)



CBR Programme started from Apr.' 12 in Mandvi Taluka will be completed in Dec.' 14. From Jan.' 15, we have Planned to start CBR Programme in Umarpada & Mangrol Taluka of Surat Dist. During CBR activity in Mandvi taluka, we met blind People & helped them. For blind children we have started hostel facility in Mandvi town. School screening programme in Mandvi Taluka has been carried out successfully. Statistical data of which is given on page 23.

Door to door screening for diabetes of 40+ individuals was carried out in whole Mandvi taluka probably first time in India. Tribal Subplan - Mandvi provided finance to organise Diabetic Retinopathy screening camps throughout the block. We tried to help diabetic patients get free medicines from government hospitals. Dr. Rohanbhai & Ajendra participated in Diabetic Retinopathy situational analysis survey conducted by Public Health Foundation of India, Hyderabad between Nov.'13 to Jan. '14.

A get to gather of Asha workers of Mandvi Taluka was organised on 10th May to inform them about the activity of hospital. World handicapped day was celebrated on 3rd Dec. & a meeting with handicapped people who want to start vocational activity was arranged in the afternoon.

Kailashben was sent to Andh Kanya Prakash Gruh, Ahmedabad and Two blind girls Parul & Ranta were sent to Surendranagar - C. U. Shah Pragnyachakshu Bhavan for academic activities. A young man from Kim Dunga will be sent to Tatawadi, Fansa for agricultural training soon.

Vivekananda Pragnya Chakshu Bhavan (Hostel for Blind Children)

During our rehabilitation Programme in Mandvi taluka, we identified 115 incurably blind people including 12 Children. Looking to the social & economical condition of these children, we realised that if these Children are kept at their home only, they won't be able to study because nobody will take care of them. So we thought of providing them residential facility with nutritious food twice a day & proper guidance for education, then the life of these children can be changed. The thought of the hostel originated from this idea. This was new experience for us, so we decided to start the hostel facility for ten children but finally we got 14 Children ready to stay in hostel. Shri Snehalbhai Shah of Mandvi village came forward and allowed us to use his 2 storied house as hostel for blind children free of cost. We are very much thankful to him. One of our CBR workers agreed to take the responsibility as a rector which is a difficult job.

From June 2013, hostel became functional. Admission for these 14 Children in regular school of Andhatri Village was secured. They Study with other sighted students during school hours and in evening, learn Braille for one hour as well as Music & Computers. We have purchased computer & installed talking software speciality designed for the blind. One young BCA student of Mandvi College regularly comes in evening to teach computer.

All Blind Children of our hostel, participated in District level Khel Mahakumbh of Gujarat government at Vyara. They won prizes in "running" & "Chakraphenk"! 3 Children who won first prize went on to state level competition held at Palanpur for the same and Himmatnagar for singing. Thus self confidence of these children is improving.

During field visits, we met Manisha & Amisha living as blind. After detailed investigation, we realised that Manisha is blind due of cataract & Amisha is blind due to retinal problem and will be cured in our hospital. After counselling & assistance for the cataract surgery & retina treatment, both the girls regained useful vision. Manisha is a low vision child & can see with the help of low vision optical aids. Amisha is able to see with spectacles.

33 children participated in the workshop organised in summer vacation between 3rd to 8th June -learnt Braille, music and enjoyed a picnic to Kevdi forest, musical evening & self cooking. Blind girl Shweta has been sent to "Surat Andhjan Shala" for her regular Study.

Overall development of village Peterkui & Pipalvan

Surat Manav Seva Sangh "Chhayando" has adopted two villages of Mandvi taluka- Peterkui & Pipalvan to conduct overall development activity. Financial support to repair the hand pumps on bore wells was provided; submersible pumps & motors were given to arrange for drinking water. School uniform & kit were distributed to the students of both the villages. On the occasion of Diwali, "Chhayando" distributed sweets to approx. eighty poor families of surrounding villages. One student is given, interest free loan for her study.

Staff welfare activity :-

To develop family ties among staff members, continuous efforts are being made. On 22nd may, staff get to gather with family members was organised followed by cultural programme. Picnic for staff children to Dumas seashore & funfair at Surat was organised.



Diwali & Sharad Purnima were celebrated. Sweets & gift presented to all staff members on Diwali by our President. All the staff members are provided subsidised food in the community kitchen. One picnic is organised once a year for staff & family members.

Largely all the activities done by Divyajoyti trust are dependent on donations as nearly 75% of the work is done totally free of cost and the rest is heavily subsidised.

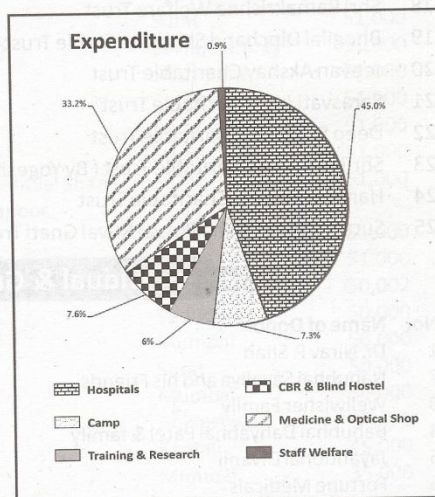
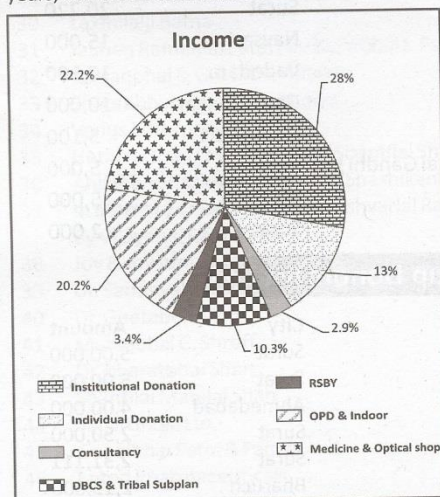
Total expenditure for the last year including all the activities came to Rs. 280 lacs. Of which Rs. 254 lacs were spent on recurring expenses and Rs. 30 lacs were spent on non-recurring expenses (Rs. 8 lacs on vehicles swift & two wheelers and Rs. 30 lacs for equipments).

Direct patient income (OPD & Indoor) is Rs. .57 lacs (20.2%). Surplus generated from Medical & Optical store is Rs.3.38 Lacs (1.2%). Govt. grant through DBCS and RSBY scheme (insurance scheme for BPL families) adds good support. Tribal subplan, Mandvi also provides support for diagnostic eye camps in tribal areas and this year, they supported Diabetic retinopathy camps also. Total support from different dept. of Govt. comes to another 13.7%.

All the rest of the funds come from Individual and institutional donors. Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando) takes care of total expenditure of the kitchen- a big help. In addition Lilavati R. Shah medical relief trust, Taraben Patel Charitable Trust, Yashvantbhai Patel (Combat Blindness Foundation), Pentagon Charitable Trust, ONGC and many other organisations provided generous support. Diagnostic camps and surgeries were sponsored by Sargam builders, Maheshwari Samaj, Hari Om Seva Trust, Vision Foundation of India and Kosamba group.

We sincerely appreciate each and every donor and the smallest contribution made towards the activities. There are many individuals and institutions who have provided support in kind and we appreciate that too. Some people have given their time and energy towards supporting the activities and that is also appreciated here.

Now, we have received clearance to receive foreign donations under FCRA and so we will be able to accept foreign donations also. We are sure, the unconditional support which has flown in over three years, will continue in future also.

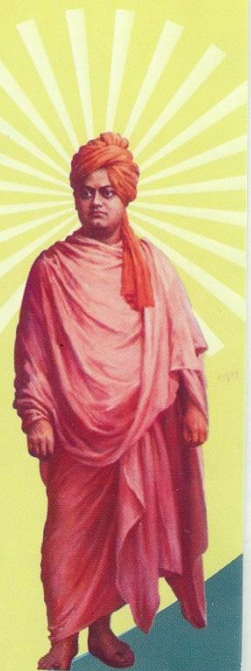

They talk of patriotism. I believe in patriotism, and I also have my own ideal of patriotism. Three things are necessary for great achievements. First, feel from the heart. What is in the intellect or reason? It goes a few steps and there it stops. But through the heart comes inspiration. Love opens the most impossible gates; love is the gate to all the secrets of the universe. Feel, therefore, my would-be reformers, my would-be patriots! Do you feel? Do you feel that millions and millions of the descendants of gods and of sages have become next-door neighbours to brutes? Do you feel that millions are starving today, and millions have been starving of ages? Do you feel that ignorance has come over the land as a dark cloud? Does it make you restless? Does it make you sleepless? Has it gone into your blood, coursing through your veins, becoming consonant with your heartbeats? Has it made you almost mad? Are you seized with that one idea of the misery of ruin and have you forgotten all about your name, your fame, your wives, your children, your property, even your own bodies? Have you done that? That is first step to become a patriot, the very first step.
