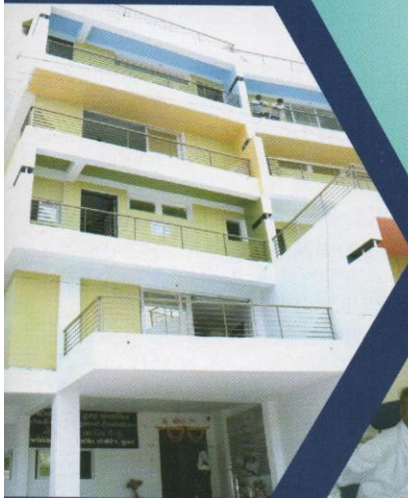
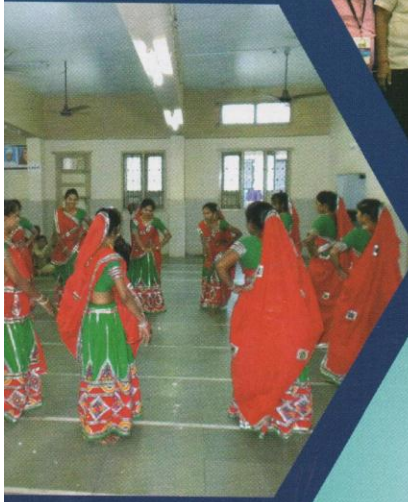

From Blissful Drizzles to Overwhelming Downpours

Through Divyajyoti Trust, when we resolved to establish an eye hospital in Mandvi area, we were aware of the scarcity of eye-care facilities in the area. Also, there was an experience of 20 years in the field of eye-care, especially in rural areas. Hence, with 40 bedded hospital, we ensured coverage of all eye diseases. On the day of inauguration, 22nd May, 2011, the invitees, well-wishers and donors present there indulged in cool drizzles in the middle of hot summer. This appeared to be celestial approval through blissful sprinkles.

On the next day itself, with the massive response to Mega Eye Camp, it was very clear that the community was in serious need of eye-care. The vehicles received on day one - 40-seater bus and jeep started commuting for promotion of camp activities and transportation of patients. Facility of community kitchen was added with the financial help of 'Chhayando' for patients and their relatives, staff and students.

Among the ophthalmologists, Dr. Rohan, Dr. Sheetal & Dr. Kamini joined us in the beginning as general ophthalmologists. Other consultants offered their services regularly once or twice a month. As Dr. Khushboo, the retina specialist joined us from 12th January 2012, the ratio of patients with retinal diseases increased. Dr. Meena Doshi, the glaucoma specialist visited from Mumbai once a month in the beginning, was busy with so many patients; she couldn't even get a tea-break. Considering the circumstances, we sent Dr. Sheetal to H.V. Desai eye Institute, Pune, to be trained in glaucoma management. Now she handles the glaucoma department. Dr. Rohan was the in-charge for corneal treatment from the start. Additionally, Dr. Rohan Thakkar from Surat and Dr. Sonia Kothari from Mumbai started visiting. Work increased substantially and we started Cornea Fellowship. Dr. Bakul Trivedi, the visiting consultant & our trustee – now accompanied by Dr. Saureen Gandhi & now Dr. Parth Joshi – are managing oculoplasty patients. Dr. Nitin Jain visited once a month as a paediatric ophthalmologist. Now that Dr. Chintan Mehta has joined full-time for the same, number of paediatric OPD and operative patients has also increased substantially. In addition, Dr. Tanuja Rakhe, the neuro ophthalmologist from Surat visits us twice in a month.

Regular service by proficient doctors to treat most of the eye diseases, latest technology for flawless management, availability of sincere, honest & hard working paramedical workers– all these factors got aligned & within five years, Tejas Eye Hospital became a benchmark for eye treatment in southern Gujarat.

Doctors' training, fellowships, research on eye diseases and trainings for paramedical workers such as vision technician, ophthalmic nurse, OT boy and optical fitting are also running smoothly.

Alongside curative work, we are involved in rehabilitation of incurably blind persons also. We undertook Rehab. project in Mandvi block between Apr.'12 to Dec.'14. From Jan.'15, Mangrol & Umarpada blocks were taken up. We achieved the international XOVA Award for implementing an innovative idea of checks for glaucoma, diabetes & blood-pressure along with door to door blindness survey in these blocks.

We also established a Hostel in Mandvi for the blind children from poverty-stricken families. They live in hostel & learn to become self-dependent to lead a proud, fulfilling life as modest citizens.

Beside eye care for the unprivileged, we are an environment-friendly institute. During the construction of the new building, we installed green features, such as rainwater harvesting, use of recycled water, use of reclaimed wood, iron and kota stone, max. use of solar power etc. We became the first platinum rated eye hospital of the country and 1st such building in Surat district under Indian Green Building Council.

To sum it up, we'd like to quote a line from Narsinh Mehta's bhajan: 'અદભુત કલ્પિયો રે શામળિયો'

We're pleased to present the sixth annual report before you!

While speaking of the time period of initial five years, i.e., May 2011 to May 2016, we started with the bed-count of 40 which reached to 100. Thanks to highly advanced technology for diagnosis & treatment of almost all eye diseases, proficient practitioners, well-trained staff & apt counseling, Tejas Eye Hospital has gained good reputation.

In June 2015, the new building, constructed on the back-side of hospital was inaugurated. We shifted the Eye Bank, Administrative Office, Kitchen, Library, Dormitory, Guest House & Conference Room over there, which created more space for patients in the Hospital building. On top of it, we could even allot 19 quarters for staff-members in new building. From April 2015 - March 2016, total 10446 surgeries were performed.

Along with eye care, we also took the necessary steps for saving the environment & the new building received Platinum Award from IGBC. As the structure of its kind was the first in Surat that received such an award & most notably, the first Eye Hospital in India to receive it, the trust was quite honored.

Apart from eye-care facilities, even the training centre is doing quite an impressive work. There, training facilities for paramedical workers & doctors is available. All the four trainees from last year have got decent jobs for the work of vision technician. Due to all the facilities of eye-care available, even research work is smoothly taking place. Apart from it, the CBR (Community Based Rehabilitation) programme & Hostel for blind children below 12 years- both are functioning perfectly.

All these activities are mostly dependent on donations, which we keep receiving from like-minded well-wishers & the course of action goes on. At this significant stage, we're heartily thankful to all our donors, having full faith in them for future in contributing for this humanitarian task.

Last year itself a philanthropic couple donated a piece of land in the outskirts of Mandvi. We aim to develop it to extend more services within upcoming five years. We're confident about your support for the same.

The year at a glance

The most important event this year was the inauguration of new building constructed in the backside of Hospital. As suggested by our prime donor, Shree Piyushbhai Kothari from Jewalex India Pvt. Ltd., the inauguration of 'Smt. Chandraben Piyushbhai Kothari Netrajyoti Talim Kendra' took place on 7th June. Main donors, numerous Government officers & well-wishers were present during this significant event. Also, revered Swamiji Shree Sarvasthanandji, the chief of Ramkrishna Mission- Rajkot, blessed us by his presence & performing the inauguration. However, some minor construction was left which we completed first & after "Shanti Om" – puja to the Almighty, allotted the quarters to staff members on 1st July to 19 staff members.

The idea of Green Building was followed since the designing stage of the new Building. As a part of it, an underground storage tank (2 lac liters capacity) was built to harvest the rainwater. The waste water from bathrooms & kitchen is recycled & reused for flushing. We built the entire building using Kota Stone, Glass & reclaimed wood – strictly avoiding use of plastic & tiles. We also installed solar water heater to avail hot water in quarters. We also installed Biogas Plant to generate cooking gas out of kitchen & toilet waste. Thus, as every aspect of a standard green building was carefully followed, we registered the trust in IGBC (Indian Green Building Council). The inspection officers from IGBC visited the Building in June & as the building met the criteria, it received 'Platinum Award' from IGBC. As the structure of its kind was the first in Surat that received such an award & most notably, the first Eye Hospital in India to receive it, the trust was quite honored. We sincerely appreciate whole hearted honorary services provided by Shri Amitsinh Vaghela for green movement.

As hospital completed four years on 22nd May, a number of events were organized. On 17th May, a get-together of diabetic patients of Mandvi, Umarpada & Mangrol was organized - 42 patients attended & Dr. Manish Kangrecha, renowned physician from Mandvi, educated them on diabetes & Dr. Rohan along with Shree Manish Jagani acquainted them with diabetic retinopathy.

On 22nd we performed Ganesh puja as usual. On the Sunday morning of 24th, a get-together of our well-wishers from camp & the patients with corneal transplant was attended by Dr. Prafulbhai Shiroya from Lokdrashti Eye Bank- Surat & Dr. Rishikumar Mathur, Chief ophthalmologist from District Blindness Control Society – Surat. In the evening of the same day, a get-together of our staff members along with their families was held, followed by a cultural event.

This year, we introduced two new courses in our Training Programme- a 1-year course for Vision Technician & a 1-year course for ophthalmic nursing assistant. 6 students registered for the course of Vision Technician & 4 for ophthalmic nursing assistant. Out of which, 4 male students completed their training. Due to uninformed absenteeism & in one case, due to family issues, no female student could complete the nursing training. All the students who finished their training as Vision Technician have already got a job.

Shree Vijaybhai & Smt. Nipunaben Daliya our well-wisher & donor - decided to donate a piece of land in Amalsadi village - 4 kms from Mandvi for hospital's expansion. On 16th Aug., their respected spiritual mentor Rev. Shree Jeenchandravijayji Maharaj announced this at Tithal, Dist. Valsad.



As Divyajyoti Trust has the permission for Eye Bank, so we established the facilities of the same in the new training centre. We also collaborated with Lokdrashti Eye Bank & by acquiring the eyes received there, now we can conduct more surgeries of corneal transplant. We inaugurated the Eye Bank on 28th August & honored the families who donated the eyes of their loved ones. We also handed over tokens to them which will allow them for free eye-checks in Tejas eye Hospital.

The new operation theatre at Netrang CHC built by the Govt. was inaugurated by chief minister Smt. Anandiben Patel on 17th September. Now, our work has regained its previous momentum. Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority approved the grant for equipments for Glaucoma Clinic, so the purchase for the same was done. So now, considering all the equipments, we have at the hospital, Tejas Eye Hospital can be considered one of the foremost eye hospitals in Gujarat. As the grant for a better execution of 'Diabetic Retinopathy Project' was approved by Lions Club International, we also bought a microscope. Apart from that, 'Aravind Mafatlal Foundation' – the CSR body of M/S Naveen Flourine International Ltd., approved grant for equipments for couple of vision centers - Umarpada & Dediypada Vision Centers have been established.

Sightsavers International requested Divyajyoti Trust to send their team for the survey of Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness (RAAB) in Jhabua dist. in Madhya Pradesh. So, a team consisting of one Doctor, paramedical workers, data entry operator & one driver were sent for the same. However, first they were sent for the training in Lucknow, U.P. During the survey, the staff got to experience the true plights of backward localities. The stark poverty that exists in that part of the country was really appealing to one & all.

Dr. Swapnil Pachchigar joined the team of AIIMS (Delhi) for a national survey – the modified RAAB survey in Vardha Dist. Maharashtra & Kheda Dist. Gujarat.

Professor Ravichandran from IIM Ahmedabad was kind enough to accept our invitation to study & evaluate the four-year progress of Divyajyoti Trust. He had several discussions with the core team to understand the process of trust. Now, he will prepare a report on the same which will be helpful as a study-tool for management student.

It was necessary to establish orderliness in-&-out of the hospital. We installed shoe-recks for patients, their relatives & any other people visiting the hospital. We also hired some people to maintain token system for the same. This seemingly little gesture has changed the outlook of the entrance & the neatness reflects our approach.

Joy for the Family

Ranjanben Sureshbhai Rathod is a 42-year old native of a village called Kholeshvar, From Kamrej-Surat. She came to the Shampura camp & in the check-up; both her eyes were diagnosed with cataract. So, we brought her to Mandvi in the hospital's bus. She didn't know anything about Cataract & so she was scared of the operation. So we explained everything to her. After proper counseling, she agreed to undergo the surgery.

After the operation of both the eyes one-by-one, Ranjanben could finally see clearly now. Since last five months she couldn't see at all, which made her feel so helpless. Even the family members had to look after her all the time. But now that she has got her vision back, she can even help out in household chores. Following which, the financial conditions of the house have improved.

Thus, when the housewife gets her vision back, happiness returns to the family.



Hospital Activities

As there's not a single eye-care facility in the periphery of Mandvi in a radius of 100 kms & meanwhile just in five years, Tejas Eye Hospital has gained recognition with its humanitarian activities, more & more localities are gaining benefits of the hospital facility.

This year, more than 1000 surgeries were performed just in the month of December – this happened for the first time in our history. Work continued at the same pace in January & February as well. The administrative office, kitchen & library were shifted in new building after its inauguration on 7th June, 2015. More beds were arranged in old kitchen & library. As we arranged it to be 100 beds, in January we could host more than 100 patients. On 25th January, 69 surgeries were performed again our highest number. Total 10,446 operations were performed by the end of the year.

From this year, we also arranged Day-care ward for the affluent class of patients coming from surrounding areas. Within which, sofas, chairs, TV, AC & tea-snacks would be provided to patient & relatives. With this facility, patient can undergo surgery in the morning & leave in the evening. We also purchased food heaters to provide warm food to patients.

We have also kept fire-safety equipments in hospital. During the year, there was a fire eruption due to short circuit BUT due to awareness of one of patient's relative, we could avoid major disaster. Once a patient had cardiac arrest due to decreased sugar level; BUT the patient was revived by doing CPR by our trained nurse. Thus, regular trainings keep giving fruitful results.

We could buy the equipments for Ocular Prosthesis through donation of the family trust of Shri Jashvantbhai Mehta from Mumbai. These equipments are useful in making artificial eye for the patients who have lost their eye. Color, shape & structure are customized on the basis of patient's requirement. Till now we've made one such eye. However, the patient wasn't comfortable using it. One of our ophthalmic assistants (Alpesh Mistry) was given the training of Ocular Prosthesis for the same.

Additional field work was also done for the patients who had been to eye-camps & undergone surgery. We asked them about their vision & details regarding their spectacles. All the data was collected & organized properly.

During the year, we bought the following equipments in hospital:

A Scan, Hand-held Keratometer, Fundus Camera with Auto refractor, HRT Machine, I-care Tonometer, Ultrasound Biomicroscope, OMS 710 surgical microscope & Slit Lamp.

No More Hatred

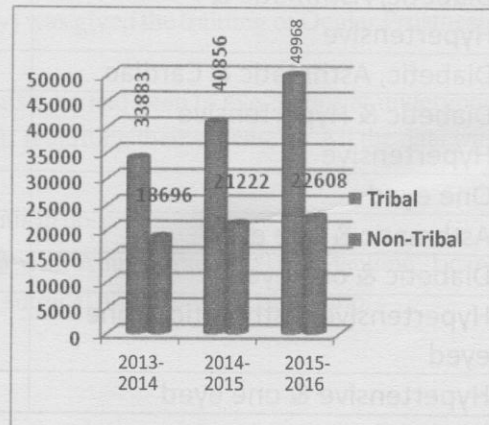
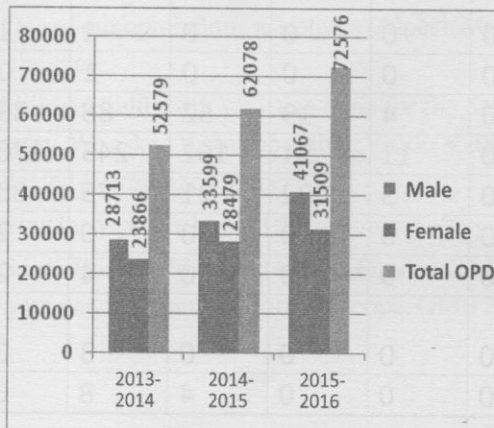
Arjunbhai Gheliyabhai Vasava (Age- 50), a native of Kamaliya village, Netrang, lost his left eye due to an injury in childhood. Almost three months ago, he underwent a cataract surgery in his right eye in some nearby eye-hospital. For one month, he had a clear vision but afterwards it got blurry & eventually blocked entirely. So he went for a check-up in Netrang CHC & from there he was referred to Tejas Eye Hospital.

Arjunbhai was guided by his friend as by then he couldn't see with both his eyes. We informed them that he had a problem in retina & thus will require a surgery of Retinal Detachment. At first, Arjunbhai was scared to undergo the surgery, but after some persuasion & assurance, he agreed. When he could see again after the surgery, he shed tears of happiness. He saw his wife & son after two months. He was so happy. When he lost his vision, his wife went for labor-work & son stayed home to take care of him. But now as he can see up to 1 meter, he can do his work on his own, much to the relief of his wife & son.

As he had lost his eye-sight in a few weeks after the surgery, Arjunbhai had lost all faith in hospitals; in fact, he had started hating them. But after the experience with Tejas Eye Hospital & the homely treatment by staff, not to mention his regained vision, he is very content today & wishes his best to Tejas Eye Hospital for future progress.

Specialty Clinic

Specialists for glaucoma, retinal diseases, corneal diseases, as well as pediatric ophthalmologists are available full time. Apart from it, as the oculoplasty surgeon & neuro-ophthalmologist visits once or twice in a month, the number of OPD in speciality clinics often exceeds 100, which reflects the needs.

The statistics of specialty clinic are given in Table -6.

Glaucoma Clinic

Dr. Minaben Doshi looked after the Glaucoma patients in the beginning; we had realised that the need is much more. So Dr. Shital went to Pune for a short term fellowship in Glaucoma & now, she is working as our Glaucoma Specialist. Additionally, Dr. Kaivanbhai Shah has joined us in March 2016 as Glaucoma consultant; the task of aiding Glaucoma patients has become easier. On 29th Dec., 2015, camp was organized for glaucoma screening.

During the Glaucoma week, i.e., 6th to 12th Mar., free checkup for glaucoma & treatment at 50% rates were offered, basic information about Glaucoma was provided through TV Interview & pamphlets were prepared & distributed. Every night sessions were conducted in rural areas for health education.

Cornea Clinic

Corneal blindness is quite common in our service area making cornea clinic a very important activity of the hospital. Initially, Dr. Bijalben Mehta & Dr. Prakashbhai Nayak from Mumbai took care of cornea patients. Presently, apart from Dr. Rohan, Dr. Rohan Thakkar, Dr. Soniyaben Kothari & Dr. Pratikbhai Topiwala look after the Cornea Clinic. This year, Dr. Darshan Kalaigar joined us as a cornea fellow in July for one year.

This year, 117 Corneal Transplants were performed. We also started doing special type Rose K contact lenses. Cornea Screening Camp was held in February. Pamphlet on laymen education about corneal transplant has been prepared.

Oculoplasty Clinic

Dr. Bakulbhai Trivedi & Dr. Saureen Gandhi visit once in a month & manage the oculoplasty patients. Apart from that, Dr. Parth Joshi looks after them.

Eye Care for Children

Right from the start, Dr. Nitinbhai Jain comes once in a month to look after paediatric clinic. As Dr. Chintan Mehta has joined us as a full-time pediatric consultant from Oct. 15, the work of eye care for children has increased.

We also organized a Camp for squint on 16/10 & a camp for children's eye check on 24//11.

We performed a cataract surgery on an eight-months old baby & operated a child with Retinoblastoma. We also conducted school screening in two schools in Dang.

Neuro Ophthalmology

Since last three years, Dr. Tanujaben Rakhe visits twice a month to treat the patients of neuro ophthalmology.



Ocular Prosthesis Clinic

As Shree Jashvantbhai Mehta from Mumbai sponsored the equipments & training for ocular prosthesis, we began with the process. So far we have made one prosthetic eye.

Low Vision Clinic

The equipments are available for this clinic & Dr. Rohanbhai manages low vision patients.

Retina Clinic

Since May 2011, Dr. Amishbhai Patel & Dr. Madhviben Sheth visited regularly for retinal surgeries. As these treatments are quite expensive & uncommon, we have patients coming from distant locations.

As Dr. Shilpaben went for training in June, Dr. Bhavinbhai Patel, Dr. Khushbooben Doctor, Dr. Saket Saradhiya & Dr. Heli Shah came in turns & looked after these patients. After getting trained for Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP), Dr. Shilpaben started visiting Dharampur and Kharel twice in a month to screen new born babies for ROP. Laser & Avastin Injections are used for the treatment of these babies.

As the patients with Retinal problems have increased, second retina specialist, Dr. Iraben has also joined us from March 16.

A Diabetic retinopathy screening camp was organized on 29th Sept. '15. Diabetic retinopathy screening was conducted at the hospital, in Retina Clinic, in camps & by Rehabilitation workers throughout the year; the details of which are given in the tables given below.

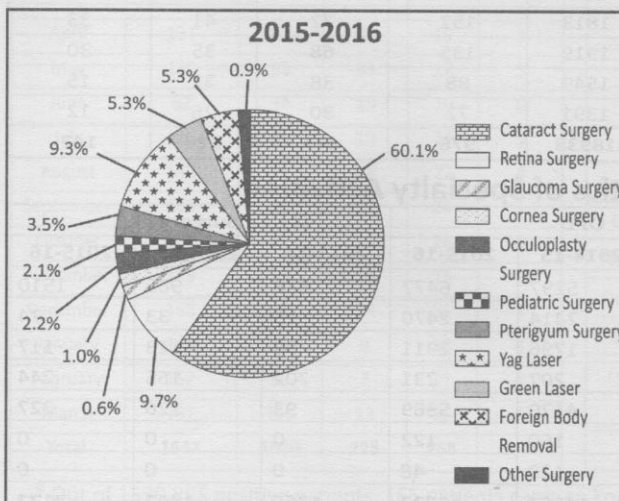
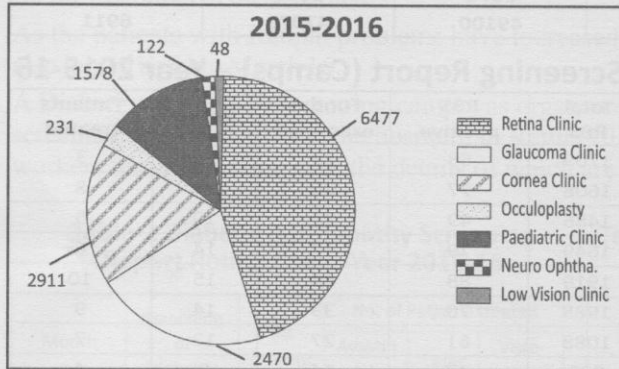

Godavariben Dudhat a 70 year old lady from Surat-near Bombay Market is from a well off family. Her son & daughter-in-law brought her to the hospital. She was diagnosed to have damaged Cornea in both the eyes, requiring corneal transplant. They were told to come back for surgery once we procure cornea from Hyderabad.

As the patient was quite aged, we arranged for an anesthetist also & performed the surgery for corneal transplant. After the operation when bandage was removed, Godavariben exclaimed, "Oh is it my eye!" Her eyes were filled with tears of joy when she saw her grandson. She kissed his face & said, "Look at you, all grown up!"

Godavariben couldn't see since last six years. They had gone for checkup in other hospitals. But nobody gave them assurance for vision. Now that she can see, she performs her daily activities on her own. Because of losing her sight, Godavariben had lost all joys from life but now she is motivated to live more & spend a happy life with her family.

Who Shall Restrain the Evil of Alcoholism?

Anjali a three years old child had developed infection in her right eye due to fall of foreign body. Her Parents & aunt brought her to Mandvi Hospital.

They had come in the evening, so we immediately called for the anesthetist & removed the foreign body. On the following day, after the checkup we realised that she needs to be under observation for couple of days, so we kept her admitted. Anjali's mother & aunt stayed with her, but both were alcoholics, so both had some liquor & fell asleep. After some time, the impact receded a little for the aunt, but none of the two looked after Anjali. Therefore, Nursing staff & another staff member looked after Anjali. As both the women were drunk, we called Anjali's father but unfortunately even he was drunk. No one could listen to our requests or understand anything. So, our phone call was attended by his friend but some miscommunication occurred & the father came with an auto and took Anjali home without listening to our requests to stay back for a couple of days.

On the following day, they came for follow up but when we told them about the dire need of the operation, left without taking note of our requests. Since then, they don't even answer the call. Due to severe infection, Anjali can't see from her right eye. The consequences may even lead to her losing the right eye. Because of this addiction of both her parents, life of the little girl is likely to become pitiable. But it seems impossible to get rid of or even control this addiction. The attempts for the same are done in several places- some even leading to success- but they don't last for long. What can be done?

Consultancy & Evaluation Process

Dr. Udaybhai is involved in the evaluation of several hospitals across the country funded by organisations such as Sightsavers, Mission for Vision, Wonder work etc. As a part of it, he evaluated Tulsi Chenrai Eye Hospital- Nasik, Mathur Eye Clinic- Meerut - Uttar Pradesh, Ramkrishna Mission Hospital- Itanagar- Arunachal Pradesh, Bansara Eye Care Clinic- Shilong - Meghalaya, Vivekanand Mission Ashram- Chaitanyapur- West Bengal, Singhi Eye Hospital- Peelani – Rajasthan, evaluation of infrastructure in Chittaur - Rajasthan. Apart from this, due to special request from organisations, Dr. Udaybhai also clinically evaluated Shankar Foundation Eye Hospital- Vishakhapattanam (Andhra Pradesh), Shamlaji Community Health Centre. Dr. Rohan performed the situational analysis in Chittaur dist., Rajasthan on behalf of Sightsavers. Dr. Rohanbhai went to Bhopal to give the basic idea of OT Protocol to practitioners from MP government.

Doctors of Divyajyoti Trust regularly participate in the Mega Eye Camp held in Bihar every year. This year, Dr. Jagruti Jariwala, Dr. Darshan Kansara, Dr. Akash Shah, Dr. Swapnil Pachchigar &



Dr. Upasana Patel participated around Diwali & Holi.

Dr. Udaybhai participated as a consultant in the IOL manufacturing advisory meeting by Cipla Company. On 23/11, he had a meeting with Health Commissioner for preparing Action plan for Gujarat State. He also participated in the meeting of technical consultants of Vision Foundation of India- Mumbai as Technical Advisor.

Research Activity

Clinical Study

1. We studied the impact of central corneal thickness on intraocular pressure while using noncontact tonometer & Goldman applanation method to measure intraocular pressure in people from tribal areas of Surat district.
2. We did a comparative study of four different tonometers for measuring intraocular pressure - Goldman Applanation, tonopen, rebound & air puff tonometer.
3. Study of epidemiological & microbiological diagnosis of fungal keratitis in tribal areas of Surat.
4. Outcomes of corneal transplant done by us in tribal areas of South Gujarat.
5. Types of Glaucoma in tribal areas of Surat & clinical profile for the same.
6. Door to door screening of diabetes, blood pressure, glaucoma & diabetic retinopathy in two tribal blocks of Surat district of Gujarat.

On the basis of the clinical study shown above, we prepared various scientific papers/physical posters/ e posters & presented them in number of annual conferences.

- All India Ophthalmological Annual Conference, Kolkata
- Annual Conference of Gujarat Ophthalmological Society, Anand
- Annual conference of Delhi Ophthalmological Society.
- Physical posters for studies no. 1-2-6 are accepted for the 10th general assembly of International Association of Prevention of Blindness (IAPB), Durban (South Africa).

Survey as part of the Research

The team of Divyajyoti Trust conducted a survey for Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Blindness (RAAB) in Jhabua district of Madhya Pradesh. They also gathered information about the socio-economic conditions of locality, the usage of spectacles & the reasons for not wearing them. This district consists of hilly areas & residents are quite scattered. 90% population is of tribal people, whose lives are dependent on meagre agricultural sources. This survey was conducted as per the suggestion of Sightsavers from 21/9/15 to 5/10/15.

This survey revealed that the prevalence of blindness is greater than national statistics. For those with the age more than 50, the prevalence of blindness was 3.2%; the commonest causes were Cataract (90%), surgical complications (5%) & corneal diseases (3.6%). The cataract surgical rate



was only 48% (eyes) & 57% (person). The main barriers to surgery were - need not felt & financial scarcity.

This survey proved to be an eye opener for our team members, giving us a chance to understand the problems of interior rural areas in poor states. This will increase empathy for the poor people in the minds of our team members.

Withered Childhood Blossomed Again

Arif Sardar is the resident of Hathoda, Mangrol- Dist. Surat. He earns his living by selling coconuts. His five year old daughter Ruksarbi was blind since birth due to Congenital Cataract, due to which, the little girl couldn't play with other children of her age. She won't even talk much, just played all by herself. But now after getting operated, she plays with other kids & has become a happy child. She even talks to other people. Her confidence has increased; hence, now she'll go to school as well.

A year ago the parents of Ruksar took her to some other hospital for check-up. But because of the expenses, they couldn't get her operated. In Mandvi Hospital, the cataract operation was done free of cost in February on both the eyes one after the other. They are very happy. They say that Tejas Eye Hospital seems like it's built for the sake of poor people. Even the staff & doctors are very kind & a boon to the society.

Outreach Activity (Field Work)

Camp

The main objective of setting up Divyajyoti Trust was to make sure that people from internal rural areas get the eye care services at their doorstep. Hence, the diagnostic camps activity started even before the inauguration of the Hospital. We gained recognition because of camp-organisation and the treatment given to the needy patients. Hence, day-by-day the number of camps and beneficiaries is increasing. This year we held 163 Diagnose camps in total, where we examined 26646 patients & performed 4224 operations.

Apart from the Cataract diagnosis camp, we started with speciality camps on last Tuesday of every month at Mandvi Base Hospital. Diagnostic camps for various diseases like Glaucoma, Diabetic Retinopathy, Squint, paediatric patients, Cornea Screening etc. were organised. The details are given along with the table of performance of Speciality Clinics.

For the camp activities, constant support is extended from Vision Foundation of India- Mumbai, Hari Om Sewa Trust- Vadodara, Sargam Group- Surat, Maheshwari Community, Terapanth Community, Tuteja Family, Ramnarayanji Chandak Family- Surat and Dr. Vikasben Desai. Additionally, every year on their respective specific date Shree Mahendra Nemchand Jhaveri, Shree Vijaybhai Daliya, Shree Rajanbhai Pandya, Urmilaben Patel, Ur-Asha Jhaveri Foundation and Shantaram Bhatt Charitable Foundation extend their share of support. Also, a mega eye camp is organised by Kakrapar Atomic Power Station every year.

Support from District Blindness Control Society on per surgery basis for various types of surgery is a significant contribution. Plus, international organisations such as Wonderwork,



Combat Blindness Foundation and Sathi Foundation have been very supportive. The statistical information on Camp activity is given in Table 10.

Netrang and Jhankhvav Satellite Centre (Public Private Partnership Project)

Divyajyoti Trust has started with the eye treatments in Netrang and Jhankhvav community Health Centres from April 2012. Government built a new operation theatre in Netrang Community Health Centre. Smt. Anandiben Patel, the chief minister inaugurated this OT and new building on 11/9/15. The surgical work was resumed immediately thereafter.

Even at Jhankhvav, regular staff was hired after a long time. Slowly and gradually the work is progressing.

Vision Centres at Dediypada and Umarpada

As we have received the grant from Aravind Mafatlal Foundation, the CSR body of Naveen Flourine Pvt. Ltd. to buy equipments to start the vision centre in Dediypada and Umarpada, the same will be launched soon.

Chorwad Satellite Centre

Nice infrastructure of Smt. Bhanuben Nanavaty Eye Hospital in Chorwad- Junagadh which was lying idle was made functional three years back by our team. We even arranged to send a doctor on deputation from January '16. However, later it was cancelled as another doctor from the same area agreed to give his service full time there. We are happy that we could make the infrastructure functional.

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Programme for Incurable Blinds

CBR programme in Mangrol and Umarpada Talukas was started in Jan.'15. Selection and training of the workers was followed by door to door survey of blindness in all 203 villages, additionally, all 40+ individuals were checked for diabetes, blood pressure and Glaucoma. Blind Foundation of India contributed for a mobile van, which has proved to be very useful. We have installed the instruments given by Devdaya Charitable Trust in the van, which helps us with the fundus photography. Such tests are done for the first time in the country. People living in rural areas are gaining benefits of this service provided at their door-steps. Due to this test, the timely diagnosis of glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy and cataract has become possible, leading to right treatment without the need for the Ophthalmologist to attend the field work. If it helps avoiding blindness at any level, this will prove to be a significant step in reducing blindness.

We found 182 incurably blind persons - 88 male and 94 female. We helped 44 of them procure blindness certificate and 33 with bus pass, 12 persons got the benefit of Sant Surdas Scheme. 32 young people received training for financial rehabilitation. 67 persons have been trained in mobility. During the process, around 1071 other handicaps were tracked. 3 blind youth were sent to Tatawadi, Fansa. They'll be trained in agricultural activities for two years and they'll be given loan for purchasing land or for equipments. Three blind young girls were sent to Surendranagar. 4 boys and girls were sent to Mogri- Anand and enrolled in Blind school over there. .

These rehabilitation workers are also doing the school screening, the statistics of which is given in Table 11.

On 3rd Dec.'15, we celebrated world handicap day, more than 200 handicaps were present. They were given information about government benefits for differently abled, guiding them to live a dignified life. Mahavir Jain Samaj- Surat provided 23 handicaps with equipments.

Vivekanand Pragnachakshu Bhavan - Hostel for Blind Children

This year total 19 children are staying in Blind children's hostel. Like every year, we planned tours for summer and Diwali Vacations. During summer vacation, we took the children to Sanjeevkumar Aquarium and Zoo in Surat. For Diwali vacation, we took them to Pavagadh - 31 children were present.

Our blind children got the opportunity to inaugurate new gym opened by local leader – Shri Bhavinbhai Mistry.

Children learn Music and computers. This year, all the kids passed the second exam of music. Just like last few years, they participated in state-organised Khel Mahakumbh and stood in top three at District level 100 meter race, long jump, sphere throw, wheel-throw, javelin throw etc. Total winnings were worth Rs. 75000/- and four children got the chance to compete at state-level. The prize money was deposited in winner child's bank account.

The expenditure of hostel is sponsored by Poddar Tyres Limited. Local donors and well-wishers often donate clothing, sweets etc. in kind also.

For blind women, C.U.Shah Blind women Sewakunj- Surendranagar is like a blessing. These blind women are trained and given the mental strength to live a normal life. We sent a young girl - Parul to Surendranagar hostel because there was no one at her house who could look after her. She learnt cooking and housekeeping there. Every year, a group-wedding ceremony takes place for these blind women. Parul was wedded this year. In such weddings, the donors provide these blind daughters with house furniture, utensils, ornaments etc. A cooking competition is also held in January each year. This year, the Blind rehabilitation workers and Parul's parents were present there.

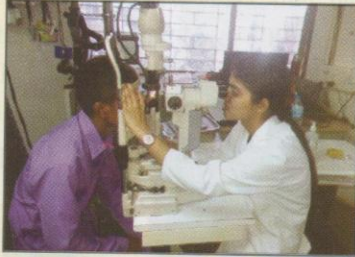

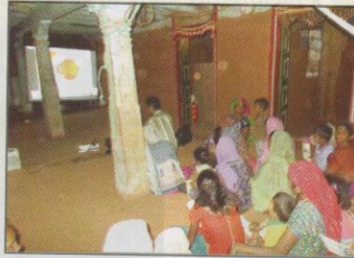

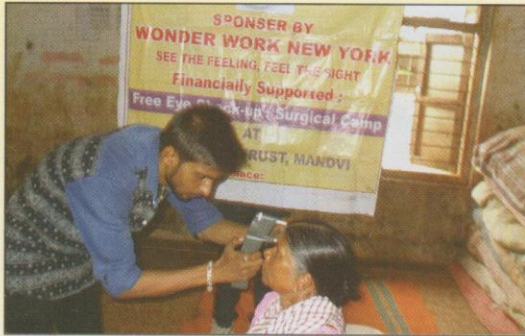

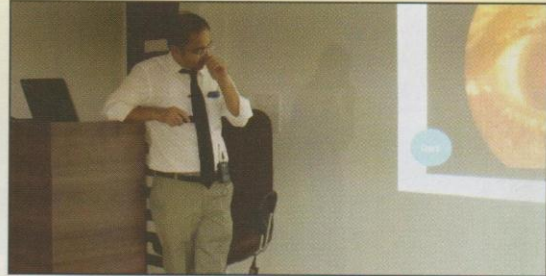

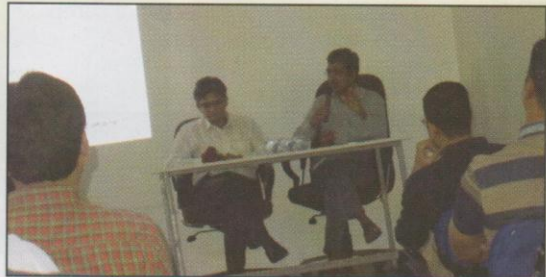

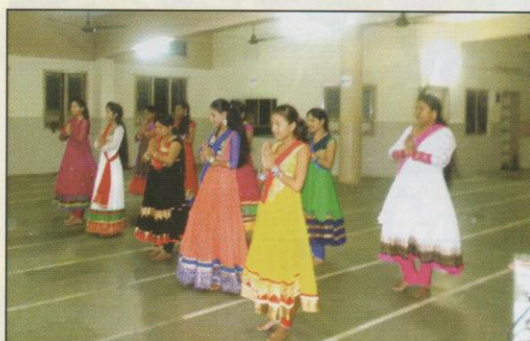

Parul got a New Life

When we started with the CBR project in Mandvi, we came in contact with a blind girl - Parul in village Areth. She wasn't blind from birth; her vision faded after the age of 19. With her parents and two married brothers, the family consists of 11 members. The elder brother died and the younger brother has mental issues; leaving no other option but petty labour work in farming for everyone.

During the execution of the project, the CBR worker trained Parul to do some household chores on her own. Also talked about C. U. Shah Pragna Chaksu Mahila Sewakunj-Surendranagar and how it worked for and trained blind women. The worker took Parul and her sister there for a visit. Parul liked this institute. She expressed her willingness to go there but there was no one in the family willing to go to Surendranagar and drop her there. When Parul told our staff, Divyajyoti Trust arranged to send her to Surendranagar.

As she got proper training for cooking and housekeeping there, Parul is very happy. Every year, a group-wedding ceremony takes place for these blind women. Parul was wedded this year. The person she married is also blind and works in a watch factory in Morbi. The organisation of Surendranagar has arranged the couple's residential and transportation facilities. This person earns 8 to 10 thousand per month. Parul is living a happy life with her husband, thankful to Divyajyoti Trust and C. U. Shah Pragna Chaksu Mahila Sewakunj.





Vision 2020 Right to Sight India (Gujarat Chapter)

Dr. Udaybhai is the president of Vision 2020 Right to Sight India (Gujarat Chapter) since last three years. After lot of attempts, we successfully got 12A registration under income tax for it. Along with Government of Gujarat, we organised a workshop to develop an action plan to reduce blindness. It took place at Civil Hospital, Gandhinagar, with the participation of 50 delegates.

Indian Medical Association (IMA- Mandvi)

Dr. Udaybhai was selected as the president of Indian Medical Association for year 15-16. As a part of the activities of IMA- Mandvi, workshops were organised on various subjects for doctors of Mandvi. The following table shows details on the same.

Peterkui and Pipalvan

Surat Manav Sewa Sangh (Chhayando) is trying for overall development in Peterkui and Pipalvan- the villages located near Mandvi, Surat since last three years. In the beginning, they made a check dam, on top of which, a bridge was built this year.

During the year, to facilitate the drinking water supply, they built two tubewells & installed engines. Also dig a well & installed diesel engine - this has enabled 8 to 10 families to grow vegetables at the door-step. They also built toilets and bathrooms as a part of Clean India Project. 10 cows were donated for economic rehabilitation of poor families.

Also built temples in both the villages; given musical instruments for common prayers. The villagers are making good use of it. During the festival of Navratri, the traditional Garba were organised for ten days. On the last day, the villagers enjoyed a meal together.

The school in the village is only till 5th grade; hence 6 children were enrolled in a school in Surat, governed by Mahajan Anath Ashram. All the children in the village were given books,



schoolbags etc. For the essential computer education, a computer room was built in Pipalvan. For the women, classes for tailoring were started.

To avoid the hefty expenses done in weddings, group wedding was organised like every year and all the daughters received gifts worth 20,000 each.

For health related issues, villagers are informed that they will get free treatment and medicines at Civil Hospital, Surat. Thus, in both the villages all the attempts for overall development are made.

Our efforts to raise Public Awareness

Constant efforts are made to spread more awareness regarding common eye diseases and eye donation. Every Saturday, we visit different villages and show them educational videos, followed by discussions. Daily at night, video is shown to the patients in the hospital on the precautions to be taken before & after operation like medicines, food and hygiene after operation – this video is prepared by us. This year, during the Eye Donation fortnight, we arranged a get-together for the family members of eye donors and inaugurated the eye-bank. Every year, 6th to 12th March is celebrated as World Glaucoma Week –this year, we had the free diagnosis of Glaucoma and treatment at 50% subsidised rates. A short talk on glaucoma was given on local TV channel by our glaucoma consultants. We also prepared a pamphlet explaining glaucoma and distributed it.

Awards and Appreciation

Of all the awards received during the year, the most important one was the 'Platinum' award from Indian Green Building Council. This award is given for taking most of the steps for environment safety in the construction of our new training centre building.

Association of Community Ophthalmologists of India honoured Dr. Udaybhai Gajiwala with ACOIN award, handed over in Lucknow by the Governor of UP, Shree Ram Naik. Dr. Udaybhai received this year's COSI award named after Dr. G Venkatswamy by Community Ophthalmology Society of India. Also, Rotary Club of Surat main honoured Dr. Udaybhai with a plaque for humanitarian work in rural tribal area.

Staff Welfare

- As a part of Diwali celebration and on the foundation day on 22nd May, we had a family get-together. Staff children enjoyed fire crackers during diwali. The President distributed clothes and sweets to all the staff members on the eve of diwali.
- A tour to Bharuch Kabirvad, Swaminarayan Temple and Nilkantheshwar Mahadev was arranged for staff with family.
- 19 semi furnished Staff Quarters with hot water facility were allotted.
- Uniforms, books & notebooks were distributed to staff children as educational aid.



Staff Development

- We take the staff members to various organisations dedicated to social work every year. This year, we arranged the educational tour to Bhavnagar located organisation *Shaishav* which works for children rights, PNR society that works for handicapped people and C. U. Shah Pragna Chaksu Mahila Sewakunj which works for overall development of blind women. All members attended the tour in two batches.
- The training of Rose K lens was given to all Ophthalmic Assistants.
- All technical staff members were given the training in CPR.
- The RAAB survey team was sent for training to Lucknow, U.P.

Thus, lot of attempts were made for the development of staff in all the categories.

Visitors

The enthusiasm for social work naturally increases when the people from society observe and appreciate it. So many people visited the trust this year. The founder of Uka Tarsadiya Foundation, Shree Bhikhubhai Patel and his family members visited our trust. Apart from it, Nalinbhai Desai, the trustee of Gram Sewa Trust- Kharel, Shree Ravindrabhai Dholabhai from B R Dholabhai Charitable Trust, Shree Kishorbhai- representative of Blind Foundation USA, Shree Yogeshbhai Nayak from Rotary Eye Institute- Navsari, Shree Mehulsinh Gohil- HRD of Naveen Flourine Co., and Dr. Bhadraben Shah from Sathi Foundation USA paid a visit.

Also, Shree Balat Sir- Tribal Officer, the representatives of employee cooperative community from Union Bank, President of Sewa Bharti- Surat, Shree Nirav Mehta from Optometry College of Navsari, Shree Indubhai Shah from Tithal (The main donator for corneal treatment) and Jayeshbhai Shah, Heenaben Shah, Manishbhai Gajiwala from America came to visit.

Financial Outlay

Even in the fifth year, around 70% operations were done free of cost. With the numbers, the total expenses also increased. However, patient revenue has also increased.

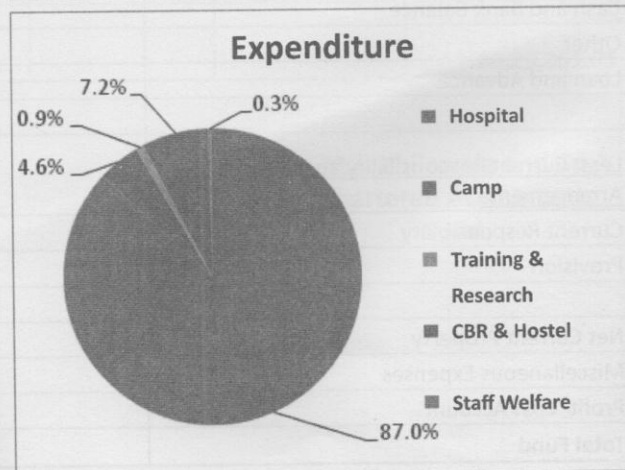
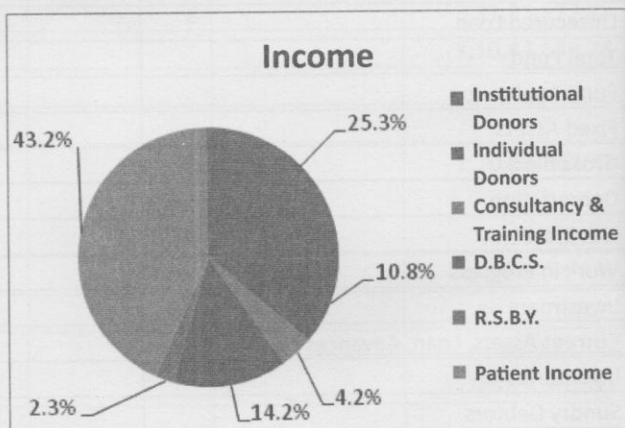
Last year, the recurring and non-recurring expense from hospital, diagnostic camp, Netrajyoti Training and research Centre, Community Based Rehabilitation programme, Vivekananda pragnachakshu bhavan, Janseva Medical and Optical store and Staff welfare was INR 685 Lacs to be total. The total recurring expense was INR 434 Lacs. Among the non-recurring expenses, Rs. 9 lacs for vehicles, Rs. 164 lacs for construction and Rs. 78 lacs for equipments were there.

Apart from patient revenue, we also receive partial help from government under District Blindness Control Society (DBCS) and Rashtriya Swasthya Beema Yojana (RSBY). Wonderwork- USA and Vision Foundation for India-Mumbai are the other major contributors. The rest of the amount comes from individual and organizational donations.

For the diagnostic eye camps and operations, the organizations like Hari Om Seva Trust, Sargam Builders, Maheshwari Samaj, Pentagon Charitable Trust, Combat Blindness Foundation USA, Sathi Foundation USA (Through Blind Foundation of India) and individuals contribute regularly.

Kasturi Bhojanshala for indoor patients & one relative, staff, blind children and outstation OPD patients is getting financial support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Similarly, the expenses for Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan comes from Poddar Tyres-Mumbai under their CSR programme. However, local support from Mandvi is also significant towards the hostel children. Patient revenue was 43% of total expenses compared to 30% last year. Also, the turnover of Janseva Medical Store has increased to reach 11.2%. Training and consultancy makes a small contribution of 0.9%. The rest of the expenses are managed from donations. We receive 25.3% through Organizational donors and 10.8% through individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R Shah Trust and Shri Bhairav Charitable Trust for ecofriendly activities.

We have received permission for collecting corpus funds under section 35 AC for cataract surgeries. We require more financial support due to increased work leading to increased expenses. We are sure that the whole hearted support from donors and well-wishers like you will continue in future also.

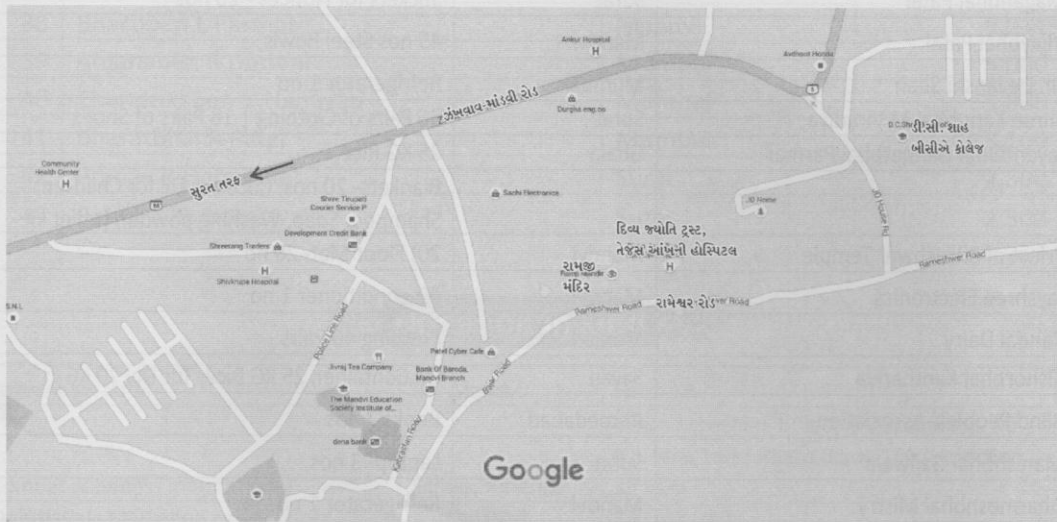
