Patient centric approach

Real India lives in villages!! This is very known proverb and true today also. In spite of Gujarat being the rich & developed state of India & having seen technical revolution during last two decades, the civilian living in far off villages from city is in shortage of health & education facility & employment as well.

The main object of the trust is to provide eye care facility to the community living in interior area where health care facility is very poor. Diagnostic camps around 100 km radius from Mandvi were arranged even before functioning of Tejas eye hospital at Mandvi, to provide eye care facility to the community at their doorstep.

The facility of two way transportation between campsite & base hospital for patient & one relative, accommodation, tea & food facility, operation & pre & post operation medication (for 1.5 months) and spectacles provided free of cost. Because of such comfort & ease, the diagnostic camps are very popular among the community.

Vision centers are also established with a similar aim. Since April-2012, at Netrang and Zankhvav CHC, daily OPD & twice a week surgery work are being conducted. During the year, three new vision centers at Sagbara, Dediapada & Umarpada and one satellite center at Vyara are started. Total OPD cases registered are approx. 6928 for this year and cumulative since 2012 is 36948 nos. including 5 years OPD cases seen at Netrang & Zankhvav of 30020 patients. If these patients would have to go for their eye check up to Mandvi, they would have spent RS. 200 /- person approx. so, we can say we have saved approx. 74 lacs of rupees providing these vision centers facility.

Further to this, we have purchased costly optical machineries to prepare tailor-made spectacles within few hours as an attempt to provide additional facility to the patient. The aim to purchase optical fitting machinery is not to make profit but to save traveling time & expenses of patients. During this year, we got 9055 orders for tailor-made spectacles, out of which, we could prepare 5740 spectacles within 2 hours' time and given to the customers on same day. Thus we could save precious time & energy of the customers.

Community based Rehabilitation programme for the blind was implemented in Mandvi taluka during 2012 to 2015. The new programme is going on for Umarpada & Mangrol taluka of Surat. The screening of blindness, blood sugar and blood pressure as well as intraocular pressure of 40+ people under this programme has been completed. Due to this screening, people who were unaware about their diabetes became aware. We also counseled them to take medicine to control their DM and to prevent other health issues due to uncontrolled diabetes. In case of glaucoma also the vision lost due to glaucoma is irreversible, so if we can control IOP in time, we can prevent the blindness due to glaucoma. So this project has also proved to be of great help to the community.

Divyajyoti trust helps other charitable organisations like Shrimad Rajchandra Ashram - Dharampur & Gram Seva Trust - Kharel to take care of ROP - Retinopathy of Prematurity patients and Sewa Rural Zagadia to take care of Glaucoma patients by sending relevant consultants regularly on fortnightly or monthly basis.

The training activity for Ophthalmologist in Phacoemulsification, SICS, Medical retina as well as regular course for paramedical workers is conducted which is very popular.

Thus very sincere efforts are being made to prevent blindness.

We are pleased to present the seventh annual report before you!

While selecting the area to start an eye hospital, it was understood that the demand of the eye care facility is tremendous & it came true over a period of time. During the year 16-17 total 12648 operations have been done.

Looking to patient centric approach, we continuously try to improve the facility for patients. At Netrang & Zankhvav C.H.C.s, we are providing eye care facility since April, 12. In addition to that 3 vision centres - Dediapada, Sagbara, Umarpada and one satellite centre at Vyara have been started. Out of six centres, telemedicine facility has been provided at four centres -Netrang, Zankhvav, Vyara & Umarpada.

Looking to increasing trend of diabetes mellitus, the possibility of diabetic retinopathy has increased in our country. So to educate the community about diabetic retinopathy and to detect the diabetes in early stage, as well as to encourage them to take timely treatment, one project of diabetic retinopathy has been started. The public health foundation of India, Government of Gujarat and Divyajyoti trust are working jointly on the project. Total eleven districts – each from eleven states have been selected among which Surat district of Gujarat state has been selected and the responsibility to implement the project is given to Divyajyoti trust is a matter of pride.

Apart from eye hospital, we are vigilant about eco-friendly activities as well. This year we have purchased solar cooking & steam cooking appliances to save energy. Considering our eco-friendly efforts in to account, we got 'Emerson Cup' award this year.

All these activities could be done because of donations & continuous support from the donors and well-wishers like you. We are thankful for the same & have full faith that such a flow will be continued in future also to move further for this humanitarian task.

The year at a glance

The hospital has completed 5 years on 22-5-16, so annual day was celebrated differently. A get together of Camp's sponsors, well-wishers & donors was arranged in the morning. During event, they shared their views & gave some suggestions. Each of department head gave brief information of their activity.

In the evening, a cultural programme was arranged that ended with dinner with staff family. Each staff & doctors working since five years were felicitated with a token gift of melamine dinner set.

A vision building workshop for future planning of five years was conducted by Mrs. Elizabeth Kurian –chief executive officer from mission for vision on 29th may. Another workshop for strategic planning was conducted by Dr. Col. M. Deshpande & his team on 14th Aug. The selected staff members had participated in above two workshops.

Three new vision centers & one satellite center have been established this year. Dediapada, Sagbara, Umarpada & Vyara to provide eye care facility to community at their doorstep.

With these four new centers added, now there are total 6 satellite/vision centers functioning. Telemedicine facility has also been provided at Netrang, Zankhvav, Vyara & Umarpada vision centers. The community of interior area has been benefited a lot with this facility, which is real object of the trust.

The video shooting by professional agency has been done to prepare videos on various subjects like (1) Activity of Divyajyoti trust, (2) Operation theatre, (3) Refractive error, (4) C.B.R. activity, (5) Cataract surgery & (6) Green building.

Flag hoisting ceremony was organized on 15th august & 26th January. Music teacher of our blind children - Mr. Ashokbhai Chaudhari and our executive committee member - Shree Navinchandra Shah hoisted the flags on 15th august & 26th January respectively.

One new EECO van has been purchased with donation from Uka Tarsadia Foundation. Donation for Optometry College is also given by Uka Tarsadia Foundation. The Foundation has been a great support since beginning. Such type of kind help is a backbone to our activity.

The faculty from Indian Institute of Management (I.I.M.) Ahmedabad Prof. Ravichandran visited our trust and conducted a study on how rapid development during five years is achieved and prepared a report. The same has been published with a title "case report, Divyajyoti trust".

The government of India suddenly declared demonetization of Rs.500 & Rs.1000 currency notes which led to cash transaction difficulty as well as drastic fall of donation income, following that cashless technology has been accepted and put in practice. However part payment from Public Health Foundation of India for diabetic retinopathy project received as well as third installment for upgradation from government of Gujarat has been deposited, was a great relief.

As per diabetic retinopathy project, four C.H.C. of Surat district; Areth, Mangrol, Zankhvav & Umarpada have been selected. The ophthalmic assistants working at these four CHCs would check the eyes of diabetic patients visiting CHC, take fundus photos & if required would show them through telemedicine to the retina consultant of Surat Civil Hospital / Divyajyoti trust. Through this, early diagnosis and treatment of diabetic retinopathy would be possible & the blindness from diabetic retinopathy could be avoided.

The funding for this project is provided by "Queen Elizabeth diamond jubilee trust, London" through public health foundation of India. We have to co-ordinate with the officer of government of Gujarat, health officer of Surat district, doctors of Surat Civil Hospital and ophthalmic assistants of Surat Civil Hospital as well as four selected CHCs. We have to provide training to doctors and ophthalmic assistant from all these centers as a part of the project.

For the above project total eleven districts have been selected throughout the country, among which Surat district is the one and Divyajyoti trust is the implementing partner of the project



is a matter of pride.

The MOU between Divyajyoti trust, Government of Gujarat & Public Health Foundation has been signed on 7th January & the project was inaugurated on 14th February at Surat in presence of the superintendent of Civil Hospital Surat, faculty of eye department, resident doctors, ophthalmic assistants, the officers from Public Health Foundation, Hyderabad & trustees of Divyajyoti Trust.

Assistant administrator Shri Vimal Prajapati is taking care of DR Project. He has undergone training in project management at Arvind Eye Hospital, Madurai for 15 days.

Daily core group meeting at 4:45 P.M has been started to resolve daily issues. From 1st September evening OPD named as "Happy hour OPD" has been started to give more facility to patients- mainly servicing persons, school- College going students etc. However the response from community is very poor.

From the next year, a course of B. optometry; vision technician, ophthalmic nursing will be run in affiliation with Uka Tarsadia University. MOU regarding the same is under process.

The syllabus for the above courses, designed as per Uka Tarsadia University will be followed by Divyajyoti trust and exams will be conducted by Uka Tarsadia University and mark sheet as well as certificate will be issued by the university. Similarly, for DNB course also affiliation with the Uka Tarsadia University will be done.

The KAPS authority under its CSR project, donated funds for equipments to strengthen glaucoma clinic. The required equipments were purchased and installed; after that, informal inauguration was held on 11th July in presence of Hon. MLA Shri Prabhubhai Vasava, officers of KAPS including site director Shri L.K. Jain and trustees of Divyajyoti Trust.

The Retina clinic has been enriched with the help of required equipments purchased by the donation from Lions Club international & inaugurated on 9th October in presence of officers of LCIF including International Director Ms. Aruna Oswal & past International President Shri Ashokbhai Mehta, Dist. Governors etc.

Having added few more equipments to these two clinics – retina & glaucoma, Tejas Eye Hospital is one of the top most eye hospitals in Gujarat. Treatment for retina and glaucoma being most expensive and due to non availability of expensive equipments at most of the charity based hospitals, we have tremendous load of retina & glaucoma patients. Here we provide treatment to the poor free of cost and at reasonable cost to others. At present we have two retina consultants & two glaucoma consultants as well.

Hospital activity & eco-friendly activities are in practice simultaneously. To utilise solar energy maximally, we have purchased steam cooking vessels and installed them to cook the food in bulk. Not only that, but also one automatic rotimaker preparing 860 roti/hour has been purchased. In addition to that, to cut down per dish cost, we have started purchasing vegetables directly from APMC market. Bi-directional meter on solar electricity generating plant has been installed.

The main objective of the Trust is to provide eye care facility to the community at their door step. So association of community ophthalmologist of India (ACOIN) & Divyajyoti trust jointly organised one CME on 17.9.16 on "comprehensive eye health care at P.H.C. level" and felicitated the philanthropic organisations and individuals of south Gujarat area working for community.

The organization working for society should be reliable & transparent. On our request, our organization had been evaluated by credibility alliance on 27-28 Oct. & awarded desirable norms certificate. The technical evaluation of our activities was done by Dr. Deepa Mohanti as per NABH norms & suggested some important changes.

The trust won award for eco-friendly activity – Emerson cup award which comprises of 50,000 Rs. Cheque & Memento and the same had been accepted by trustee Shri Vijaybhai Kania & technical consultant for eco-friendly activity Shri Amitsinh Waghela at Mumbai.



Hospital

The reputation earned during last six years by Tejas Eye hospital is remarkable. Number of patients visiting the hospital is continuously in increasing mode. One day, on 20th February maximum OPD reached - 286 and surgery on 13th February done for 92 patients.

The grant from KAPS authority for Glaucoma Clinic and from Lions club international for Retina Clinic received this year. With the financial help from Arvind Mafatlal Foundation; Mission For Vision, & Fullerton co and Seva USA -four new vision centres have been started.

To strengthen the eye care facility in hospital and to start new vision centres following equipments & instruments were purchased with the grant received from above funding agencies.

During the Year, Dr. Dhavat Sukharamwala & Dr. Shilpa Patel have completed their two years' term, and were relieved from the duties. Dr. Hetvi Desai, Dr. Snehal Chaudhari, Dr. Akshat Shah & Dr. Priyanka Shah have joined as full time Doctors. Dr. Akshat has joined as cornea fellow & Dr. Priyanka as Retina fellow.

Dr. Akshat & Dr. Priyanka attended Mega Eye camp at Bihar arranged by Bhansail Trust. Dr. Swapnil Pachchigar was sent to Hyderabad for 1.5 years retina fellowship.

The Glaucoma Clinic equipments donated by KAPS authority were inaugurated on 17th July in presence of MP Shri Prabhubhai Vasava, KAPS Officers including site director Shri L. K. Jain and other office bearers & trustees of Divyajyoti Trust.

From The fund received from LCIF, one full function Microscope was purchased and installed on 19-8-16 and the inauguration ceremony was held on 9-10-16 in presence of LCIF International Director Smt. Aruna Oswal and past International President Shri Ashokbhai Mehta & other dignitaries.

The First toric lens implant surgery was done by Dr. Dhavat P. Sukharamwala on 20-4-16.

To improve the facility given to our patients, we have started making phone or sending SMS on mobile to remind for their follow up dates or for surgery. The patients who don't have mobiles are intimated by post cards.



Quality improvement Measures :-

It is must to autoclave all the instruments before surgery. But to check the function of autoclave machine itself, validation of the machine is necessary. For the validation, an electrode is put in the autoclave machine and cycle is run. Previously we made a contract with an agency from Pune, but now, we developed contact with the franchisee of Bangalore based company at Surat so the validation work has been allocated to Surat based company.

Similarly, the contasol bottle containing 250 ml was used previously but half of the bottle was wasted after surgery so we negotiated with the company & arranged for 100ml bottle so that wastage can be avoided.

The outcome analysis of patients for the vision after cataract surgery has been started to improve our quality.

Continuous efforts are in practice to improve capacity & quality of working of the staff. For training of staff we have joined hands with H.V. Desai Eye Hospital under "SCALE" project. The funding for scale project has been allocated by 'SEVA' USA and the mentor is H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune.

The details of different training programmes is given in table no 5.

WE HAVE MILES TO GO BEFORE WE SLEEP

Nanubhai Jivlabhai Gamit of age 70 and native of village Katiskuva, Tal. Vyara, visited Dhamodla camp with his son. Nanubhai was shivering and had a stick in his hand for support. He was diagnosed with cataract in his both eyes so we brought him to the base hospital.

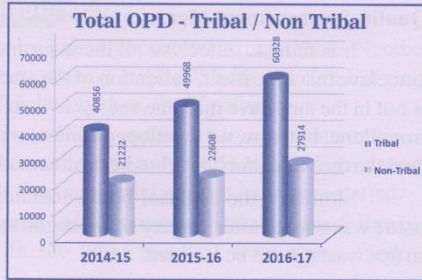
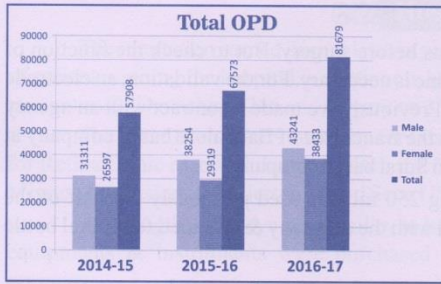
Nanubhai was looking weak and during his pre-operative check-up, it was found that hemoglobin level was only 2.5% but if we tell him to get blood from outside or any kind of treatment, he would not return for sure. As a result, we arranged for 2 bottles of blood from our staff members having same blood group and surgery of right eye had been done.

Nanubhai is alcohol addict and lost his work due to blindness and was facing economic crisis and hence was very aggressive with family members. Now, as he can see, he is able to earn his bread and live happy life.

However, Nanubhai did not turn up for his left eye surgery. It is either due to his ignorance or carelessness. No doubt we have miles to go before we can sleep.

Speciality Clinic

For all eye care related problems, the infrastructure was developed to provide all the solutions under one roof. Since may-11, availability of each sub-speciality consultant on regular basis has ensured that patients also come forward for treatment regularly.

At present glaucoma, cornea and retina consultants are available on full time basis where as other consultants are visiting the clinic on regular basis either once or twice in a month like oculoplasty, Neuro ophthalmology etc. The statistics of speciality clinic is given under table no 06.

Retina Clinic :

A life style disease - diabetes is increasing very fast. The complications due to diabetes like heart problem, kidney failure, damage to nervous system, vision loss are also increasing. Diabetic retinopathy is the term used to describe retinal damage developed due to diabetes which is irreversible. Timely regular screening and treatment can save the vision due to diabetic retinopathy.

In our hospital, two full time retina consultants and all required equipments to treat retina patients are available, hence retina OPD is very busy. Dr. Priyanka Shah joined as retina fellow this year. Our retina consultant regularly visits Kharel & Dharampur hospital for ROP screening to treat poor patients there twice in a month.

Diabetic retinopathy project in partnership with Government of Gujarat and P.H.F.I., Hyderabad has been under taken which is already described earlier. Pamphlet & posters for health education of diabetes & diabetic retinopathy have been prepared & distributed. The screening for diabetic retinopathy at base hospital, diagnosis camps and by CBR workers was carried out throughout the year. The statistics for the same is given under table no.03

Glaucoma Clinic :

Glaucoma is also one of the main reasons for blindness. Dr. Sheetal Chaudhari is taking care of Glaucoma patients regularly.

The KAPS authority under its CSR Project donated equipments for Glaucoma clinic to add on the existing facility. Due to availability of latest equipments in Glaucoma clinic & reasonable treatment cost, patients are increasing. The same is reflected in table no 06.

**Cornea Clinic :**

Corneal transplant surgery is being done regularly since beginning. Dr. Rohan Chariwala and cornea fellow Dr. Akshat Shah are taking care of cornea patients.

Dr. Rohan Thakkar; Dr. Pratik Topiwala from Surat & Dr. Soniaben Kothari from Mumbai are our visiting consultants to take care of cornea patients. Corneal transplant, lamellar keratoplasties are also being done on regular basis.

Oculoplasty Clinic :

Dr. Saurin Gandhi from Surat is our oculoplasty consultant since beginning, taking care of oculoplasty patients once in a month. Dr. Sagar Shah comes every Friday & he also takes care of such patients. Over and above Dr. Parth Joshi is taking care at base hospital.

Paediatric Clinic :

Dr. Chitan Mehta worked for one year as a paediatric consultant and left half way; now Dr. Sheetal & Dr. Parth are taking care of paediatric patients. The number of children with eye problems has increased remarkably. One paediatric camp was also organised in Dang on 12.7.16.

Neuro Ophthalmology :

Dr. Tanujaben Rakhe visits regularly twice a month since last four years taking care of needy patients.

Ocular Prosthesis Clinic :

Mr Jashwantbhai Mehta from Mumbai donated funds to develop oculoplasty clinic through his family trust –“Shilpa J. Mehta foundation” and “Harshukh B. Mehta” charitable trust and equipments for the same were purchased. This year 3 ocular prosthesis were prepared and given to patients.

Low Vision Clinic :

Dr. Rohan Chariwala is taking care of low vision patients.

Empty pockets - no bar to eye care

10 years old boy, Sagar, is a native of village Limbada, Tal. Mangrol, Dist. Surat and his family lives on daily wages as farm labourer.

Once Sagar had stick injury in his left eye and vitreous leaked from it with unbearable pain. His parents brought him to Tejas Eye hospital for treatment. Here, the doctor diagnosed it as corneal tear and suggested emergency surgery.

The parents were hesitant as they could not afford costly surgery, but our counselor assured them that the surgery will be done totally free, so they agreed for surgery.

After arranging for anesthesiologist, pediatric surgeon repaired the tear, doing 2 hour long operation successfully. Next day it was found that cornea had been repaired properly; vitreous leaking had stopped and Sagar could see properly.

Sagar's father says, if this surgery would not have been done free of cost, it was impossible for him to save his child's left eye. Here this difficult surgery was done totally free and could save Sagar's eye. Really this is a boon to the poor.

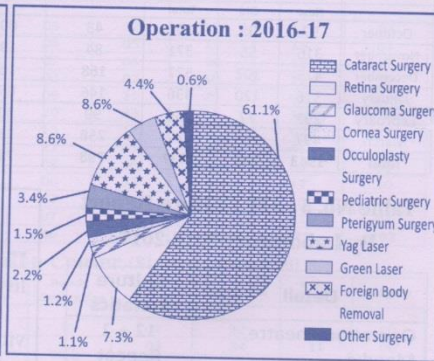
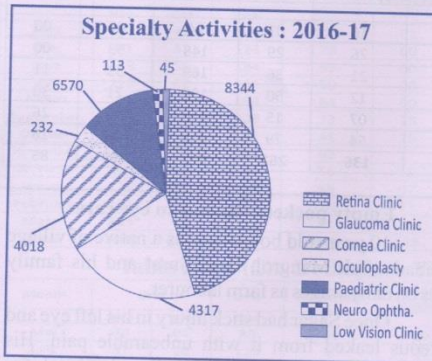

Research

Study-1

Community based rehabilitation project for Mangrol & Umarpada Taluka was started from Jan.15. The project includes survey to screen people for diabetes, blood Pressure, Glaucoma & diabetic retinopathy by fundus photography along with blindness at their door step of 40+ people. This kind of survey is the first one in the western part of the country of its kind.

For measuring IOP, rebound I care tonometer was used. Fundus photos were captured by non mydiatric fundus camera. Images were saved at the time of capture at community level and grading was done by ophthalmologist at base hospital.

Results:

The results are interim, final results are awaited. A total of 39,749 (up to 3-5-17) people were screened for HT, DM, Glaucoma out of which 4920 (approx. 12%) people were found to be freshly detected diabetics, 2406 people were found hypertensive & 388 to be glaucoma suspects. By the end of the project more than 58000 people were screened for their diabetic retinopathy by fundus photography.

Conclusion:

This is first of its kind door to door survey in western India & among very few in India where fundus photography is done on such a large scale.

There are good no. of freshly detected diabetics, Glaucoma suspect and hypertensive patients identified in the community. We have also learnt that we should focus on D.M. patients only for DR screening and not the entire population.

Study -2

A unique initiative - Diabetes screening of patients and their relative visiting our base hospital- A three years experience.

Results:

A total of 49511 people underwent RBS tests in last 3 years. Total of 482 (almost 10%) people



were first time informed that they were diabetics. People found positive, were referred to physicians and for further care of complications of diabetes to a retina specialist.

Conclusion:

Despite being an eye hospital, it is our moral collective duty to screen people with diabetes and if found positive, they need to be referred for diabetes care as well as for care of its complications.

Other small studies:

- 1) Profile of patients attending glaucoma clinic at tertiary (Tejas) Eye Hospital at Mandvi, Surat.
- 2) To screen and thereby creating awareness among communities for diabetes, diabetic retinopathy, hypertension and all other eye condition and to know the ratio of speciality patients referred from camp site to base hospitals.
- 3) Quality of visual outcome after cataract surgery of a high volume eye hospital in rural south Gujarat.

Eye donation awareness (Health education):

- This year, we had approximately 40 health education sessions conducted during 16-17. People were made aware about eye donation, diabetes, diabetic retinopathy, Glaucoma and various other eye diseases.

World sight day celebration:

- To celebrate “world sight day” a health education session was organized at Umarpada CHC. The main objective of the programme was to raise awareness regarding diabetes and diabetic retinopathy
- Presentations in various conferences.

The detail is given under separate table.

LENTICONUS

14 year old Krishnakumar Manishbhai Kokni of village Karod, Tal. Uchhal, Dist. Tapi is a student in 9th grade. He had trouble of reading from blackboard. He attended our camp in village Karod. He was brought to the base hospital in the camp bus for examination by pediatric ophthalmologist. Upon examination, he was diagnosed with lenticouns, (a localized, cone-shaped deformation of the anterior or posterior lens surface which prevents from seeing clearly). Natural lens needed to be replaced with artificial lens to cure this anomaly.

As a 14 year old, Krishnakumar was operated in presence of an anesthetist initially on his right eye followed by left eye six days later. After surgery, his vision is 6/9 and 6/12 respectively and with glasses his vision is 6/6; which is normal. As his vision has improved after operation, he is very happy and says that he will work hard and get good score in his 10th Std. final exam.



Outreach Activity

Diagnostic Camp :

The diagnostic camps organized by Divyajyoti Trust are very popular among peripheral area of Mandvi. The common concept of community is such, that – The cataract surgery should only be done during winter season. So drastic fall was noticed regarding no. of cataract surgeries during summer.

This year we have organized one day camp (small camps) in Mangrol- Umarpada area with the help of C.B.R. staff. The Publicity for camp was for one day only & that too done by C.B.R. worker only. The founder of a new (proposed) charitable hospital wanted to arrange camp at Ahwa-Dang. So one eye camp was done at Ahwa.

Due to one day camps, total no. of camps during the year reached to 319. OPD Patients were 37025 and cataract surgery of Patients admitted through camps was 5239, other eye surgery reached 314.

For the camp activities, constant support is extended from Vision Foundation of India – Mumbai, Hari Om seva Trust – Vadodara, Sargam group- Surat, Maheshwari samaj- Terapanth Samaj, Tuteja Parivar, Ramnarayan Chandakji, Vikasben Desai, Surat. Additionally every year on their respective specific date- Shree Mahendra Nemchand Jhaveri, Shri Vijaybhai Dalia, Shri Rajanbhai Pandya, Smt. Urmilaben Patel, Ur-Asha Jhaveri Foundation, Shri Shantaram Bhatt Charitable Foundation extend their share of Support. Also a Mega Eye camp is organized by Kakrapar Atomic Power Station authority every year.

National and International organizations such as Wonder work, Blind Foundation, Combat Blindness Foundation, Helpage India, Fullerton, Sathi foundation have been very supportive.

Support from District Blindness control society on per surgery basis for various types of surgery is a significant contribution. The detailed information is given in table no. 10.

Netrang & Zankhvav Satellite Centre :

Divyajyoti trust has started with the eye treatment at Netrang & Zankhvav Community health centers since April- 2012. The OPD work load at Netrang CHC increased remarkably during last Five years, So From 1st January 2017 afternoon OPD (From 2:30 to 5:30) has been started . Telemedicine Facility has been provided at both the Centers from 6th June 16. The field work by both the ophthalmic assistant has been started daily after regular OPD time ends.

Dediapada, Umarpada, Sagbara & Vyara :

The main objective of the trust is to provide eye Care Facility to rural community at their doorstep, more Vision Centers have been established. The Arvind Mafatlal Foundation donated funds for two vision centers, Dediapada Vision Center was inaugurated on 5-5-16 & Umarpada on 13-6-16. With the financial help from Seva - Canada, Sagbara vision center was established on 28-8-16, same way Vyara Satellite Centre has been started on 21-10-16 with the support of Fullerton & Mission for Vision.

Divyajyoti trust and Janak Smarak hospital Signed MOU for handing over day to day activities of eye department to Divyajyoti trust and surgical work started from 5th December 16. Daily OPD is taken care by our ophthalmic assistant and surgery is done twice a week by an ophthalmologist visiting from Mandvi regularly. Here at Vyara also, after noon OPD has been started. The Telemedicine



facility is also provided so that Speciality cases also can be taken care of.

Due to poor internet Connectivity, Sagbara & Dediapada Vision centers could not be facilitated by Telemedicine. The community gets eye care facility at their door step level. They need not go for their eye related problem to far off places, hence travel expense, one daily wage and other miscellaneous exp. could be saved.

Looking to statistics of OPD patients visited during five years (given in table no.4a to 4f) we can say approx. 37000 patients could save 74 lakh rupees. Not only that but also Divyajyoti trust has also saved noticeable amt and energy as the follow-up of camp patients can be done at vision centers for respective area.

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Programme for Incurable Blinds

The CBR programme is the ultimate objective for an eye hospital. Those who are incurably blind are being helped by providing training to live confidently. The main objective of the CBR programme is to make blind people Self-reliant.

The programme Started from Jan.15 in Mangrol and Umarpada talukas, total 203 villages were covered and all 40+ people were checked for diabetes, blood pressure and Glaucoma in addition to blindness. Total 56355 people out of 60000 were screened.

Initially IOP was taken through fix fundus camera installed in mobile van but from June-16, we have purchased hand held fundus cameras by which the screening was done very fast.

The main objective is to find blinds and to help them, so we could identify 182 blinds, (88 Male & 94 female) out of them we helped 95 persons to procure blindness certificate & 86 for bus pass. 54 persons got the benefit of Sant Surdas scheme. 132 persons have been trained in mobility. We helped 3 persons with financial assistance to start their own unit and 9 children for integrated education.

On world health day one camp was organized at Mosali, Tal. Mangrol and educational session on diabetes was arranged at Umarpada.

Our CBR workers are also doing school screening, the statistics of which is given here under in Table no. 11.

The hostel facility was started for blind children since June. 13. The children under the age of 12 years are provided lodging & boarding facility & arrangements are made for studying in regular school. Not only that but music, braille and computer coaching are also provided in the evening to build up their self-confidence.

This year, the children have cleared 2nd exam in music and will appear for 3rd exam. Six children have been sent to resident school at Anand for further studies. Five new children were admitted in our hostel.

Two workshops were organized, one during summer vacation & the other during winter (Diwali vacation). 36 children participated in Diwali workshop. Summer camp was arranged at Sewa Rural Jhagadia. During Diwali camp, a one day picnic to Nareswar was also arranged.

As a part of extra-curricular activity, children are preparing paper bags from newspapers which are used in our medicine shop instead of plastic bags. During Diwali, candle lamps are prepared by these kids.

One child, Ashwin Vanzara participated in patriotic songs competition organized on 15th Aug. by Mandvi Nagarpalika authority. Ashwin & Aarti had participated in braille writing competition arranged by Blind people association Ahmadabad. All children took part in Khel mahakumbh of Surat district.

Two blind girls of our area, Usha & Kokila got married at Morbi - group marriage arranged by C.U. Shah Andh Kanya Prakashgruh, Surendernager. Our CBR staff attended the same on 29th January at Morbi. World Handicapped Day was celebrated on 3rd Dec. with great enthusiasm. This year, we organised various competitions for handicapped persons viz. 100 mtr. race, musical chair, "limbu chamchi" and "kothladod". 76 handicapped persons participated in the event. All the winners were given prizes and even the rest of the participants were also given consolation prizes. Our trustee Shri Balubhai Patel sponsored these prizes. Office bearers of Mandvi municipal corporation also co operated in the event by providing their ground free of cost. Not only that, they provided for the food for all the participants. The P. T. teacher of Mandvi primary education department also remained present throughout the event.

Arjunbhai Nayka of village Sinvai Tal. Vandsa, Dist. Navsari, is a farmer. Once after fever, he got infection in his both eyes and lost his vision. His wife and brother carried him to the private hospital from where they were referred to Mandvi.

Here our doctors examined and diagnosed retinal detachment and advised surgery. Though there was no guaranty of success, Arjunbhai agreed for surgery. Next day, after surgery, he did not seem happy, but after some time, when he came for follow-up, he walked in independently and was very happy.

Thereafter, retinal surgery was done for his left eye and afterwards, cataract surgery has also been done. Both retina and cataract surgeries were successful and he has regained his vision after 2-3 months. Now he is very happy. Now Arjunbhai will do his routine work independently and so his wife also as an "Asha worker", will perform her duties sincerely.

Arjunbhai says that "after hearing negative comments from other hospitals, he was disappointed & lost the confidence that he will ever see again but we visited Mandvi hospital as a last chance and got vision not only that but new life. We are very much thankful to you."

Prabhubhai Nathubhai Patel of Chhaprabhatha village is 102 years old and leads a well to do family. However, he had been blind for last three years. Due to corneal issues in both eyes, he was not able to see. Prabhubhai did not want to go thru surgery due to his advanced age and slim possibility of success. We had to arrange for cornea from Hyderabad, cornea specialist from Surat and Anesthetist to prepare for the surgery. In spite of his advanced age, he is very healthy and came to the hospital on his own. Dr. Rohan Thakkar performed the corneal transplant surgery with the anesthetist stand by.

Next day, when the bandage were removed from his eye, Prabhubhai was extremely happy to see his family members with his own eye after three years. His family members were also tremendously pleased. The family distributed sweets to the entire staff and Prabhubhai's natural reaction was to indicate that Tejas eye hospital was as good as a hospital in America.

Financial Outlay

At The end of Sixth Year 12,614 operations were done. Out of which total 8,663 (68%) were done free of cost where as 3,951 (32%) operations were done either at subsidised rate or were fully paid. However our charges are heavily subsidised-half of the market rates. The total income from patients has increased.

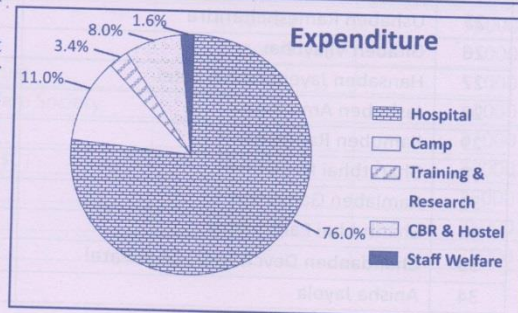
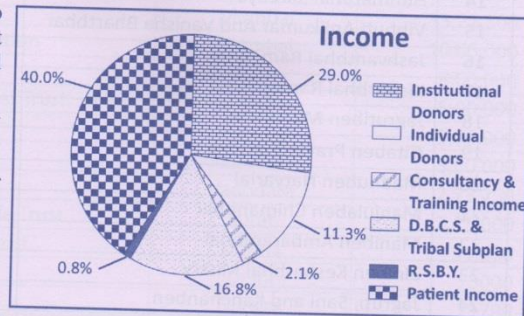
The total expenditure for hospital, camps, Training Centre, research, C.B.R. Programme, Vivekanand Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva Medical & Optical Store & Staff Welfare during the year was of Rs 7.72 crore includes recurring & non-recurring. The total recurring expenditure was Rs. 5.82 Crore, whereas non-recurring expense for purchase of vehicle was Rs. 5 Lac, equipments for diabetic retinopathy project was of Rs. 73 Lac. These equipments eventually will be handed over to the new civil Hospital Surat and for other equipments of Rs. 1.12 Crore.

Apart from patients Income, we also receive partial help from Government under District Blindness Control Society (DBCS) and Rashtriya Swasthya Beema Yojna (RSBY scheme), other than this organisations like wonder Work – USA, Uka Tarsadia Foundation USA, Mission for Vision, Helpage India, Combat Blindness Foundation and Vision Foundation of India –Mumbai are of great help.

Kasturi Bhojan Shala for indoor patients and one relative, staff, blind children and outstation OPD patients is getting financial support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Similarly the expenses for Vivekanand Pragnachakshu Bhavan comes from Poddar Tyres - Mumbai, under their CSR programme. However, Local Support - from Mandvi is also Significant for Blind Children. Patient Revenue is 48% of total hospital expense.

The turnover of Janseva medical store has increased to reach 12.5%, training and consultancy makes a small contribution of 2.1%. The rest of the expenses are managed from donations. We received 29% through Organizational donors and 11.3% through individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R. Shah Trust for Eco friendly activities.

We got permission to collect corpus fund under section 35 AC for cataract surgeries but it has been cancelled from April-17. Up to March-17, we got noticeable donation for cataract corpus Fund. We require more financial support due to Increased work leading to Increased expenses. we are sure that the whole hearted support from donors and well wishers like you will continue in future also.
