Efforts to Improve Quality

We put continuous efforts to improve facility & quality of treatment of patients.

For quality improvement various methods are in practice such as regular maintenance & calibration of installed equipments & machineries, checking quality of water used for autoclaving, checking quality of food which is served to patients and others; supervision of housekeeping activities etc. We have introduced the system to get feedback from patients & if any problem is found we take immediate action to correct the same.

For cleaning of equipments & tools we use R.O water. After regular maintenance the technician certified that the machine is functioning properly but when tested in our laboratory, our staff said that there is some bacterial growth & need to be repaired again. So the R.O machine was repaired again and after satisfactory result it has been certified by our laboratory staff.

Similarly after analyzing the feedback from patient we had done necessary changes in hospital, ward, special & semi special rooms, OPD, Kitchen etc.

At Tejas hospital, patient are of prime importance, so we put regular efforts to provide them quality treatment at reasonable cost.

Trust formation & other formalities completed before 2011 & the Eye hospital was inaugurated on 22.5.11. 7 year have been completed successfully by grace of god. During this year (2017-18) we have done 12467 surgeries cumulative total being more than 60000 surgeries since the beginning.

The hospital started with 40 bed facility, has now progressed to 100 bed & renowned as tertiary eye care center.

As a trust, we are aware of the need for capacity building of our staff, welfare activities for staff, social upliftment of surrounding area and ecofriendly activities as well in addition to eye care responsibilities. Thus looking to our overall efforts for holistic approach to society - staff & ecology, we got "Lotus" award from "vision 2020 Right to sight India" for year 2017-18 at Raipur Chhattisgarh during its annual conference.

We sincerely believe that training & research activities are also very important aspect & due to our consistent & sincere efforts we got permission to run Degree optometry course under UkaTarsadia University- Bardoli.

The procedure for NA at Amalsadi, where we got donation of piece of land is in process. At Amalsadi we aim to develop new campus for hospital, training and research purpose for which big fund is required. We are looking for the support of our well-wishers and donors for that purpose & are confident for the same.

The year at a glance

This year we have completed six years on 22nd May, So celebrated with staff & family. This year 21st May was Sunday, so we offered "Ganesh Puja" on that day and enjoyed musical night followed by dinner.

Actually our staff is polite & well behaved with patients but to improve communication skill; the workshop for soft skill development by Dr. Nilesh Thakore was arranged. The Whole staff in two batches had participated in this workshop.

The solar power generation plant has been installed in new building and bi-directional meter was installed for the old solar power plant, now electricity bill is reduced to some extent.

Annual conference of vision 2020 Right to sight India was arranged on 3-4 June at Raipur, Chhattisgarh; where Divyajyoti Trust got "Lotus award" for its holistic approach. Award comprises of Rs. 50,000/- Cheque, Certificate & memento. The efforts made by trust for overall development of staff, Training research as well as ecofriendly activity have been considered for this award. The award was accepted by selected core group members.

On 20th of June, we have completed 50,000th operation which was celebrated by a gala lunch with staff and extra 2.5% increment was declared on that day. In April, 7.5% increment was given, so total 10% regular increment is given to all staff this year also.

The permission to run optometry course was granted by government authority to us, so we have started the college form November with 6 students. The number of students is very less because the other courses generally start from July or August but in this case we got permission in august and actually course started from November. So students took admission in other courses which started earlier.

Independence Day was celebrated. The flag was hoisted by executive committee member Shree Vijaybhai Shah. The Republic day was celebrated with the presence of executive committee member Shree Nimeshbhai Shah. A picnic to "Poicha" was arranged for staff and family, good number of staff with family members enjoyed the same.

A motorcycle rally was arranged on world sight day in Mandvi Town to raise awareness about diabetic retinopathy. Almost 400 to 500 school children participated in rally at village Umarkhadi Tal. Umarpada to celebrate the same. Screening for diabetic retinopathy was arranged at Vyara & Bardoli vision centres.

The equipments purchased from the grant sanctioned under diabetic retinopathy project by public health foundation of India were handed over to the eye department of new civil hospital Surat.

From November 17 electronic face reader has been installed to mark the attendance of staff. On experimental basis attendance register & electronic face reader both are continued for a while but from April. 18 onwards the attendance will be noted by face reader only.

Dr. Manju Reddy from Bengaluru visited the hospital for DNB inspection. The proposal was sent to National board in March. 17 similarly for ISO inspection Mr. Rushang Sheth visited on 14th December & suggested some changes to be made to improve the system.



Two more vision centres - one at Bardoli & the another at Uchchhal were inaugurated in July'17 & Dec.17 respectively & also the telemedicine facility has been provided there.

The Co-operative society for Staff members has been registered on 30th December.

From Kakrapar Atomic power station; team of some fire safety staff visited & demonstrated the use of different type of fire extinguishers.

School Screening for Shell company Harzira under its CSR project was done during the year. Total 9818 school students were screened. Among them total 188 were given spectacles & 76 referred.

For the trust activity one well-wisher donated his agriculture land at Amalsadi- Tal. Mandvi. The process for NA is going on for the same. One architect & other consultants to develop the campus at Amalsadi have been selected & one meeting with selected trustees & above motioned professionals was arranged during Feb.18.

We are committed to provide quality services to our patients, Hence to improve & maintain our quality, continuous efforts are made during the year; two consultants from Shroff charity Eye hospital, Delhi visited the hospital & checked each & every department of the hospital & gave suggestion to improve quality. The ideas were shared with core group members and put into action immediately.

Similarly at the end of the year in March.18 Mr. Dhanaji Rampise from "Misson for Vision" visited for hospital facility assessment. According to prescribed norms for patients facility, It was proved that we are providing maximum facility to our patients.

During the year Dr.Parth Joshi; Dr.Akash Shah.; Dr. Jagruti Jariwala & Dr. Jyotindra Brahmhatt were relieved & Dr. Nirali Patel & Dr. Alka Gupta have joined as ophthalmologists.

Finally Mangiben's Sight is restored

Mangiben Halpati of village Gamtalav Tal.Mandvi is 65 years old. She had lost her vision since last 5 months as she had ocular trauma in her right eye long back & so could not see with her right eye. In addition to that she lost her vision in her left eye also since last 5 month. Because of blindness she was unable to visit Mandvi on her own.

There was a diagnostic camp at village Gamtalav and her son carried her to the camp. There it was diagnosed that she had cataract in her left eye & Mangiben reached Mandvi by camp vehicle.

At Tejas hospital our staff counseled her that after cataract surgery she could see but she was afraid of surgery. Our staff tried hard to convince her & assured that her surgery; medicine; spectacles- everything will be free. After a long counseling she agreed for surgery. After surgery Mangiben is very happy as she could see after a long time & lives normal routine independent life.

Mangiben's son says that they had visited to No. of hospitals & doctors but nobody treated them as they could not bear the expenses of treatment.

At Tejas hospital treatment was done totally free of cost & Mangiben got her vision also. They are very happy.



Hospital

The medical records of the patients are required to be preserved for 3 to 5 years. It requires more space to preserve them in hard copies & is difficult to search when required, so all the records of 3 to 5 years old cases are converted in electronic record by scanning them.

The charity work done by the hospital attracts other doctors also. Dr Saumil Kokhari came from Bombay and done 4 difficult surgeries.

Similarly Dr. Sheetalben did four glaucoma surgeries on one day.

Generally during festival days, patients flow decreases substantially, but during this year on "Waghbaras" there were 255 patients in OPD. The maximum No. of OPD patients of 295 were noted on 29th Jan. & on the same day 96 surgeries were done. Maximum surgeries of 98 patients were done on 26th March. Total No. of indoor patients reached up to 160 on the same day including patients admitted through Mega Eye Camp sponsored by KAPS. Whenever we have more than 100 patients, we accommodate them at "Poonamwadi" near our hospital at suthar falia. We seek such type of help for more than 10 times a year. We are really thankful for the same to Poonamwadi management.

During the year we have undertaken one very difficult case of an old patient whose corneal surgery was to be done. Before visiting our hospital; patient had visited a hospital at Mumbai but his heart function was found only 30%, no body took risk to operate. But at our hospital we arranged for two anaesthetist, procured medicines - injections and done corneal surgery successfully. Dr. Upendrabhai Patel and Dr. Arvindbhai Patel - our honorary anaesthetists did the wonderful job. One more anaesthetist Dr. Pratik Chaudhary has started coming as visiting consultant from June 2017.

From the patients admitted in hospitals-most of them are alcoholic. Sometimes the patients who are severely addicted and when they don't get alcohol, behave very unusual. If there is no relative to take care of them it becomes difficult to handle the situation & we have to allow them to drink. Sometimes we inform their family members & send them back also. It is our tough test to handle such unpleasant & unexpected situation, but by god's grace & with co-operation of the society we can handle such case & move forward.

Case Study

Manjuben somabhai Devra age 60 is native of Ahmedabad but her sons are residing at Vyara for business purpose. She visited Vyara to see them, she had complain of irritation in left eye, so had visited to our Vyara satellite center. She had visited other hospital, some 9 years ago as some foreign body had fallen in the left eye but nobody cared to remove the same and gave some medicines. As the foreign particle was not removed so her corneal surface became white. From Vyara, Manjuben was referred to Mandvi Eye Hospital. At Mandvi her foreign body was removed immediately. It was small Particle of iron.

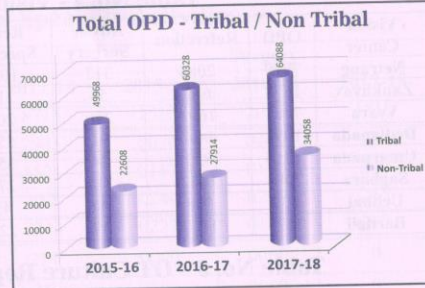
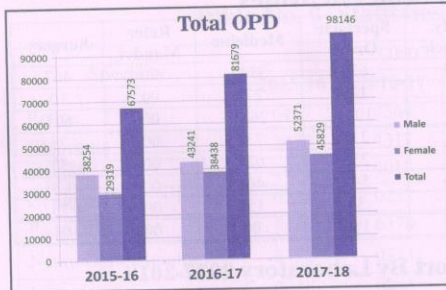
After removal of foreign body her irritation was cured & vision has improved.

Since last 9 years facing irritation in eyes she was very uncomfortable & her sons were also tired by frequently visiting the hospitals & still the problem was not solved. Now the problem is solved, they are very happy & exclaimed that the problem which could not be solved at the hospital of a big city like Ahmedabad, has been solved in small town like Mandvi.

They are very happy & pray to God for progress of the hospital.

Specialty Work

The main objective to start an eye hospital is to provide all type of eye care facility under one roof, hence all efforts were made to procure latest equipments for each eye care related problem.

Not only that but also we had arranged to provide services of different eye care consultants as visiting faculty since beginning. After 7 years of working, now Tejas Eye hospital is renowned as tertiary eye care center. So specialty work increased substantially. All types of sub specialty services including retina, cornea, glaucoma and pediatric ophthalmology are available on full time basis; oculoplasty & neuro- ophthalmology services are available on visiting basis. The statistical information is given in table no.6.

Somebody's eye donation transformed Kalubhai's life

Kalubhai More of age 30 is resident of village Bakanpada Tal. Nasik, Maharashtra. He had some foreign particle fallen in his left eye before 10 years & had lost vision in left eye. He had vision in his right eye. But unfortunately before 5 years some insect fell in right eye, he could not open the right eye. He was blind & did not know where to go & what to do.

Sometime ago Kalubhai visited a hospital near Nasik. The hospital authority referred him to Mandvi.

At Mandvi doctor examined him & diagnosed corneal opacity and advised corneal transplant surgery. Fortunately good healthy corneas were available and Kalubhai got benefited. There were total 5 corneal transplant surgeries on the same day. Next day after dressing Kalubhai was very happy as he could see. After 5 years of blindness he is able to see again. His wife is also very happy. Because of Kalubhai's disability, she has to look after so many things - to look after their children, to earn money, to bare household responsibility etc. Now Kalubhai will earn money & help her to share household responsibility. They will live happily.

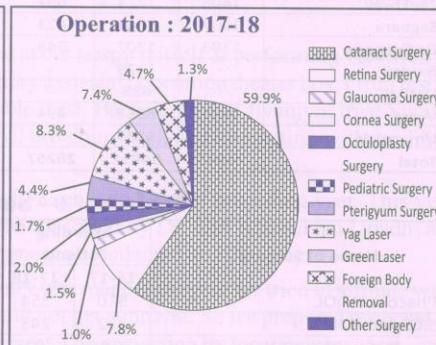
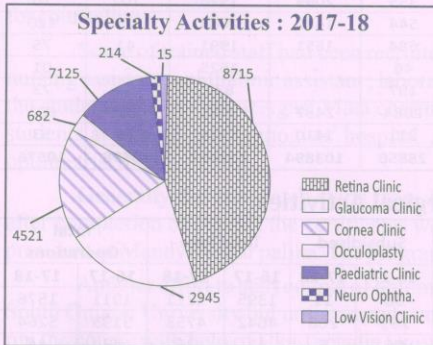

Training Activity

Generally we find shortage of skilled workers in rural areas. Though unemployment is a big challenge, shortage of skilled workers is a different issue.

Highly educated skilled youth dream to settle in big cities; hence even if they find a job in small town or village, they don't stay longer; so it is a challenge to retain such staff for any organization working in rural area.

Looking to above, the solution is to train locally available under graduate youth as per our requirement. We select the rural poor young students who are enthusiastic; hardworking and ampathetic to poor people & train them. Looking to our past 7 year's record it proved that such type of candidate perform well if we train them accordingly.

We run 1 year vocational courses for ophthalmic assistant; Ophthalmic Nursing; 2 months course for optical fitting; 3 months training for operation theater Boy; 2 months course for counseling.

Some of trained staff had been recruited at our hospital itself & performing very well as nursing assistant; ophthalmic assistant ; laboratory assistant ; operation theater boy. From rest of the students one got job at Agasi Mata charitable trust, Bardoli. One at Jivanjyot trust Surat; 2 students at private ophthalmogists' hospital. All are doing well and competing with qualified optometrist there.

Generally the new batch starts from July & ends in June of preceding year. This year after completion of course; the certificates were conferred by Dr. Shri Ashishbhai Upadhyay- president of Mandvi Nagar palika. The programme was conducted on 10th July.

Another effort to start course of optometry was made. Last year we tried to affiliate with South Gujarat University but unfortunately could not get approval. So we prepared proposal to run the course with help of Uka Tarsadia University. The inspection by local inquiry committee was carried out on 11th July and gave the approval so started the course from November. However the course was started late compared to other courses, only 6 students were enrolled for the same.

Fresher's party was arranged for all the students and staff members also participated. The students of optometry as well as vision technician course & nursing, presented cultural programme. After that all including staff members played musical chair and had dinner together at the end.

Initially we got permission for Optometry College for one year. For Further three years course; the inspection committee of Gujarat government visited us on 26th of March & we will get the approval for further three years also.

For capacity building of our regular staff, continuous efforts are being put into practice in addition to training of our students. For training of our staff we have joined hands with "SEVA" USA under global sight initiative & our mentor institute is H.V. Desai Eye hospital Pune. We sent our staff for different training at Pune. The detail is given here under.

At Vyara, Doctor referred her to Mandvi for detailed investigation. Vasantiben visited Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital & here doctor diagnosed retinal problem with 1/60 vision & advised her to get MRI done from Surat as well as some blood investigation. After seeing investigation reports Doctor referred her to neuro ophthalmologist Dr. Tanuja Rakhe and she suggested the treatment to take injection, AS vasantiben was alone & nobody to take care of her, She Preferred to take treatment at Vyara instead of Mandvi. After the dose of injections completed, she is feeling better and very thankful & Says it's amazing to have neuro ophthalmologist in Small place like Mandvi. People generally don't know where to go & how to get treatment. Not only that but also it is very costly affair to visit big city like Surat or Ahmedabad & time consuming as well. So the facility at Mandvi Eye hospital is a boon to rural poor people.

Research

We finished Door-to-door screening for glaucoma, diabetes and hypertension in Umarpada and Mangrol talukas of the Surat District of India, as part of a community-based rehabilitation (CBR) programme and results of which we disseminated in various scientific conferences and meetings

Results

A total of 53,000 plus people were screened for HT, DM, Glaucoma and other posterior segment pathology. The analysis done so far of 39,749 and out of which 4920 (2171 males, 2749 females) people were found to be freshly detected diabetics but there were only 2615 people who were positive for their urine sugar. 2406 (1155 males, 1251 females) people were found hypertensive and 388 (198 males, 190 females) people found to be glaucoma suspects. 38,912 eyes were screened for posterior segment by fundus camera. From the fundus photographs 2149 eyes were found glaucoma suspects and only 12 eyes detected for DR.

This is first of its kind door to door survey in western India and among very few in India where fundus photography is done on such a large scale. There are good number of freshly detected Diabetics, Glaucoma suspect and hypertensive patients identified in the community. For DR screening, we should focus on DM patients and capture their fundus photographs only rather than entire population- as this is not practical in resource limited country like India.

We analysed a unique initiative of Diabetes Screening of patients and their relatives visiting our Base Hospital, Mandvi-Surat.

Results:

A total of 49,511 people underwent RBS tests in last three years (2014, 2015 and 2016- 1st January- 31st December each year). Total of 482 (308 males 174 females) people were first time detected that they were diabetics. Out of 49,511 RBS tests carried out, 43,389 are free, 108 are subsidized, and 6014 are paid. People found positive were referred to physicians and for further care of complications of Diabetes. We screened all for presence of Diabetic Retinopathy (DR) and if found positive treatment was provided to them.

Services of vision centre – boon for local community.

Dharmendrabhai Vasava (Age 28 years) visited Sagbara vision centre as he had complaint of dim vision. Ophthalmic assistant examined him and referred him to Mandvi diagnosing retina problem.

Dharmendrabhai is patient of epilepsy and because of that his optic nerve has been damaged. At Mandvi doctor advised him for further investigations of Blood & MRI. After all investigations done neuro ophthalmologist treated him with steroides.

When Dharmendrabhai visited first time his vision, was 1 metre. After the treatment, vision is improved to 6/60 in both eyes.

Dharmendrabhai owns Xerox shop at Sagbara. Because of his problem he was worried very much. But now his vision is improved, so he & his parents are very happy & looking for a bride. He will get married soon.



Outreach Activity

Diagnostic Camp:

The Diagnostic camps are one of the key activities for an eye hospital. Knowing this reality, we put all efforts for planning, publicity & execution of camps since beginning. The facility offered to poor camp patients are free surgery, two way transportation, accommodation, food, medicine, spectacles & overall the quality of work; that attracts the community the most, this reflects in no. of camp patients.

Last year total 319 camps were arranged. Total OPD was of 37520 patients & from them, 5239 cataracts & 314 other speciality operations were done. It means that out of total 12463 surgeries 45% of the same was done from the patients screened through camps.

For the publicity of camps we are providing one staff for publicity & driver with 4 wheeler since beginning, but when we visited Dahod – Om Trust, there we saw that the publicity of camp is done by only one staff travelling on two wheeler. The same system is in existence at Pune H.V. Desai Eye Hospital. When we sent our one staff for training of camp publicity, he confirmed the same. So if we also send a publicity staff on two wheeler; the salary of one staff as well as vehicle running cost can be saved & ultimately expenses of camp can be reduced. So for the publicity of camp at village which are near to Mandvi; publicity by only one staff has been arranged.

If local community & leaders take interest for camp, the success rate is more. So from June '17; we have started to involve local leaders in camp activity. Before and after camp we have started sending SMS to local leaders. Thus to reduce the expenditure and to involve local leaders different steps have been taken.

We have six sponsors, who regularly sponsor the camps every year. Over and above that this year for the first time we have arranged a camp at Mahal area of Dang district. One camp at Ahwa, was also arranged, where in near future one charitable hospital is coming up through new charitable trust. One mega camp sponsored by Kakrapar atomic power station was also arranged. This year total 369 camps were done the total OPD of 46735 patients was done & 5243 surgeries was done & 2348 were referred for speciality work.

Apart from camp; this year screening of college students of Maliba University was done as per request of their management.

Similarly as per request of "SHELL - petroleum company" the school screening nearby Hazira-Surat was carried out. Total Screening of 9818 students of different schools was done among them, 1404 students were found having refractive errors. 245 students were given spectacles and 03 students were referred for speciality work.

The truck drivers vision screening for Bridgestone tyre company was carried out on 10th Nov. 63 truck drivers were screened, 07 were given spectacles & 05 were referred to hospital for speciality work.

The statistical data of camp is given under table no. 10.

Satellite centres & Vision centres

Divyajyoti Trust is taking responsibility of eye care at Netrang & Zankhvat CHC since last six years under public private partnership. One more satellite centre at Vyara with the help of Janak Smarak Hospital was adopted last year. Now there are 3 satellite centres and 5 vision centres at Sagbara, Dediypada, Umarpada, Uchchhal & Bardoli.

At Netrang CHC ophthalmic assistant Shri Rameshbhai Vasava is working since 14 years. His sincerity; honesty knowledge, sympathy with patients & problem solving ability made him different from others. His working stands always remarkable. Local people know him as Doctor, which



shows his popularity.

From statistical data of all satellite centre & vision centres it is seen that Netrang CHC is performing well.

At Zankhavav CHC we had problems since beginning as the staff posted there was found dishonest so we relieved him, the replacement was also the same. So we arranged to send ophthalmic assistant from Mandvi turn by turn on weekly basis, but it also did not work out very well. At last Nagin Vasava was doing satisfactory but we had to send him to Vyara.

Vyara satellite centre was started last year. The senior nursing staff Deepika Vasava and ophthalmic assistant Nagin Vasava were posted there to initiate working of new centre.

Vyara being a big town having large population & due to reputation of Janak Smarak hospital, the OPD number increased within short time. We are very much thankful to Janak Smarak management authority for providing food for patients; accommodation to our staff; parking facility and cleaning assistance. All these made our task smooth & comfortable.

Looking to OPD number and number of indoor patients, we have posted full time ophthalmologist at Vyara from sept.17. Due to this OPD number increased further. This year number of surgery during Jan.18 crossed 100.

During tribal week celebration total 49 cataract surgeries were done. Partial funding for vyara centre is provided by mission for vision. The auditor of MFV visited Vyara centre and checked all the records and audited the working of Vyara centre. Not only that but also MFV has arranged outcome analysis showing the grading of vision after cataract surgery using spectacles etc. & found satisfactory.

Community Based Rehabilitation programme for Blind

The main objective of running CBR programme is to make blind people self-reliant & confident in their day to day life. To achieve the purpose, different activities are being carried out.

The first CBR project was implemented in Mandvi Taluka. Total 133 villages were covered & the programme was completed in Dec.14. From Jan.15, CBR programme was implemented at Mangrol & Umarapada taluka of Surat district. Total 203 Villages were covered, which was completed in Dec.2017. The third CBR project has been started in Vyara Taluka of Tapi District.

Under this programme door to door screening for blindness, screening for diabetic awareness & assistance to avail government benefits to the disabled (Blind), and awareness generating programme are being conducted.

During eye donation fortnight one rally organized with the help of children of primary school of village vad. Ta: Mangrol. At Umarghadi village of umarpada taluka one rally was organized for awareness of diabetes.

Diabetic retinopathy screening arranged at Areth, Zankhvav, Umarpada & Mangrol CHC to celebrate world sight day on 10th October. At Mandvi Dr. Rohan chariwala had given a brief understanding of diabetes & related eye problems and also counselled the diabetic patient to take regular medicine which is available free of cost at government health centre/hospitals. The government medical officer remained present on the occasion & 70-80 participants were there.

The children of sugar cane laborers have several health problems. Among which vitamin 'A' deficiency is a severe problem which lead to blindness. One organization named vitamin angles distributes vitamin A capsules with 'albendazol'. Representatives from the organization visited Divyajyoti trust & with the help of CBR workers, we had distributed vitamin A as well as 'sukhadi' to these children.

School screening of about 44 schools of Umarpada & Mangrol talukas was done, total screening of 16000 students was done & among them 1104 student were found with refractive error & 221 children were referred for specialty.

At Tatawadi fansa, the blind youth is being trained for farming for two years. To motivate the blind young person, Shri Mananbhai from Tatawadi fansa visited & counselled 5 youth for this training.

The CBR programme started in Mangrol & Umarpada taluka from Jan-15 was completed in Dec-17. Now another programme at Vyara taluka has been started from Feb-18, the workers for the Vyara project have been selected during Feb-18 & the training of these workers was imparted during March. Now they are conducting door to door survey for blindness.

3rd December is celebrated as world handicapped day each year. One competition of disabled people was arranged on the day & 46 participants took part in the competition. They enjoyed musical chair, 100 meter run, long jump & other games. Prizes were distributed to the winners.

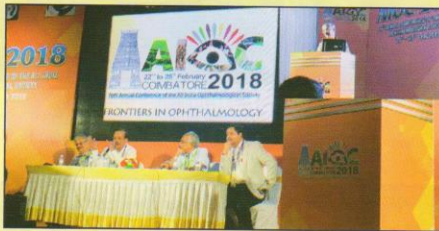

The hostel facility for blind children up to age 12 has been provided since June-13. The blind children staying in hostel, study in a regular school; learn music, braille; computer & life skills. Total 12 children were staying in hostel this year. They also learn to live with confidence & self-respect.

For these children two workshops - one during summer vacation & one during Diwali vacation are being organised. This year summer camp was held at sewa rural zagadia, where 6 students participated & visited Nareshwar and Kabirwad as a part of camp activity.

During Diwali workshop 37 children participated and learnt different skills through various activities.

One well-wisher of Mandvi has sponsored a picnic to Ambaji for blind children. At Ambaji also people welcomed the blind children and behaved kindly with them.

The trustee Shri Ramnarayn Chandakji sponsored a trip to Haridwar & Rishikesh for blind children & guruh mata. Children participated in Ganga Aarti, had chance of 'ganga-snan' & Krishnakatha.

Our hostel girl Aarti Vasava took part in District level braille writing & essay competition held at Surat Andhjan shala & won 3rd prize.

All the students participated in khel Mahakumbh of Tapi district & won the prizes worth Rs. 39000/- They have cleared exam of level three in music. Aarti stood first among them.

Each year on 31st December Surat Maheshwari Samaj organises chanting of 108 times Hanuman chalisa and invites our blind children. They recite it with very clear pronunciation, harmony and discipline.



Surat district education committee offered scholarship of Rs.2500/- to each blind child. Over & above local community is a big support to these children. Members of Saurashtra group of Mandvi are supporting hostel since beginning with 2 liters milk each morning. One namkeen merchant offers 'khaman' on each Thursday for children. We are very much thankful to them. BRC bhavan, Mandvi offered 2 smart phones & 2 daizy players to blind children. 4 more daizy players were given to the children who were sent to Mogri dist. Anand for further study.

Mayur's life has changed for good

Tejas eye hospital run by Divyajyoti Trust is involved in eye care services since last 7 years. The objective of trust is to provide eye care facility at the door step of rural tribal community of interior area near Mandvi Dist. Surat. The main challenge for this work is to get trained technical staff & to retain them for long time.

To overcome the issue, we have adopted a strategy to train local youth as per our requirement we run short course of ophthalmic assistant, counseling, OT boy, Optical fitting, ophthalmic nurses.

The vision technician students who have completed their training during year 15-16 got placement except 1-2 students. Among them Mayur Rabari got the job as ophthalmic assistant in eye department at Agasi Mata Charitable trust. The management authority is happy with his sincerity; efficiency & behavior. The management is very positive towards our students.

Because of goodwill earned by Mayur, this year also students got job easily at Agasi Mata Trust.



Community kitchen in service of patients

It is our common experience that when some of our relatives are admitted in hospital, the job to provide tea-breakfast & meals at particular time is a difficult task.

Here, our main objective is to provide eye care facility to the interior rural tribal community. The patients are from very far off areas & sometimes alone. So from initial days we have provided community kitchen facility for patients & their relatives; students; staff members, guest & OPD Patients (visiting from distant place)

For the indoor patient and one relative food, Tea & biscuits are served free of cost where as for staff at subsidized rate @of Rs.15/- per Dish. The other OPD patients are served food @ Rs.40/- per Dish. Last year 69,354 dish food & 16515 Dish tea/ Breakfast have been prepared.

Diabetic Retinopathy Project

As mentioned in last annual report Diabetic Retinopathy Project has been started for Surat District in coordination with Public Health Foundation, Hyderabad. (Funded by Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee Trust) & Government of Gujarat.

As per this project four CHC (Community Health Center) Areth; Mangrol; Umarpada & Zankhvav were selected to implement the project & ophthalmic Assistants posted at these CHCs were trained by Divyajyoti Trust. The equipments purchased for the project were handed over to them and to the ophthalmology department of Surat Civil Hospital. Now the ophthalmic assistants at CHCs are showing the diabetic patients to retina consultant of Divyajyoti Trust through telemedicine & if required send them to Civil Hospital or to Divyajyoti Trust for the treatment.

Over and above we had given training to the Doctors, ophthalmic assistants & counselors of New Civil Hospital as well as Asha workers of Surat District.

The radio talk was arranged to increase awareness among the community for Diabetic Retinopathy. One video on the subject translated to Gujarati from English is being regularly displayed in OPD area. One booklet is prepared & distributed among diabetic patients. Pamphlet & posters were also prepared.

The World Diabetic Day was celebrated on 14th November at Mandvi Base Hospital and four selected CHCs as mentioned above and retina checkup of diabetic patients was arranged and talk was arranged for awareness.

To monitor the progress of project & reporting to the government authority different meetings at District level & State level were arranged.

One review meeting was arranged at Hyderabad & it revealed that among 11 districts of the 11 states in the country - Where the project is being implemented the progress and reporting both are best of Divyajyoti Trust.

Eye Bank

Divyachakshu Eye Bank is established for eye ball collection, preservation and utilization. Because of eye donation campaign awareness of eye donation is increasing so we got calls from local society for eye donation. We got call generally in the midnight but our ophthalmic assistants are going alternatively for eye ball collection.

This year eye donation fortnight was celebrated. Talk on eye donation was conducted at different places as well as video on eye donation was run. The local community was benefited by this video & talk. The detail of programme is given here under:

Smt. Kokilaben Prajapati is our house keeping staff since beginning. Her son Kenil is ITI trained in machinist trade. He was working as electrician cum helper at private shop but it was very irregular & with meager wages, so he requested us for vision technician training. We accepted his request. Kenil had completed his one year training successfully & got placement at private eye hospital, Surat. After one year he gets Rs. 10,000/- per month & perform at par with other qualified optometrists there. He is a strong backbone to his family.

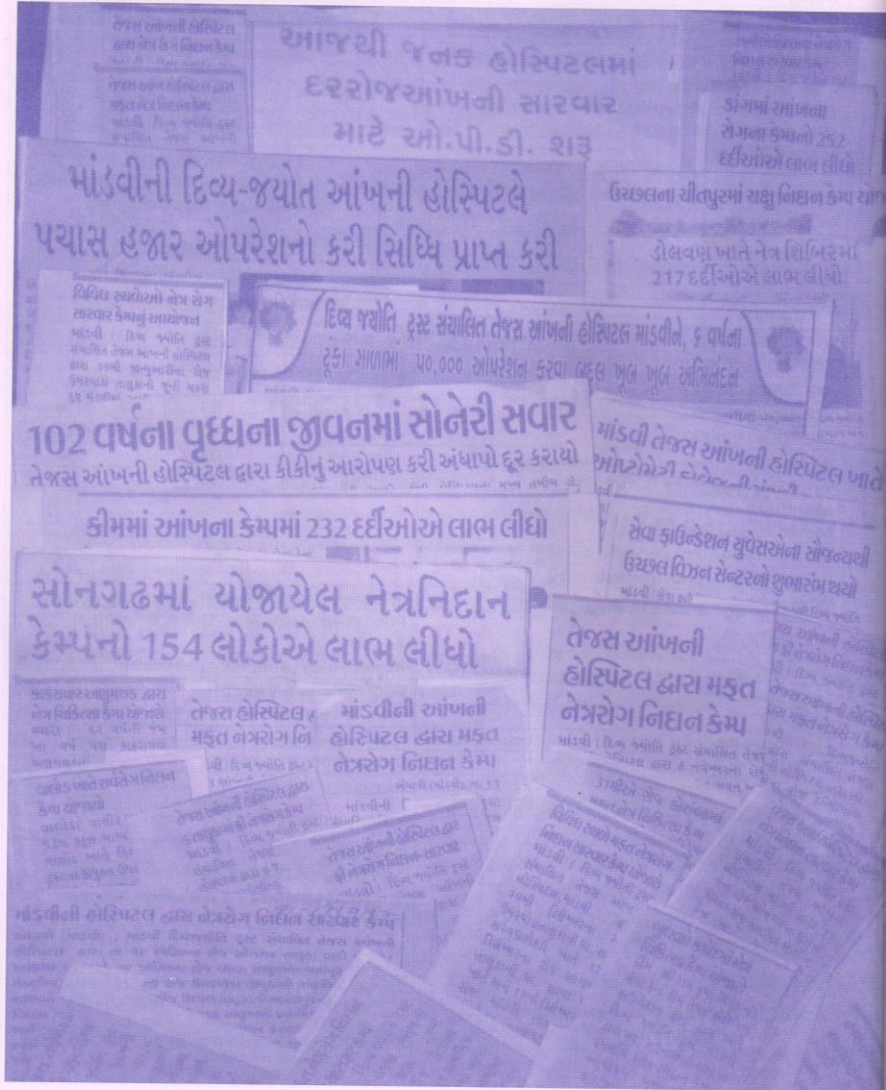

Financial Outlay

We are very happy to note that even in the seventh year, we have performed 8897 (71 %) operations totally free. The rest were either subsidised or paid. However, it is important to note that our charges are heavily subsidised against the prevalent market rates.

Total expenditure of the trust including hospital, diagnostic camps, training centre, research activities, C.B.R. programme, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva Medical & Optical store and staff welfare during the year was Rs.6.76 crore including recurring and non-recurring expenses. Total recurring expenditure was Rs. 6.52. crore whereas total non-recurring expenditure was Rs. 0.24 crore.

Patient income has remained almost the same against the last year which came to Rs. 1.68crore. It comes to 25 % of the total recurring expenses. Apart from that, we receive support from District Blindness Control Society – reimbursement for free surgeries and from Rashtriya Suraksha Bima Yojana (RSBY scheme) – the insurance taken by the Govt. for the BPL families. Other than that, organisations like Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision, Helpage India, Combat Blindness Foundation etc. are of great help.

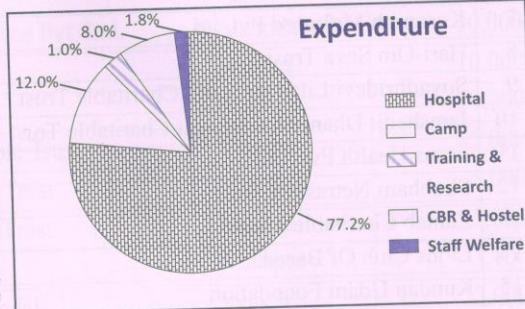
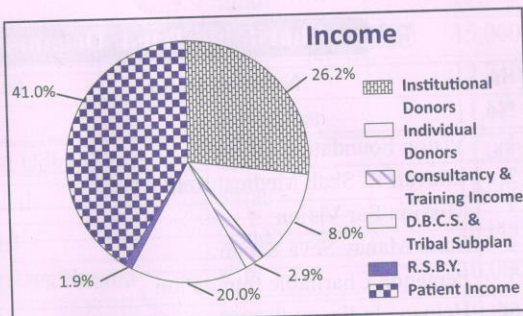
Kasturi bhojanshala which caters to the indoor patients & relatives, staff, blind children, guests and outstation OPD patients is getting support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Total number of dishes prepared and served is increasing year after year. Similarly, the expenses for Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan come from Poddar Tyres, Mumbai under their CSR programme. We sincerely appreciate continuous support received from them every year. However, local support from the Mandvi town is also significant for blind children.

The turnover of Janseva medical store has also increased and more and more patients are getting the benefits of the subsidised facility available here. Whatever little surplus we generate from this activity, is utilised to provide free spectacles and medicines to the poor patients. Training and consultancy services makes a small contribution of 2.9 %. We have started Diwali Ba optometry College from this year under Uka Tarsadia University. All the expenses will be born by us for the college.

This year, being the first year, there were only six students and so, we had to give a substantial amount of money to the college. All the remaining expenditure is managed through donations. We received 26.2 % from Institutional donors and 8 % through Individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust, Mumbai for eco-friendly activities on a regular basis every year.

Of the total recurring expenditure, we spent 77.2% on the hospital activities, 12 % on camp activities, 1 %on training and research activities, 8% on Community Based Rehabilitation activities and 1.8%on staff welfare activities.

With the grace of GOD, all these seven years, we never had a problem with the recurring expenses. We have to put in some efforts to generate donations BUT we are able to meet ends. We are sure, the same support will continue from donors and well wishers like you and many others even in future. We are going to take up a major project to create a campus at Amalsadi soon after we get the donated land cleared for non agriculture purpose. It will be a big expenditure of Rs. 27 crore in first phase and for that we will need support from all possible corners of the society.

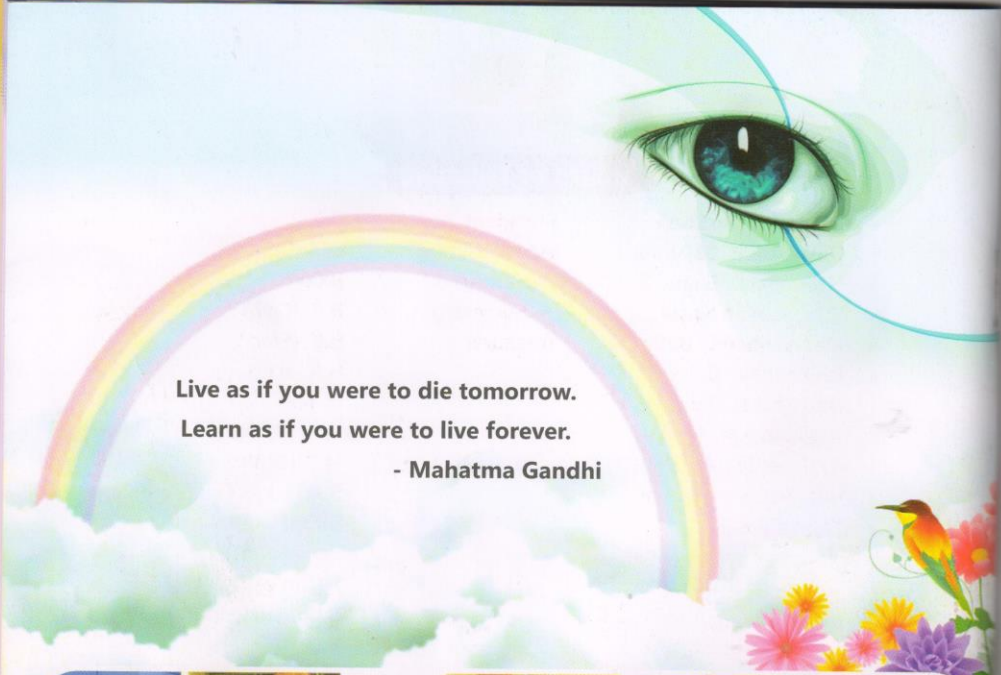
