Activities of Divyajyoti trust

Preamble:

Divyajyoti trust was established in the tribal area of Surat district at Mandvi to provide eye care services to the rural, poor, tribal people in the surrounding areas with keeping in mind the ideas and ideals suggested by Swami Vivekananda and Mahatma Gandhiji of going to villages and serving the poor people.

Activities:

The activities started by setting up a 40 bedded (now 100 bedded) eye hospital in Mandvi town from 22nd May, 2011. Daily OPD is run where all types of eye diseases are treated - more than 150 out patients are examined daily. Daily more than 25 eye operations are carried out.

There are 11 full time Ophthalmologists working in the hospital and in addition, visiting consultants from Surat, Vadodara, Ahmedabad and Mumbai come at regular intervals. With that we are able to take care of all types of eye diseases. Glaucoma, retina, cornea and Paediatric Ophthalmologists are available full time. Other consultants visit us as per the details given below.

- We organise two diagnostic eye camps every week in 100 kms. radius surrounding Mandvi and bring all surgical patients to Mandvi in our 40 seater bus.
- Poor camp patients & one relative are provided three meals, accommodation, surgery and post-operative medicines and glasses free of cost. Because of all these, we are getting very good response from our community.
- We are catering to a population of 2.5 million in 2000 villages around Mandvi from Surat, Tapi, Bharuch, Narmada, Navsari, Valsad, Dang and part of Nandurbar district of Maharashtra.
- Various training activities viz. short term and long term training of Ophthalmologists, Ophthalmic assistant training of one year duration, Ophthalmic nursing, OT boy and optical fitting etc. are going on round the year.
- Bachelor course in Optometry of four years duration is also being implemented under the banner of UkaTarsadia University.
- All types of eye care is provided and hence both types of research activities – clinical and epidemiological - in eye care are also being undertaken routinely.
- We provide eye care services at Netrang and Jhankhva CHCs under public private partnership with Govt. of Gujarat where our Ophthalmic assistant runs a daily OPD and Ophthalmologist visits the centres on Wednesdays and Friday to perform surgeries.
- We provide eye care services at Vyara in the eye department of Janak Smarak Hospital.
- Community Based Rehabilitation services were provided to incurably blind individuals from Mandvi taluka between 2012 to 2014, in Umarpada and Mangrol blocks from 2015 to 2018 and in Vyara taluka from 2018 to 2020. We examined all the 40 + age group individuals with the help of our field workers moving door to door in all the villages. All the incurably blinds identified during the process were provided training in activities of daily living, mobility and social rehabilitation was done. All the young individuals were trained in vocational activity and school age children were enrolled in local schools. By now, we have rehabilitated more than 450 blind individuals. A unique activity of doing door to door fundus photography, tonometry, blood sugar check and vision testing was implemented in Umarpada and Mangrol blocks where we examined close to 60000 individuals in 40+ age group.
- From June 2013, a hostel for blind children is functional. It started with 14 students, today there are 13 students. We take care of their academic progress alongside providing them comfortable accommodation and nutritious food. We teach them braille, computer and music in the evening hours.

Thus, dedicated & hard working skilled staff & doctors are the real heroes of the fame earned by the hospital.

Now, to serve the Society on a larger scale & with better facility, a new campus development at village Amalsadi, Tal. Mandvi, Dist. Surat with facility of 200 beds, 10 operation theatres, OPD which can house 300 patients, with latest state of art facility, Optometry college, community kitchen and staff quarters etc. is under process for which your whole hearted support is expected. We are sure, all of you will provide necessary support and we hope to shift to the new campus within one year.

From Darkness to Light

Shantaben (Name changed) of Tal – Uchchhal, Dist-Tapi has total 10 members in her family including family of her two sons. 65 years old lady was suffering from blindness since 2 ½ years. One day her husband carried her to Uchchhal vision centre for checkup. From Uchchhal they were referred to Mandvi & sent to Mandvi by bus.

At Mandvi doctor diagnosed with bilateral cataract & dacryocystitis & advised surgery. But it was mandatory to do covid test before surgery and as the result of RTPCR test took 3 days time, they had to stay in the hospital. As her husband was not ready to stay in hospital for 3 days, he denied to get corona test done. Our staff counseled them very much (hard) & convinced them. Corona test report was negative, so we did her DCR surgery in her right eye and after 11 days in left eye.



After 15 days of DCR surgery, cataract surgery was done in right eye and on next day left eye was also operated.

After DCR surgeries in both eyes followed by cataract surgery, Shantaben got her vision back & is very happy.

Now, after 2 ½ years of suffering from blindness, she got light in her life. Her daughter in laws are free from her responsibility and can do their daily routine easily. Shantaben will look after her grand children and live happy family life. Her husband comments "here the doctors are so sincere & dedicated to take care of patients until they get vision". We are grateful to them & pray for their success.

Hospital

At Present we have 100 bed facility for eye care patients. From 2011 to Nov. 2021, i.e. during 10.5 years duration, we have completed 1 Lakh eye operations, for that all credit goes to our Doctors & Staff members. We had planned lunch with all staff members to appreciate & congratulate our team.

This Year Dr. Zalak Shah completed her 1 year fellowship and left. Dr. Sheetal Chaudhari left from Nov 2021 after completing 10 years services (to start her own private clinic).

Dr. Akruti Jariwala, Dr. Astha Patel, Dr. Vidhi Patel & Dr. Dhruvi Champaneria Joined us as comprehensive ophthalmology fellows. Dr. Dhruvi Champaneria is working at Vyara satellite center and so, now, we have full time Ophthalmologist at Vyara satellite center.

Dr. Nilesh Nayak, Senior Ophthalmologist practicing at Bardoli since last 20 years, started visiting us on every Thursday (full day) & Saturday (1/2 day) from august 21. His presence is very helpful to train the doctors and for complicated surgeries.

This year we had to purchase new OCT Machine as the old one needed replacement, so we requested our donor - Pentagon Charitable Trust and they readily accepted our request and donated new OCT machine.

During this year we operated maximum 71 patients on 31st December. Our total performance reached 1392 during December, which is highest for the year (2021-2022).

We had an opportunity to operate some rare cases like a 100 years old lady who had live maggots in her orbit, which were removed. One gentleman who had lid tear with canalicular tear was operated successfully late at night. One little girl with severe malnutrition was treated and a lady having neurological issue was also treated.

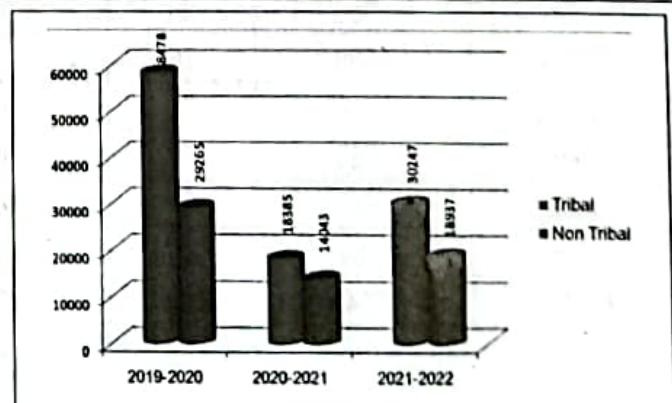
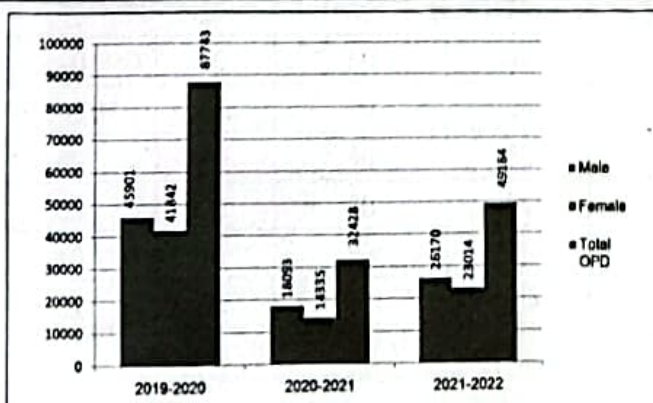

Nathubhai (Name changed) of vill. Godsamba, Tal- Mandvi is a land labour. On 1st Feb., as per his routine, returning from farm at 10:00 PM, met with an accident. A rickshaw driver hit him & run away. His left eye lid got torn and there was bleeding. Nathubhai shouted for help & people working nearby gathered immediately. They informed family of nathubhai & carried him to our hospital.

At 11 o'clock at night our doctor & emergency staff checked him and prepared for surgery. Along with lid tear, naso lacrimal duct was also torn. The surgery is kind of plastic surgery of eye (occuloplasty), we don't have full time occuloplasty surgeon but our paediatric ophthalmologist with help of glaucoma fellow did successful surgery. Doctor replaced the torn duct with plastic tube to prevent watering through eye in future.

On next day when bandage was removed we observed some swelling, so we advised him to stay for one more day.

Nathubhai is the only earring member and looking to his financial condition, his surgery was done free of cost. He & his family members are happy & pray to god for progress of our hospital.



• Paediatric Clinic :

Paediatric consultant Dr. Ansuliben Sood & fellow Dr. Uma Shroff are taking care of paediatric patients and good no of children are getting treatment.

Oculoplasty surgeon Dr. Vasviben is visiting hospital every Wednesday regularly. Similarly Neuro ophthalmologist Dr. Tanujaben Rakhe is regularly visiting on alternate Wednesdays and taking care of neuro ophthalmology patients.

This year oculoplasty consultant Dr. Harsh Shah from Ahmedabad visited us on 30/10/2021 and gave live demonstration of oculoplasty surgeries to our doctors.

Divya Chakshu Eye Bank

The main objective of the trust is to take care of all types of eye diseases. We obtained approval under Human Organ Transplant Act (HOTA) since beginning and so, to collect & preserve the cornea, Eye Bank is in existence since long.

The cornea collected from donors/other eye banks are used for transplant purpose/training of doctors and research purpose. Govt. provides reimbursement @ Rs. 1000/- for each eye collected as eye donation.

This year we performed 140 corneal transplant surgeries.

Family's Happiness

Pushpaben (Name changed) (age - 41) is native of Chitrakut - Uttar Pradesh, but her husband stays in Surat since last 30 years & works in textile field. So after marriage, she also migrated & settled in Surat. The couple has 2 children.

3 months ago, Pushpaben had some injury in her eye but neglected and developed infection. Over a period of time, she visited some hospital and started medicine but did not get cured. She again visited some other place where somebody suggested them to visit Mandvi.

At our hospital, doctor examined and diagnosed corneal infection and suggested corneal transplant surgery. He also informed that surgery was the only way to save the eye, in addition, he also informed that vision will not get restored after this first surgery. They were also informed that due to trauma, cataract had also developed and cataract surgery was also required.

After corneal transplant & cataract surgery, pain was relieved and got some vision also.

If they had not visited our hospital, the left eye would have to be removed. But here she got her vision and relieved from pain. The couple is very happy and now lead a happy family life. They feel the hospital is a boon for the poor.

New Eye

Bachubhai (Name changed) a 70 year old is native of Amreli Dist-Bhavnagar had cataract surgeries 6 years ago. After 5 years of surgery (i.e. one year ago), he suddenly lost his vision in left eye.

Bachubhai had migrated to Surat before one year and started a fruit shop with his wife Lilaben (Name changed). Slowly he lost his vision in right eye also. Now Lilaben has to look after her husband, household matters & to run a fruit shop. She visited other hospitals but the estimated cost shown there was very high to bear. Somebody suggested them to visit Mandvi.

At Mandvi, doctors examined and diagnosed corneal opacity in both eyes & suggested corneal transplant. After receiving good quality cornea, we called them and corneal transplant surgery was done on 20/7/21 & 3/9/21 respectively for left & right eye. After surgery Bachubhai got vision.

The financial condition of family is average but the family with high self respect and honestly paid for the surgery." with "The financial condition of the family is average but the family has a very high self respect and they honestly paid whatever amount they could pay.

Now Bachubhai is able to perform his routine work, so his wife feels relaxed. Their Children, residing at Amreli also feel relaxed. Bachubhai says, hospital is a boon for people like him & prays to the Almighty GOD for progress of the hospital.





Diwaliba Optometry College

Diwaliba Optometry College was started in 2017. It is gaining good reputation among students. 6 students of our first batch have completed their course and have joined their jobs / masters degree. The convocation function was conducted on 20th March-2022 at the university. Our gold medalist student Miss. Maitry Adhvaryu joined as faculty in our college and she will now join masters in optometry.

2nd batch students got paid internship at different places and doing their job nicely. Due to past students' performance & reputation, next batch students will also get the same opportunity.

3rd batch students will appear for sixth sem. exam in July-22 & go for internship from 16th August.

Consultancy – Networking – Evaluation

Mission for Vision, is a funding agency and provides technical guidance also to its partners, is supporting our Vyara & Khapar vision centres for more than five years and some other projects also.

The evaluation & consultancy of some eye hospitals funded by mission for vision is assigned to Dr. Udaybhai. The evaluation of vision centers run by H. V. Desai Eye Hospital in Maharashtra was done by him in November-2021 & some vision centres run by Sewa Sadan Hospital, Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh in December-2021.

Research

Due to presence of full time doctors & latest requirements, we have big number of patients getting treatment over here & hence we have a big opportunity for research work.

As per the legal requirements, it is mandatory to have an ethics committee registered with Drug Controller General of India for research work. We have completed all the formalities. For each and every drug/ injection introduced for research, permission is to be taken from ethics committee.

We have made it mandatory for each fellow doctor to conduct a study, which needs to be registered on CTRI portal. So we have registered 5 studies during May-21 & one study in June-21.

It was known from scientific research that UVC Rays & Methylene blue eye drops are effective to cure corneal ulcer, we have started a study on the same from August-2021. This type of study is first of its kind in our country.

Trial of “Ranibizumab” drugs ponsored by Intas co. through Lambda Research Organization was started from September after completion of all the formalities between Lambda Research & Divyajyoti Trust. The first patient was enrolled in Dec-21.

A study of efficacy of newly introduced “Tacrolimus Eye drops” by Intas Co. for treatment of allergic conjunctivitis was also started & 7 patients are enrolled in the same.

One study of Toric IOL & Multifocal IOL given to us by the research organization





Euprexia-sponsored by Omni marketing Co., was started after the permission from ethics committee obtained in October-21.

Enrolment for PMMA, Hydrophilic & Hydrophobic lenses manufactured by Sharpedge Co. was started from Nov-21. Total 1020 patients were enrolled by the end of March.

The team from Lambda research organization visited us for site inspection on 5-6 January & 2-3 February for 1st & 2nd visit respectively.

Publication

One article on "Non Mydriatic Fundus photography as an alternative to indirect ophthalmoscopy for screening of diabetic retinopathy in community settings; a comparative pilot study in rural area" was published in British Medical Journal – open access Feb-2022 edition.

The article on "Operational Research Study on compliance of spectacle wear among school children" was published in "Indian Journal of Ophthalmology" in June-2021 edition.

The thesis prepared by Retina fellow Dr. Kavin Shroff on "Efficacy of oral Azithromycin and Doxycycline in patients of moderate to severe meibomian gland dysfunction (MGD)" was published in April-21 edition of Indian Journal of community ophthalmology.

Outreach Activity

- (a) Diagnostic Camp
- (b) Field Worker's activity
- (c) Survey

(a) The diagnostic camps organized within 100km radius area surrounding Mandvi Taluka is an important activity to achieve our objective to serve the community close to their doorsteps.

Nearly 40% of our surgical work consists of the patients found through diagnostic campus which is a substantial figure. Due to corona pandemic, camp activity was totally prohibited, but from December-2021 gradually it was restarted.

In absence of camp activity, we recruited field workers in the surrounding area of each of our vision centre to find out patients, refer them to vision centre and transport them from vision centre to Mandvi Base hospital. With this innovative idea, we helped needy patients to get much needed treatment.

A get to gather of camp's wellwishers was organized on 2nd January 2022.

Satellite Centres & Vision Centres

During corona pandemic (until Sept-21), Vyara satellite centre was handed over to Govt. of Gujarat to convert it into a COVID designated hospital. From Oct-21 onwards, it was returned to us. We started sending an ophthalmologist twice a week.

At Netrang satellite centre, doctor from Mandvi visits twice a week & does surgeries regularly.

At Zankhvav centre, operation theater is under repairing, hence patients are referred to

Mandvi.



Vision Centres

The rotary club of Roundtown Surat donated latest equipments & furnitures for 7 vision centres under its global grant project, which includes – Auto refractor, Slit lamp, chair unit, Retinoscope, projection chart-with LED bulb; trial set with frame, paediatric trial set, Computer set; Steel cupboard, 15 Nos plastic chair, Television & display board. All these equipment were handed over to us on 27th June-2021 during a small function in which Dr. Ashwinbhai Gandhi from Gandhi Hospital, Bardoli was chief guest. With all these equipments installed, our vision centres are among the best equipped vision centres in country. All these vision centres are technically enriched with Telemedicine facility, hence the doctor sitting at Mandvi hospital can examine, diagnose & treat patients through this facility. Total 12,781 patients were benefited through telemedicine examination during the year.

The community meeting was arranged at Dediapada vision centre on 29th July & at Sagbara vision centre on 28th September.

The ophthalmic assistant working at Kim, Kosamba, Sagbara & Dediapada vision centres were imparted optical fitting training. So the sale of spectacles increased substantially, which created a good impression in community.

During corona pandemic period the camp activity was totally stopped. Transportation facility was also reduced. In such a challenging situation Divyajyoti Trust recruited field worker for different (particular) area, to find out the patients having eye related problems and send them to Mandvi through Vision centres.

In Vyara taluka, a field worker of Jesingpura found a 9 year boy – Dipak (Name changed) at Navapada faliya. He caught burns due to fire which occurred through short circuit & was not going to school. Due to burn injury, his vision was also reduced. As he could not go to school nor to play, he was irritable & misbehaved with others.

Field workr suggested his parents to visit Mandvi. Dipak & his parents visited Mandvi, here doctor diagnosed bilateral cataract & advised surgery. We arranged for anesthetist and both eyes were operated one by one within one month.

After surgery, now Dipak got his vision, so got confidence to go out of the house to play with friends. He got admission in std. 3 and studies regularly. His parents are very happy, for progress of their son and thankful to hospital & pray for progress in future.

Vivekananda PragnachakshuBhavan

All the blind children were sent back to their home due to COVID pandemic, online education was continued. After the situation became normal, all the children returned to Hostel.

This year, total 4 children were sent to Mogri Residential School for further education as it is our policy to accommodate the children between 5 to 12 years age only (Teenage children are sent to residential schools and we take care of their needs from behind the curtain). We helped Darshna & Amisha get admission in Anand College.

Two blind persons applied for Job, among them one blind lady was recruited as housekeeping staff. She is performing her duties sincerely.

Staff Welfare Activity

On 22nd May-2021; hospital completed 10 years of functioning, so we wanted to celebrate it in a big way. But due to corona pandemic, we restricted it to only Ganesh puja, lunch with staff members, distributed sweets to all staff members & gifted one digital wall clock to each staff member. We gave chance of Ganesh puja to 5 couples.

During COVID period, we prepared special “kadha” in our kitchen for all staff members as well as street dwellers passing near the hospital. We provided food for specially posted staff at Govt. COVID centre, Mandvi.

We distributed clothes to the children of labourers working at Amalsadi campus. We even arranged for their primary education & lunch on daily basis. The fund for lunch was provided by Mr. Ravi & Mrs. Shobha Mehra of M/S Mehra Eye Tech Pvt. Ltd. – Mumbai. Teaching aid for these children was provided by Mr. Bharatbhai Lumbhani of Khodiyar Jewellers, Mandvi.

Our house keeping staff Mrs. Gunvantiben hoisted flag on 15th August and on 26th January mother of staff Mrs. Prabhutaben Gajiwala hoisted the flag.

We have our workers’s co-operative society established for our staff members. In this, staff contributes monthly saving amount and when in need, they avail loan on minimum interest compared to the market. Also co-operative society helps them to purchase Cooking oil, Food grains, Tea etc. on installment at subsidised rate.





Community kitchen in service of patients

Community kitchen is functional since beginning for indoor patients, their relatives, staff members, students as well as doctors and blind children.

Pure vegetarian food is served in this kitchen for camp patients & relatives; tea-breakfast & 2 time meal is provided free of cost. For the staff, it costs Rs.15/- per dish at subsidized rate & for OPD patients it costs Rs. 40/- per dish.

The cost of kitchen (bhojanshala) is totally born by Chhanyado (Surat Manav Seva Sangh Surat). We are very thankful to Chhayando for supporting kitchen activities for all these years.

Local people also occasionally donate ready made food or food grains for patients as well as blind children. The list of such donors is given separately.

Financial Outlay

We are very happy to inform you that in the 11th consecutive year, we have performed 65% of the total operations free of cost. The rest of the operations were performed either at subsidised rate or with full payment. However, our full payment is also subsidised as against the costing at private hospitals.

Total recurring & non-recurring expenditure of Divyajyoti trust including hospital, diagnostic eye camps, training centre, research, community based rehabilitation, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva medical & optical store and staff welfare all put to gather has come to Rs. 9.34 crores. Of which, Rs. 6.03 crore was recurring expenses and Rs. 3.31 crores was non-recurring expenditure.

On the income side, patient income was Rs. 2.26 crores which is 36.77% of the total recurring expenditure. Per surgery reimbursement from District Blindness Control Society was a substantial support. Reimbursement of free surgeries on poor patients under Rashtriya Surksha Bima Yojana which is now converted into Aayushman Bharat scheme is also received but that is a small amount because cataract is no more reimbursed under this scheme. In addition to all these, assistance from Vision Foundation of India, Mission For Vision etc. was also substantial.

Kasturi Bhojanshala run by the trust provides food to patients, relatives, our students and staff etc. is financially supported by Chhanyado – Surat Manav Seva Sangh. We sincerely appreciate their help over all these years. Swami Savitanandaji from Tarsada provides for all the cooking oil needed for the year since last many years. Poddar tyres, Mumbai is supporting our Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan under their CSR head since last many years. The support from local citizens of Mandvi town for the blind children is also noteworthy. We are thankful to all these well-wishers for their help.

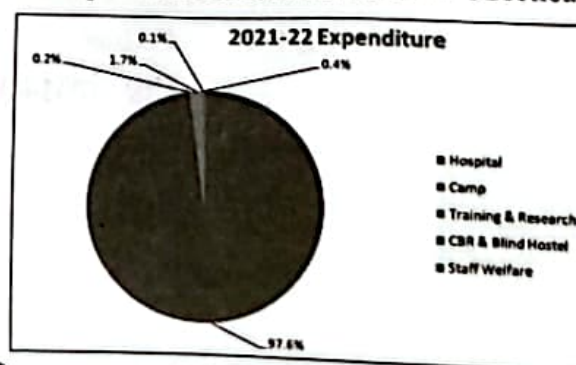
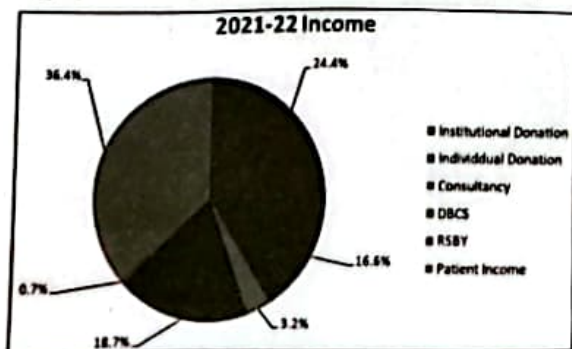
Janseva medical & optical store provides subsidised medicines and glasses to the poor masses of the area. Large no. of patients avail the services. Whatever surplus generated from this activity is used for free medicines and spectacles that we distribute freely. Training and consultancy work generates 3% of the total income. Divyajyoti trust takes care of all the deficit of Diwali Ba Optometry College after the income from student fees. That activity is also dependent on donations.

Corporates and Industrial donors provides for 26% of the total income. Individual donors contributes 7.53% of the total income. Here, we would like to take note of regular yearly support from Lilavati R. Shah medical relief trust, Mumbai.

Out of the total recurring expenditure, 78.77% was towards hospital activities, 5.30% towards diagnostic eye camp activity, 4.97% towards training activities, 1.35% towards research activities and the remaining 12.76% towards outreach activities – satellite centres – vision centres etc.

In all these 11 years of our existence, with the grace of GOD and support of all the donors, we never had any problem in meeting recurring expenditure. However, we have to put in some efforts to procure donations, but we are able to get enough funds for our requirements. We are sure, same unconditional support and warmth will be available in the future also. This year, during corona pandemic, the generous support from all the donors and well-wishers has kept our enthusiasm level high. We thank all the donors from the bottoms of our heart.

As you all know, we have embarked upon a very ambitious project of Campus construction at Amalsadi village. The construction work was started in Feb. 21, we need big amounts as donation to complete this project. We are expecting support in terms of donations from all the corners of the society. We are registered under CSR act also and so, corporates can provide donation under their CSR head also.

10 year old Raju (Name changed) of village – Vegi, Tal – Mandvi stays in Surat with his family as his parents work as labourer and they have a rented house in Surat. When Raju was in std.4, suddenly he lost his vision, so his parents carried him to nearby hospital. At that hospital, the estimated expenditure for treatment was high to bear, as during corona pandemic his parents lost their job. In the mean time they returned to their native place Vegi, where someone suggested them to visit Mandvi.

At Mandvi, doctor examined him & diagnosed retinal detachment in both eyes, but in left eye nothing could be done, where as in right eye, after surgery vision may get restored. As Raju's parents were not able to afford the cost, we assured them of free surgery. After they got convinced, we arranged for anesthetist & Retinal detachment surgery was done.

On next day when patch was removed, Raju could not see. So doctor again counseled that for retinal detachment surgery, some oil is to be injected to settle down the retina and after some time the oil is to be removed. After 15 days, Raju got his vision. Now, he could start his studies & live a normal independent life, Raju's parents are very happy to see him living normal life & pray to god for good health to our staff & doctors.
