## 15 Annual report 2024-25

It gives us immense pleasure to present to you the 15th Annual Report of Tejas Eye Hospital, run by Divyajyoti Trust.

Since its inception in May 2011, the hospital has earned remarkable acceptance and trust from the community through its humanitarian work. From a modest beginning, after 14 years of dedicated service, we have now grown into a 200-bedded Eye Institute, equipped with state-of-the-art infrastructure and advanced technology.

The activities of Divyajyoti Trust are wide-ranging and deeply impactful. Along with providing comprehensive eye care management, we have been actively engaged in offering technical education to local youth and creating employment opportunities for them. The Trust has also contributed significantly towards research and rehabilitation of the visually impaired, while simultaneously training doctors, particularly ophthalmologists, to serve society with skill and compassion. In addition, we regularly conduct educational programs to spread awareness and take pride in spearheading environmental initiatives aimed at protecting and preserving our green surroundings.

During the past year, our efforts have resulted in more than 1 lakh detailed eye check-ups and Surgery of 14,000 + patients. We successfully performed a large number of surgeries, including corneal transplants, and provided rehabilitation and training to more than 50 students and visually impaired individuals. What makes these efforts even more meaningful is that the majority of our services were offered free of cost to the poor and at reasonable rates to others, ensuring that no one is deprived of care due to financial constraints.

These achievements have been possible only because of the generous support of our donors, the encouragement of our well-wishers and the cooperation of government officials. We remain deeply grateful for your trust and continuous assistance.

We are also happy to announce the completion of our new Amalsadi Campus, which offers a spacious work environment, hostel facilities for students and ample parking areas. The hospital will shift to this new campus after June 2025. This milestone has been made possible through the invaluable contribution all our donors which includes Tarsadia Foundation and Sathi Foundation among many other donors and that of Smt. Nipunaben and Shri Vijaybhai Hirachand Dalia, whose donation of land has enabled us to expand our services for the greater good.

ABOUT OUR HOSPITAL

Tejas eye hospital run by Divyajyoti trust at Mandvi Dist . Surat has been providing quality hospital & community based eye care services since 2011 with the vision " Nobody should be unnecessarily blind due to lack of services ". Started with 40 bedded eye hospital, now it has 100 bed facility and will have 200 beds indoor capacity very soon, when we will shift to newly developed Amalsadi campus near Mandvi .

Tejas eye hospital is located in Mandvi town ; Dist. Surat –Gujarat & covers population in 100 km radius area around Mandvi and patients from Surat, Tapi, Bharuch, Dang, Navsari, Valsad, Narmada & even from Maharashtra are getting regular services at affordable prices and poor tribal people are getting services free of cost .

At the hospital, patients screening is done in OPD by ophthalmic assistant & examination by general ophthalmologists. Patients who need the expert subspeciality services are referred to the speciality clinics. The patients of vision centres & satellite centres are also screened by our general ophthalmologist through telemedicine facility which is really a boon for outreach patients . Besides regular OPD & OT services; 24 hour emergency services are provided to the patients.

We have good OPD units ; OT team; indoor units; laboratory, ophthalmic investigations, janseva medical & optical store.

We have technical training facility for vocational courses such as vision assistant, ophthalmic nurse, OT technician, optical fitting as well as Diwaliba optometry college to run degree course in optometry. Over and above all, we run a community kitchen which provides free food to indoor patient & their relative ( one relative of each patient ) blind children, students and at subsidised rate to staff, doctors as well as other OPD patients . Transportation facility is also a boon for patients.

## GENERAL OPHTHALMOLOGY OPD :

General ophthalmology OPD is one of the busiest clinics at TEJAS EYE HOSPITAL . Most of the patients referred after screening by ophthalmic assistants are examined here. One ophthalmologist is there to see the patients through tele consultations from all vision centres & satellite centres.

At present, Dr. Dhara Sardhara, Dr. Pooja Kapadia, Dr. Mansi Shah, Dr. Krutika Patel are general ophthalmologists and Dr. Jagruti Jariwala, Dr. Darshana Patel, Dr. Pritesh Desai, Dr. Trupti Shah and Dr. Nileshbhai Naik are visiting ophthalmologists.

This year, we got centurian phaco machine as donation from Gujarat Chemical Port Ltd. under the leasershhip of Shri Hemantbhai Desai, which has been installed and in use from 1-8-24 .

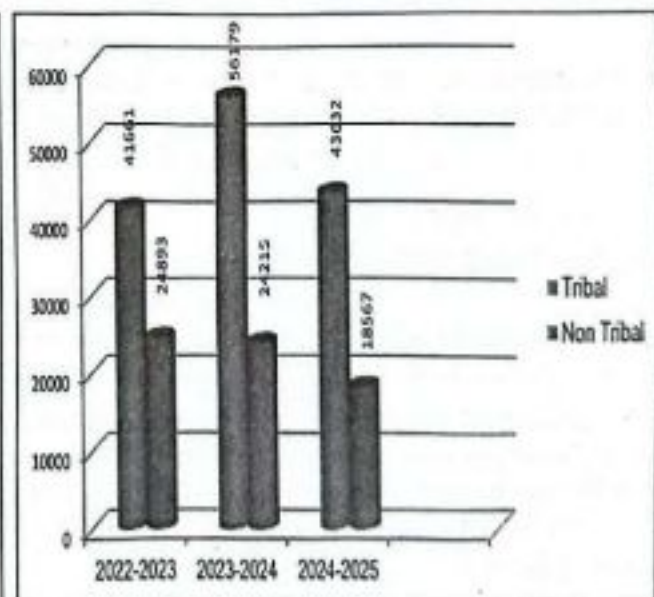
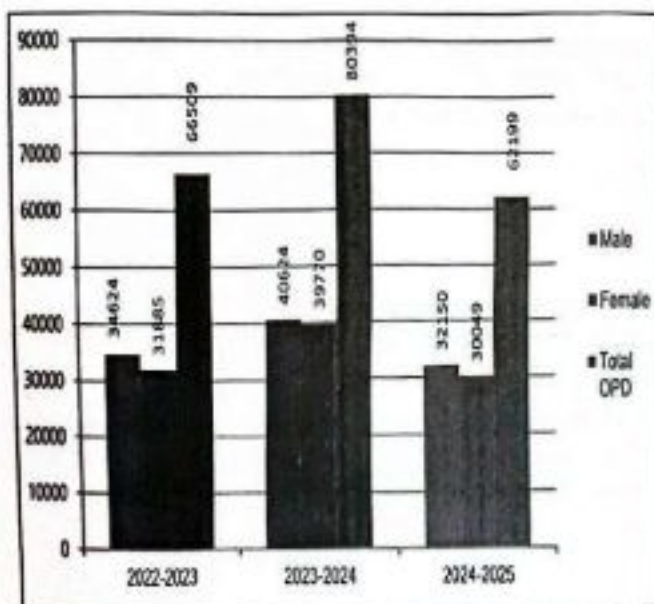
## Cataract services :

Globally, cataract is the single most important cause of avoidable blindness and cataract surgery has been shown to be one of the most effective health care interventions . Cataract is related to aging and cannot be prevented, but cataract surgery and insertion of an intraocular lens are highly effective, resulting in early visual rehabilitation.

This year total 9148 cataract surgeries including small incision cataract surgeries & phacoemulsification were done & out of 9148 surgeries, 7151 surgeries were done free of cost (i.e.78 % of cataract surgeries ) .

## Sub speciality services :

### **A) Vitreo-retina Clinic**

In the era of modern ophthalmology, vitreo-retina is the most challenging as well as demanding speciality globally .

Unlike seasonal patients in cataract , VR clinic is loaded with patients round the year. Our vitreo retina department is well equipped with the modern technology for investigation & treatment.

Dr. Kavin Shroff is full time VR surgeon . He is taking care of VR patients as well as ROP patients .

### **B) Cornea Clinic:**

Conea is one of the essential components of eye to form a clear image of any object . Corneal diseases are the major causes of blindness in the developing countries .

At present, we have full time cornea consultant Dr. Himarshi Mehta Shukla. Besides we have two visiting consultants Dr. Pinkal Shiroya & Dr. Darshan Kansara once in a week .

### **C) Glaucoma :**

Glaucoma is the second leading cause of blindness in the world. The risk factors of glaucoma include - age, family history of glaucoma; diabetes, eye injury, far or near sightedness and long term steroid use .

We don't have full time glaucoma consultant at present but visiting consultants Dr. Abhishek Vansadia & Dr. Khushboo Shah visit us every Tuesday & other Thursday respectively on regular basis to take care of glaucoma patients .

### **D) Paediatric ophthalmology:**

We provide all type of child eye care services such as cataract, strabismus management, paediatric diseases / syndromes, refractive error, amblyopia, ROP screening ( done by retina consultant ) and low vision .

Dr. Uma Shroff as paediatric consultant takes care of these patients . One study on amblyopia was also done during last year in collaboration with University of Electro communication & a Japan based company and as a part of the same, one team of 10 members including paediatric consultant and other research team members visited Japan also.

**E) Oculoplasty clinic :**

Visiting consultant Dr. Shalin Shah takes care of these patients on weekly basis. Tuesday is the day of his visit . He is doing big number of endo nasal DCR surgeries. On 21st May, he has done orbitotomy surgery & on 7th September he did Exenteration (removing every thing from orbit for cancer patient)

**F) Neuro-ophthalmology :**

Dr. Tanuja Rakhe from Surat visits regularly twice in a month to take care of these patients. Total 183 patients were treated in this clinic.

**G) Low vision service :**

Low vision is the vision problem that makes it hard to do every day activities. It is the vision loss that cannot be corrected with surgery or conventional eye glasses. Low vision services can help them with best possible uses of existing vision . During the year, 6 patients were examined; 3 patients were benefitted with near vision glasses as well as one patient was benefitted with low vision device.

**H) Ocular prosthesis:**

In ocular prosthesis services we have provided 6 readymade artificial eyes and for two patients we made it as per requirement. For this, we have great support of shri Jashwantbhai Mehta from Mumbai.

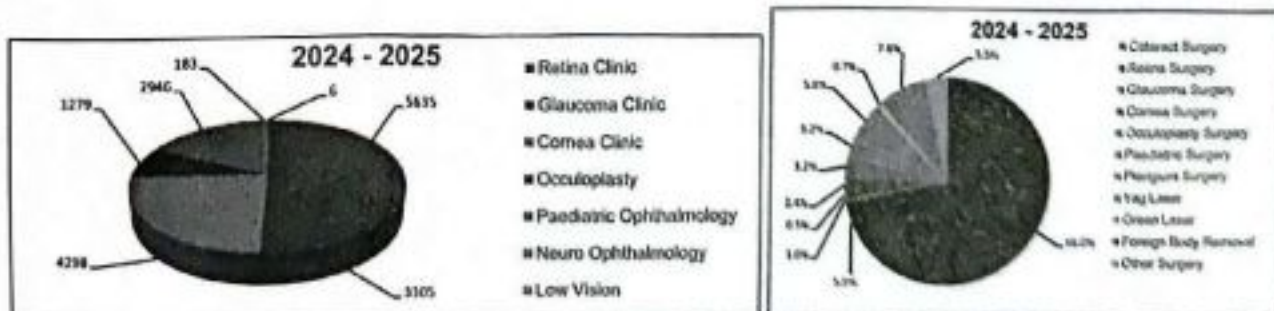

**Out reach activities :**

The main objective of DIVYAJYOTI TRUST is to provide eye care services to the community at its doorstep; so we arrange number of activities including eye camps, school screening, ROP screening, truck drivers screening, community based rehabilitation programme , vision centres and satellite centres.

**1) Diagnostic eye camps :**

Divyajyoti trust's eye camps are very popular among community since beginning as we provide free transportation, free meal to patients and one relative; surgery, spectacles and medicine with good quality care .

During this year, we have arranged total 241 camps sponsored by various donors; KAPS authority, Fullerton company and arranged by CBR team ( with support from DBCS). In addition, 95 small camps were conducted by field workers of CBR project . So, at the end of the year we can say that total 336 camps were arranged. Total 33553 patients were screened and 3126 brought to the hospital for surgery & surgery of 2670 patients was done .

**2) ROP project :**

Retinopathy of prematurity(ROP) screening for premature babies & babies born with low birthweight is on going activity with funding support from Mission For Vision. Actually, we are doing it since 2013-14. Timely screening and treatment for retina of premature babies can save the sight of such babies & we can prevent them from becoming blind .

For awareness among parents of premature babies, we arranged parent's meeting on 16/12 at Bardoli & on 20/12 at Navsari respectively. The statistical details of ROP work is given in table no. 06

**3) vision centres & satellite centres :**

The main object to establish Divyajyoti trust is to provide eye care facilities to rural – tribal people at their door steps. To fulfil this objective, we run 3 satellite centres and 10 vision centres (including newly inaugurated Maliba vision centre )

All vision centres & satellite centres are well equipped with latest state of art facilities including optical fitting and medicine dispensing as well as all centres are connected with telemedicine facility. The patient seated at vision centers as well as satellite centers are screened by the ophthalmologist present at Mandvi. The patients who need surgery are collected at particular centre and sent to Mandvi base hospital for surgery .

During the year maximum 23 patients from Dediapada vision centre and 59 patients from Uchchhal vision centre were sent for surgery on one day .

Though number of efforts are put to reach out to the needy patients, during this year number of patients visiting vision centers and satellite centers were reduced compared to last year, so we added another innovative activities to improve patients load as follows .





- ◆ We recruited one more staff in addition to one regular staff for field work .
- ◆ If patients referred through field worker visits within three days of home visit from radius of 5km, that patient's screening is done free of cost & subsidy would be given for medicine & spectacles . For this job, we take help of sarpanch, leader of a village, Asha worker etc.
- ◆ For publicity of our work, we visit gramsabha, paste posters at public places, distribute pamphlets etc.
- ◆ Home visit by our supervisor is done for the operated patients whose surgery is done free of cost .

### A New Hope Through Vision – Sumanben's Story

Patient: Sumanben (Name changed), Age: 68, Location: Village Dhanora, Taluka Nandurbar, Maharashtra

Village Dhanora, is located about 20 km from Nandurbar, is a remote and underdeveloped area. Sumanben, a 68-year-old resident of the village, lives with her children. She suffers from chronic asthma and to make matters worse, she gradually lost her vision over the past few months. This left her completely dependent on others and emotionally distressed.

Due to lack of awareness and prevailing disbelief in modern healthcare among villagers, her family didn't actively seek treatment. Sumanben had almost lost all hope.

One day, a relative visited her home and informed the family about an eye check-up camp organized by Divyajyoti Trust in Dhanora. We assured them that all consultations and treatments, including surgeries, would be provided free of cost.

Encouraged by this, Sumanben attended the camp. During the examination, she was diagnosed with cataracts in both eyes. After detailed counseling, she was reassured that her vision could be restored through surgery—and that it would be done completely free of cost under the trust's initiative.

Her first cataract surgery (right eye) was successfully performed on 20th September 2024, followed by the left eye surgery on 21st September 2024. On the third day after surgery, her vision improved significantly to 6/12 in the operated eyes—where earlier, she had only light perception (PL/PR) vision.

Today, Sumanben is overjoyed and full of confidence. She has regained her independence and can now take care of herself. What once seemed like a hopeless life has been transformed into one filled with vision, dignity and new hope—thanks to the dedicated efforts of Tejas Eye Hospital and Divyajyoti Trust.



**4) Truck driver's screening camps :**

Generally truck drivers spend most of their time on road, so hardly find any time for their health check up or eye check up; so we do eye check up camps for truck drivers since long and contribute in avoiding accidents which might occur due to poor vision of truck drivers!! Since long, Mission For Vision has remained our funding agency. This year GUJRAT CHEMICAL PORT LIMITED sponsored this project .

**5) School screening :**

School Screening is an important activity as it is helpful in avoiding blindness among school going children. Even their academic activity may get affected and they may lag behind in studies due to refractive error. Statistical detail of school screening activity is given here under.

**6) Umarpada Comprehensive Eye Care project :**

This project is supported by Siemens Healthineers. The objective of this project is to make whole Umarpada taluka free from avoidable blindness. To achieve this objective, door to door screening is done by our health workers; awareness and education programmes are organised to educate the people about eye diseases as well as treatment of the same .

To execute this project, we have recruited 7 field workers and trained them; 6 among these field workers visit the home and do vision test and check BP/ RBS, take photo of anterior segment, one field worker checks IOP and take fundus photo of the person above 40 years through door to door visits .

After screening of whole village is done, one eye camp is organised in that particular village. In this camp, patients are being diagnosed, given spectacles & medicines to those who are in need and the patients who need surgery to be done are carried to Mandvi base hospital .





- All 40+ individuals visiting camp site undergo fundus photography & IOP check also, making it a comprehensive examination at the door steps.

### 7) Community Based Rehabilitation ( CBR ) programme in SONGADH TALUKA OF TAPI DISTRICT.

The CBR programme was started in January 23. During this year in July 2024, we sent our CBR workers for training of 2<sup>nd</sup> module to BPA Ahmedabad.

The population of Songadh taluka is around 2,33,770. The villages of Songadh taluka are divided in 8 clusters. Door to door screening of 1,20,975 people in 8 clusters was done this year. The other 1,12,795 people were screened last year. 5355 people were referred to Mandvi Hospital & among them 1144 were for cataract surgeries. Total 910 cataract surgery was done of these people & spectacles were given to more than 5000 patients.

We found 167 incurably blind individuals during screening of the taluka. Rehabilitation of 48 people was done and for others it is in process. We helped 38 people to get blindness certificate & 38 people to get bus pass as well as 33 people got enrolled to get pension under " Sant Surdas Yojna". 7 children were enrolled in integrated education.

#### **Case Study: At Age 101, Grandpa Regains His Sight!**

Patient: Raghunathji (Name changed), Age: 101, Location: Native of Ibrahimpur Village, District Pratapgarh, Uttar Pradesh

Raghunathji, a 101-year-old farmer from Ibrahimpur, had undergone cataract surgery in his right eye about a year and a half ago. However, over the past 6–7 months, he gradually lost vision in his left eye. This led him to stop working on his farm—something he had been actively doing when he had good vision. His inability to see clearly deeply affected his morale and due to financial constraints, he did not seek treatment.

His great-grandson, a vegetable vendor living in Olpad (District Surat), invited Raghunathji to stay with him. Upon learning about his condition, neighbors and well-wishers suggested visiting Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital.

At Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital, Raghunathji underwent a thorough eye examination by the ophthalmologist. Investigations revealed a mature cataract in his left eye. The hospital's counselor explained the available treatment options, the procedure involved, expected outcomes, and various affordable packages.

The family chose a suitable package, and cataract surgery was successfully performed.

Today, Raghunathji is able to see clearly again. His vision has been restored and along with it, his confidence and happiness. His family is overjoyed and expressed immense gratitude for the high-quality and affordable eye care available in a small town like Mandvi. They now actively recommend Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital to others in need of eye treatment.





## 8) Spectacles (Chashma) Project:

### Case Study: The Unconditional Love of a Mother

This story is a powerful reminder that no one can take the place of a mother. Even at the age of 95, a mother's love remains unwavering and selfless.

Ambaben (name changed), a 70-year-old woman from Valod, District Tapi, lives with her brother and assists him in agricultural work. Ambaben never remarried after a divorce earlier in life due to social and psychological challenges. She has three siblings, all of them are married.

In recent days, Ambaben began experiencing significant vision loss, making it difficult for her to perform her daily tasks. When Divyajyoti Trust organized a diagnostic eye camp in Valod, it was her 95-year-old mother who lovingly accompanied and supported her to the camp, despite her own age and physical limitations.

At the camp, Ambaben was diagnosed with bilateral cataracts and was referred to Tejas Eye Hospital, Mandvi for further treatment. Both mother and daughter traveled together in the Trust's vehicle to the hospital.

During the pre-operative assessment, Ambaben's blood pressure was found to be dangerously high and surgery was temporarily postponed. She was referred to a local physician and started on medication. Once her blood pressure stabilized, her right eye surgery was successfully performed.

Just one day after surgery, Ambaben was able to move around independently—something she couldn't do earlier due to near-total blindness. Witnessing this transformation, her 95-year-old mother was overjoyed and relieved, seeing her daughter regain her independence and dignity.





### Research:

Tejas eye hospital run by Divyajyoti Trust provides all types of eye care services & around 1.5 lakh patients are being benefitted through its services annually. Hence we have good research opportunity for different type of injections, eye drops, lenses, medicines etc. We have formed ethics committee to get approval before any research / study. Not only that but also, we arrange training programmes to improve skill / capacity of our research personnel.

This year, we arranged a research methodology workshop on 7-8-2024. Dr. Souvik Manna from AIIMS ( Delhi) and Dr. Abhay Kavishwar & Dr. Naresh Chauhan from GMC, Surat were invited for the same as faculty.

Ms. Mamataben ( retd . research scientist from USA ) visited us on 6<sup>th</sup> march to guide us in strengthening research documentation.

Mr. Anirudh Gaurang from Hyderabad (PRASHO) visited us on 8<sup>th</sup> march 2025 to guide in our research activity.

Till date, we have completed studies as listed here under.

1. Tacrolimus eye drops study : completed as multicentric study with 7 participants enrollment.
2. Forskolin eye drops study : completed as multicentric study with 4 participants enrollment.
3. PMMA lens study for sharpedge : completed with 350 subjects

5. Hydrophobic lens study for sharpedge : completed with 350 subjects
6. Omni toric lens study : completed with 125 subjects
7. Omni multifocal lens study : completed with 125 subjects

9. Amblyopia study : completed with 40 subjects (in collaboration with University of Electro communication & a Japanese company)
10. CTR study : completed as multicentric study with 108 subjects.

### **Vision Restored, Health Recovered – A New Beginning for Ramiben**

Patient: Ramiben (Name changed), Age: 61 Location: Village Doswada, Taluka Songadh, District Tapi, Gujarat

Ramiben, a 61-year-old woman from the remote village of Doswada, lived in extreme poverty. Her only son, a farm laborer, is the sole breadwinner for the family. With barely enough income to afford two meals a day, seeking medical treatment was simply not an option.

For over a year, Ramiben had been suffering from severely reduced vision, which prevented her from performing even basic daily tasks. Her overall health was also poor and the family had lost hope of any improvement.

Everything changed when Divyajyoti Trust organized a free eye check-up camp in Doswada. Ramiben and her son attended the camp, where she was diagnosed with bilateral cataracts and referred to Tejas Eye Hospital, Mandvi for surgery.

However, during the preoperative investigations at Mandvi, her case became more complicated. Her hemoglobin level was critically low—just 2% and her blood pressure was also dangerously low. Most hospitals would have deferred the surgery, but the compassionate and determined team at Tejas Eye Hospital accepted the challenge.

Two hospital staff members even voluntarily donated blood and despite being an eye hospital, with no in-house transfusion facility, the team arranged blood transfusions, coordinated physician consultations and started appropriate medications.

Within just 2–3 days, her hemoglobin level improved from 2% to 7% and her blood pressure stabilized. Once her condition was fit for surgery, she underwent cataract operations on January 2nd and 3rd, 2025 for the right and left eye, respectively.

Before surgery, her vision was extremely poor—only Hand Movement and Perception of Light. After the successful surgeries, her post-operative vision improved to 6/36 and 6/18.

Ramiben can now walk independently, manage her daily tasks and most importantly, she feels healthy, hopeful and happy. Her family is deeply grateful to the staff of Tejas Eye Hospital and Divyajyoti Trust for going beyond routine care to save not just her vision—but her life.





### DIWALIBA OPTOMETRY COLLEGE

The students of DIWALIBA OPTOMETRY COLLEGE are doing well, hence college is getting good reputation. This year, 23 students are enrolled in first year .

Convocation function of 4<sup>th</sup> batch was held in Dec. 24.

World optometry day was celebrated by organizing quiz & poster competition among students.

4 of our students participated in annual conference of optometry at Panji Goa & there, they realised that their practical skill was better than most of the other students.

Students of 3<sup>rd</sup> year participated in "OPTIKA MUMBAI" trade fare & exhibition & gained insight into the latest advancement in optometry .

Our first batch student Ms. Komal is now head of optometry department of 'Agarwal's eye hospitals of Gujarat region .

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> year student Ms. Jyoti Rekha Pani won the first prize in quiz competition held online by Optometry Confederation of India on world sight day among all India students. She got a cash prize of Rs. 3000/- & life time free membership of Optometry Confederation of India. Other student Shraddha Patil won 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in photo contest.

All our students got 100% placement at very good remuneration. Year 2020 batch students completed internship & got Rs. 28000/- salary /month. The internship stipend for these students is Rs 10000/- per month.

#### **Case Study 2: A New Hope for Tarunbhai - A Vision Restored, A Life Reclaimed**

Tarunbhai (name changed), a 50-year-old tailor from Yavan village in Jalgaon district, Maharashtra, lived a quiet and solitary life. Unmarried and with his parents no longer alive, he depended on his brother and sister-in-law for basic needs after losing his vision nearly a year ago. Unable to continue his tailoring work, he felt helpless and burdened by his reliance on others.

A turning point came when his niece, who resides in Khapar, visited him. Moved by his condition, she brought him to the Khapar Vision Centre for an evaluation. There, Tarunbhai was diagnosed with bilateral cataracts — a condition that could be treated with surgery to restore his sight.

Thanks to the efforts of the vision centre, arrangements were made for Tarunbhai and other patients to be transported to Tejas Eye Hospital in Mandvi for surgery. After the necessary pre-operative investigations, he underwent cataract surgery on his left eye on June 3, 2024, followed by surgery on his right eye on July 8, 2024.

Considering his financial situation, both surgeries were performed free of cost.

Today, Tarunbhai is back to tailoring, working independently and earning his livelihood once again. Filled with gratitude, he now refers others with vision problems to Tejas Eye Hospital and prays for the continued growth and success of the hospital.

**Life Saved, Sight Restored**

Patient: Sanjaykumar (Name changed), Age: 35, Location: Bardoli, Gujarat

Sanjaykumar, a 35-year-old resident of Bardoli, is the sole earning member of his family and works at a textile factory in Palsana. He commutes daily between Bardoli and Palsana for work.

On October 9th, he met with a serious accident, suffering facial trauma near the orbital (eye) area. He was immediately taken to a nearby hospital in Bardoli, where doctors advised emergency surgery. Fortunately, his brother-in-law—an employee of Tejas Eye Hospital—intervened and brought him to Mandvi, Tejas Eye Hospital for further care.

At Mandvi, a detailed assessment revealed multiple fractures in the orbital bones. Doctors decided to postpone surgery until the facial swelling subsided. The family was reassured that the entire treatment would be covered under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana, ensuring no financial burden.

Once the swelling reduced, Dr. Shalin Shah, our visiting Oculoplasty surgeon, performed the complex reconstructive surgery on October 21, 2024. The procedure was lengthy and took more time than expected, which caused some inconvenience to other patients. However, the hospital staff explained the critical nature of the surgery and received their cooperation.

A second surgery was later required for complete recovery and this too was successfully carried out.

Today, Sanjaykumar has recovered very well. His vision and facial structure have been preserved and his family is deeply grateful to Divyajyoti Trust and Mandvi Tejas Eye Hospital for providing timely, life-saving care—completely free of cost under PMJAY scheme.

### Financial Resources

As operations expand progressively, operating costs naturally increase. By the grace of God, we have been able to meet the steadily rising operational expenses year after year. Even in the 14th year, we were able to perform 62% of surgeries completely free of cost. The remaining 8% were partially subsidized and 30% of patients paid according to our charges, which were also offered at highly concessional rates.

The total annual expenditure of Divyajyoti Trust, covering all activities, amounted to ₹28.41 crores. Of this, recurring expenditure (hospital services, diagnostic camps, training centre, research, CBR, Vivekanand Pragma Chakshu Bhavan, Janseva medicine and spectacle shop, staff welfare, etc.) was ₹9.41 crores and non-recurring expenditure was ₹19 crores. Against this, the total income was ₹26.42 crores, comprising ₹9.92 crores for recurring expenses and ₹16.5 crores for non-recurring expenses.

Direct income from patients amounted to ₹2.98 crores, which constitutes 30.04% of the total recurring expenditure. For the free surgeries performed, a grant per surgery was received from the District Blindness Control Society, amounting to ₹1.05 crores, which is 10.6% of the total expenditure. Under the Ayushman Bharat Scheme, reimbursements from insurance companies for surgeries performed amounted to ₹1.11 crores. In addition, the long-standing support received from Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision and Pentagon Trust is noteworthy.

Through Kasturi Bhojanalaya, meals are provided to patients and their attendants, students, blind children and staff. After accounting for income received from students and staff and donations received for the dining facility, the remaining cost of the dining service is fully borne by Chhanyado. The annual cost of cooking oil is fully sponsored by Pujya Swami Savitanandji (Tarsada). The entire expenditure of Vivekanand Pragma Chakshu Bhavan has been borne for last many years by Poddar Tyres, Mumbai. Contributions from local donors for blind children are also noteworthy.

At the Diwaliba Optometry College, run by Uka Tarsadia University, a significant portion of expenses is borne by the Trust even after receiving students' fees. Meanwhile, students enrolled this year in the Vision Assistant Certificate Course have been sponsored by Kakrapar Atomic Power Station, Mission for Vision and Joy of Helping, USA.

From institutional donors, 23.2% of the funds were received, including 8.6% under corporate social responsibility (CSR) from industrial organizations. Individual donors contributed 15.9%. Every year, donations are also received from Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust for the treatment of poor patients.

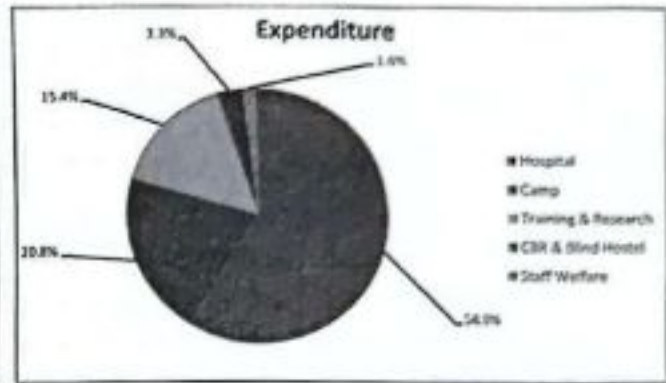
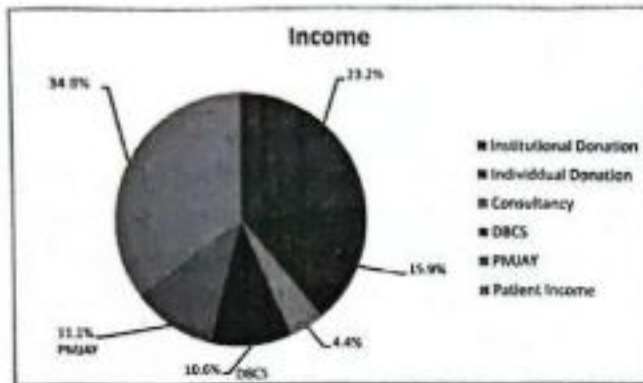
Of the total recurring expenditure, 58.9% was spent on hospital operations, 15.4% on training and research activities and 20.8% on outreach activities, which include camps, satellite centres, vision centres, ROP screening, school screening etc.





The campus development activities at Amlasadi are nearing completion by the end of the year. As commonly happens, the actual expenditure has exceeded the estimated budget. Significant additional costs are also expected for furniture and equipment. There is still a requirement of ₹4-5 crores. It is hoped that this need will also be met. The largest contribution to campus construction has come from the Tarsadia Foundation, USA.

With the expansion of the campus, the number of people utilizing the facilities will increase, leading to higher operating costs. We humbly request all donors to ensure that their support continues uninterrupted. We are confident that our socially oriented and socially beneficial activities will continue smoothly in the coming years as well.



### Liberated from Medicines – Life Became Smooth Again

**Patient:** Radhaben (Name changed), Age: 55, Location: Village Kamrej, Taluka Kamrej, District Surat, Gujarat

Radhaben, a 55-year-old woman from Kamrej, had been experiencing eye-related issues for the past 2-3 months. She visited a nearby hospital and was diagnosed with glaucoma, a condition that can lead to permanent vision loss if left untreated. However, unsure about the diagnosis and worried about the implications, she returned home without beginning any treatment.

Over time, her condition remained the same, but fortunately, a relative advised Radhaben and her husband to visit Tejas Eye Hospital in Mandvi for a second opinion.

At Mandvi, she was first examined by a general ophthalmologist, who once again confirmed the diagnosis of glaucoma and referred her to a glaucoma specialist. Initially, Radhaben was hesitant to accept the diagnosis—mainly because her vision was still relatively normal and she did not feel any major discomfort. However, after thorough counseling, she agreed to proceed with the recommended surgery.

Radhaben underwent glaucoma surgery (a procedure to improve fluid drainage from the eye and reduce intraocular pressure). The surgery was successful and now she is free from her earlier symptoms and no longer dependent on daily eye drops.

In many glaucoma cases, lifelong use of expensive eye drops and medication is required to control the disease. Radhaben's surgery has not only saved her from these recurring costs but also spared her of the burden of remembering to instill drops multiple times a day.

Radhaben and her family are now relieved, happy and deeply grateful to Tejas Eye Hospital and Divyajyoti Trust for their timely intervention, expert care and compassionate support.

#### If you are coming by train

- Vyara and Bardoli on Tapy valley line are the nearest railway stations about 30 kms away.
- On the main line from Mumbai to Ahmedabad, Kim which is 40 kms away is the nearest railway station. Buses are available to reach Amalsadi from Kim.
- For people coming from Mumbai, Surat is the nearest railway station. It is 65 kms away. Buses are available at one hourly frequency and it takes little more than 2 hours to reach Amalsadi (Surat-Kim-Mandvi route) from Surat.
- Nearest airport is Surat. Surat has good air connectivity with most of the big cities of the country. The other airport is Vadodara which is 150 kms away.
