

## **Height of Humanity!!**

Kishan Vasava - the ophthalmic assistant working at Umarpada vision centre, is a representative of young generation. Enthusiastic but lethargic - sensitive but irresponsible. What is this contradictory matter? Let us understand thoroughly.

When CBR programme was implemented in Umarpada & Mangrol talukas, our CBR supervisior Ajendra Sunva met Kishan Vasava. Ajendra counselled Kishan to go for vision technician training at Divyajyoti trust. Kishan enrolled in this training during 2015-16 and completed the same. Kishan is very sincere, hard working and honest. We offered him a job as an ophthalmic assistant at Umarpada vision centre, as he is native of the same place.

Kishan has a younger brother, Balram. Kishan enrolled him in vision Technician course next year. Kishan paid Balram's fees and relieved his father from his local job though his own

financial condition is not very sound.

One day while returning to Umarpada on his motorcycle, he met with an accident. He was driving on his side slowly but from opposite direction triple rider drunk motor cyclist with over speed hit him. Kishan was injured seriously almost near death. Luckily our other staff Mitesh Vasava (ophthalmic assistant at Dediapada vision centre), who was driving after him had seen this accident & immediately called 108. They carried him to Mandvi referral hospital. Kishan was not even properly breathing as blood filled his wind pipe from open mendible fracture.

Our administrator Shri Nikhilbhai rushed to the hospital as soon as he heard about the accident. Other staff also rushed. Dr. Udaybhai also reached there and with the help of anaesthetist Dr. Pratikbhai & Dr. Upendrabhai intubation was done so that respiration could continue. But no further treatment was possible at Mandvi, so we arranged to shift him to Bardoli. During Mandvi to Bardoli travelling, our staff nurses Sunitaben & Jayshriben and ophthalmic assistants Yatin Mistry, Mitesh Vasava & Bhavesh supported his breathing artificially. At Bardoli, it was found that no ventilator was available & also he had brain hemorrhage and looking to the seriousness, we decided to shift him to Surat where more facility is available.

We phoned in advance to Surat hospital, arranged for money as Kishan's family could not even think of it!! Kishan was admitted to a big hospital where his critical care was taken. After 3 days of being admitted in I.C.U., he was shifted to general ward, his maxillofacial surgery was done to repair 12 fractures on his face and relieved from hospital after 15 days. But he was kept on liquid diet only, we arranged his stay at our hospital only and took care for further 15 days. Afterwards, his stitches were removed and discharged from hospital and granted permission for regular food.

From above we have seen a caring, sensitive, sincere & loving person taking care of his family. But on the other hand, he was driving a two wheeler without license, without wearing a

helmet & not even paid insurance. This shows his total carelessness here.

After this incidence, we arranged to procure helmets & provided the same in three installments. 70 staff members registered their names for the same, and when we asked for license, there were very few who had it. It is very painful to note that our youth is careless in obeying the rules as well as in discipline matter.

On the other hand, our staff tried hard to give Kishan artificial respiration (In running ambulance staff nurse herself felt brethless), played an important role to save his life. The training to our staff in BLS proved a boon.

On one hand, we have seen such type of irresponsibility, lethargy of our youth, on another hand at the time of accident, almost 30 of our staff members were present at Surat hospital on toes. Some staff members helped financially also.

Kishan must have long life as his destiny, but regular BLS training of our staff; correct decision and implementation, kindness of our president and Trustees to bear the cost of an expensive hospital (almost 4.5 lakh Rs. born by trust which is an exception) - such multiple factors went in favour of Kishan & saved him and gave him a new life.

It's our great pleasure to present Ninth (9th) Annual Report to you.

The main object to start the eye care activity at Mandvi interior tribal area of Surat district was that, there was no eye care facility in the surrounding area. The other reason is the main expertise was in eye care, hence the work started with Tejas Eye Hospital.

The eye hospital started with 40 bedded facility converted into 100 bedded hospital within very short period. There are no. of factors for this success story, among which efficiency, behaviour & attitude of staff is an important aspect.

We put tremendous efforts to empower the staff members. We accept the strategy to train local youth so that the sustainibility of the staff improves. Not only that but also the training of doctors in phacoemalsification, SICS, cornea, retina etc. has earned high reputation. Hence no. of doctors are joining for training.

Last year we have started optometry college, which runs successfully.

This year we have done 13191 surgeries cumulative total being more than 70000 surgeries since beginning.

During the year we arranged technical training as well as life skill development training. Which has proved beneficial to staff members.

Due to rapid expansion, the present physical infra structure is falling short substantially. The plan is to develop a complete campus at Amalsadi village on a donated piece of land. At Amalsadi, we will provide spacious campus with latest facility to community for each activity. We are looking for the support of our well wishers and donors for that purpose & are confident for the same.

## The year at a glance

This year we could procure Bi-directional meter for solar system installed at the roof of new building (Chandraben Piyushbhai Kothari Training Centre).

Helpage India Authority - the sponsorer for cataract surgery did the audit of our activity.

New Paediatric Ophthalmologist Dr. Anshulee Sood joined us from 7th May '18 & because of her regular presence, paediatric patients treatment activity increased substantially.

Annual Day was celebrated on 20th May as it was nearest Sunday to 22nd May which is foundation day of our Hospital. A blood donation camp was arranged & we collected 28 bottles blood. Ganesh poojan and cultural programme followed by dinner was arranged for staff & family members.

Dr. Rajesh Kapse & Ms. Mitashree from H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune visited us and guided us for NABH accreditation relevant changes.

On 29th July, first Annual CME was arranged for ACOIN (Association for Community Ophthalmologist of India). Resident doctors from all over Gujarat participated and presented their topics.

Dr. Udaybhai participated in AIOS meeting for developing guidelines for infection control held on 12th August at Delhi.

During May'18, Registration for NGO Darpan was done. Audit for ISO 9000:2015 was also conducted during September'18.

During September, IHMS software was installed at all vision centres & satellite centres to reduce manual labour and to have accurate data & even monitoring from Mandvi base hospital can be easy.

Vision Foundation of India - one of our funding agency plans for 'Village Adoption Programme' - with Divyajyoti Trust, so pre-planning meeting was held on 21/6 & 2/8 at Mumbai which was attended by Dr. Udaybhai. In this project, we have to adopt a village and have to screen all the residents. Accordingly, Gujarat Government is also planning to have "Taluka Adoption Programme". Meeting for the same was arranged on 8/2/19 at Gandhinagar. Similarly Gujarat Government is planning to start telemedicine based vision centres; so meeting with health commissioner was arranged & attended by Dr. Udaybhai.

Independance Day was celebrated. The flag was hoisted by Shri Ashokbhai Patel - Retired Principal of Mandvi Highschool. The Republic Day was celebrated with the presence of Dr. Hemangbhai Chaudhari well-known radiologist of Mandvi & our wellwisher.

During the year, 2nd batch of Vision technician & ophthalmic nursing had completed their training. The certificate distribution programme was arranged in presence of Dr. D.R. Shah - Vice Chancellor of Uka Tarsadia University & Shri Kiritbhai Patel - Vice President. These certificates were given under the programme of Skill India Project.





Divyajyoti Trust was running five vision centres at Mangrol, Umarpada, Sagbara, Dediapada and Bardoli. Three new vision centres were added this year - one at Khapar - sponsored by Fullerton Co. through Mission for Vision, Second at - Kosamba sponsored by Deviba & Gulabba family & third at - Kim - Sponsored by Scale Project supported by H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune.

As a part of outreach activity, vision testing of truck drivers was arranged under Raahi Project - supported by Sightsavers.

Similarly vision testing, Diabetes checkup & blood group determination of truck drivers was carried out with the support of Shell Co., Hazira, Surat. Total checkup of 2500 truck drivers was done.

For corneal transplant surgery, we have to avail permission under Human Organ Transplant Act (HOTA) which was obtained earlier & renewal was done on 20th February.

Dr. Sheetalben Chaudhary, our senior most ophthalmologist completed 10000 surgeries this year & we felicitated her on our 8th Annual Day.

Diagnostic camps are major contributing activity among all the activities of Divyajyoti Trust. Behind one successful camp, there are so many contributing factors like - donors, publicity persons, managers, local supporters etc. So to appreciate all of them, we had arranged a get to gather of camp's wellwishers. Large no. of wellwishers attended the programme & gave their valuable suggestions to improve the camp activity. We are thankful to them.

One Sanitary pad dispensing machine was installed under CSR Project of DCB Bank for the facility of our female staff, patients & their relatives.

#### **Happy Joyful Life**

Navinbai Rathod aged 35, native of vill. Dabka Tal. Choryasi, Dist. Surat was suffering from blindness. He got wooden injury some five months ago while tree cutting. Navinbhai was alcoholic & not taking proper care of his eye.

Navinbhai visited Bhatlai camp with his wife, where he was diagnosed as having cataract in both eyes. Our team brought him to base hospital. As he is alcoholic & has congenital deafness & in addition now blindness, he was panicky & shouting loudly because of blindness & deafness both. Our counselor talked to him and made him quiet and prepared for surgery.

First, right eye was operated and on next - day when bandage was removed, he shouted loudly due to joy as he could see. On third day his left eye was also operated and he got vision in left eye also. He returned home independently as his vision was restored.

Now Navinbhai's wife is fully relaxed as her responsibilities was doubled because of Navinbhai's blindness. But now Navinbhai will do his duties on his own, will take responsibility of family and his wife will look after her household duty & they will live a happy Joyful life.





## Hospital Respiration

The comprehensive Eye care facility available under one roof, its reasonable cost & quality - earned a good name among patients, hence no. of patients visiting the hospital are increasing.

From May'18 we have started fast track OPD facility for the paying patients. With this facility waiting period is reduced to almost zero & one staff escorts the patient for refraction, doctor's opinion, required tests on express basis.

The patient registered under fast track OPD needs lesser time compared to the patient registered under regular OPD. This new change earned a good response.

From this year, everything required for each surgery, all the equipments / instruments are autoclaved in a seperate drum so as to reduce the risk of infection.

At Mohandayal Hospital Pardi; Ophthalmology department was run with help of ophthalmologist, from Maharashtra, but by latest Govt. order, they can not operate in Gujarat, unless they are registered in Gujarat. Because of this changed rule, doctors stopped coming. We have started sending our ophthalmologist & technical staff, twice in a month as requested by the trust administration. Also we trained their OT staff.

One female patient Champaben was admitted here for surgery. During pre-operative test, we found that her hemoglobin level was only 1.5 gms, If we allow her to go back home, there was a possibility that she may die without any treatment. Our staff members donated blood and after her hemoglobin level reached satisfaction level, her surgery was done.

Similarly 2 months old girl Anjali, had infection in her eye - with a complaint of watering & whitening of cornea but her parents were afraid of surgery. After a strong counselling they got ready for surgery. After surgery infection was removed & we could save her eye.

On 14th of July, Dr. Sheetalben operated her mother, which shows her extreme confidence level.

On 29th July, we had inspection for renewal of Eye bank licence & now we got approval also.

Generally after Diwali, our no. of OPD patient increases as winter starts. This year we had maximum 83 surgeries in one day, which included 3 surgeries done under general anaesthesia.


For quality of our work, we are very cautious and constantly put our efforts to improve it. This year representative from Mission for Vision carried out a survey on post operative patients for their vision (i.e. outcome analysis of cataract patients) & they found that our quality of surgery is better than the quality norms established by World Health Organization (WHO). This is a matter of pride for Divyajyoti Trust.



## Speciality Clinic 20

The main objective to start an eye hospital is to provide all types of eye care facility under one roof, hence all efforts were made to procure latest equipments for each eye care related problem since beginning.

At the end of 8th year, we have full time retina surgeon, Glaucoma surgeon, Cornea surgeon & Paediatric ophthalmologist. Other experts of Occuloplasty & Neuro Ophthalmology are available on visiting basis.

No. of paediatric patients have increased substantially as paediatric ophthalmologist Dr. Anshulee Sood joined us from May-2018.

Corneal transplant surgery done by Tejas Eye Hospital is also noticeable. This year 181 no. of corneal transplants have been done including max. no. of corneal transplant during December 18.





## Diabetic Retinopathy Project 👰

Diabetic Retinopathy Project started from February'17 was supposed to be completed by 31st March'19, but PHFI authority had extended it upto June'19. This project was implemented in 10 states among which our performance was good.

Under the aegis of this project, various training activities were conducted which included family physicians of Surat district; medical retina training for ophthalmologist; ASHA workers & ophthalmic assistants.

Over & above that, for monitoring of the project, various meetings at district level; state level as well as main centre - Hyderabad were arranged at regular interval.

The main objective of this project was to make the community aware of diabetic retinopathy so as to detect the disease as well as to take treatment at the early stage, different programme for awareness were also arranged. For the above purpose one workshop on 11th July was arranged at South Gujarat Chamber of Commerce - Surat. Total 106 persons attended the same. World Sight Day was celebrated at 4 CHCs - Areth, Mangrol, Umarpada & Zankhvav.

On 14th November - World Diabetes Day - diabetic retinopathy screening camps were held at 5 vision centres - Uchchhal, Sagbara, Dediapada, Mangrol & Umarpada. On the same day, one rally for awareness was arranged at Mandvi. A diabetic retinopathy screening camp was arranged at Areth on 22nd November.

Efforts were made to create peer group of diabetic people so that they can meet periodially & understand each others as other problem & treatment at Surat Civil Hospital & Mandvi. However, we did not succeed due to very low awareness among patients.

## ල්ල Outreach Activity : Diagnostic Camp ල්ල

Camp activity is the most important activity among all the activities of the trust, because through this we can provide eye care facility to the interior tribal community surrounding the area.

This year, total 458 camps were arranged. Total OPD was of 44935 patients & from them, 5197 cataracts & 583 other speciality operations were done. It means that out of total 13191 surgeries 40% of the same was done from the patients screened through camps.

For the publicity of camps, we are providing one staff for publicity & driver with 4 wheeler since beginning but last year we changed the publicity system for near by villages to Mandvi, by sending a publicity staff on two wheeler. This way, we can reduce the expenses of camp. We are also trying to assign task of publicity to local youth whom we pay incentives. However, it will take sometime to accept this system for camp's sponsors - wellwishers & staff.

Shri Ramkrishna Trust, Surat sponsors the camp every year at Dang. This year, on 12th August, the trust sponsored camp at Pimpri, Dist. (Dang) Ahwa. One camp at Ahwa was also arranged, where in near future one charitable hospital is coming up. One mega camp sponsored by Kakrapar Atomic Power Station was also organised.

Apart from camp, this year screening of Bus drivers of Mandvi bus depot was done. Total screening of 80 bus drivers was done, similarly screening of truck drivers under Rahi Project proposed by Sightsavers was started from January 2019.

School screening of different school students was done. Raj Jariwala Foundation suggested the school screening of Vill. Mokhaman in Dang.

1013 students from Vashishth school of Bardoli were screened and 111 students found with refractive error hence spectacles were given & 4 students were referred.

5000 students of various schools near Hazira, Surat were screened which was sponsored by Shell Co.-Hazira.

#### Rejuvenation through Sight Restoration

Bajiabhai B. Vasava (Age 55) is native of Akkalkuva Tal. Nadurbar. He had lost his vision since 1 year. A native of his village brought him to Mandvi.

At Tejas Eye hospital, ophthalmologist diagnosed him to have cataract in both eyes and advised for surgery. Bajiabhai was afraid of surgery but our counselor talked to him and assured him of free surgery and restored vision. Finally he agreed for surgery.

At first, his right eye was operated and on next day after surgery, the vision was restored, so agreed for left eye surgery. On third day, his left eye vision was also restored after surgery. Now, Bajiabhai & his son both are happy as Bajiabhai can see after almost one year's blindness. Bajiabhai felt that he got a new life.

Now he will go to earn money and help his family. He gives blessing to our staff.





### Netrang - Zankhvav - Vyara Satellite Centre

In Eighth Annual report, we had introduced Ramesh Vasava - opthalmic assistant working at Netrang satellite centre. Because of Rameshbhai's sincerity, honesty & hardworking ability, the working at Netrang centre is found to be the best.

At Zankhvav satellite centre, the repairing work of operation theatre took a long period and it was completed in February 2019. Now the operation theatre is in working condition & the surgery is being started.

At Vyara centre, because of presence of full time ophthalmologist, no. of OPD and indoor patients have increased substantially.

CBR project for Vyara taluka is now implemented hence CBR workers also refer the patients to Vyara satellite centre. Due to weekly camps sponsored by Fullerton Co., one or two weekly camps by CBR workers, no. of patients referred by camp is also increasing for surgery.

For indoor patients, tea & biscuit facility at Vyara, one tea-coffee vending machine is installed. Hot water facility for indoor patients has been provided by installing geysers in bathroom.

Looking to increased work load at Vyara, one nursing staff has been recruited for detailed counselling of patients. Maximum 20 operations on 18/2/19 were done totaling 980 operations during year.

Survey work by CBR workers is going on. School screening of Vyara school children was done during Oct.-18 to Dec.-18. This activity is supported by Mehta Charitable Trust, Mumbai.

Sukhdi & Vitamin 'A' with albendazol tablets were distributed among children of sugarcane labourers in and around Mandvi taluka.

#### Personality development / Capacity Building

Shri - Ramkrishna Paramhans - The spiritual teacher of Swami Vivekanand very well said "learn until you live." We follow the fundamental message and regularly arrange training programme - workshops for our staff as well as students.

The detail of technical training is given separately in this report. Apart from technical training, for life skill development / capacity building, we had invited Smt. Rupalben shah and conducted workshop on various subject. For this programme, we had categorised our staff members in three groups (1) Members of core group, (2) Clerical staff & field workers (3) Drivers, peons & house keeping staff.

The subjects on which workshops were conducted are (1) Leadership development (2) Team work (3) Positive attitude (4) Time management (5) Communication (6) Feedback.

Such type of efforts, help us to develop confidence among our staff which enhances sincerity & commitment towards the organisation.





### Vision Centres

Total 5 vision centres at (1) Dediapada (2) Sagbara (3) Uchchal (4) Umarpada & (5) Bardoli were functional. Adding to them 3 new vision centres at Kim, Kosamba & Khapar have been inaugurated during this year (in December-2018).

As there is no eye care facility nearby Khapar area & because of our prestige, the work load at Khapar centre is increasing. The centre is supported by Mission for vision from grant provided by Fullerton Co. Weekly camps are also being arranged regularly at Khapar vision centre as per request of Fullerton Co. Kim centre is supported by Scale project via H.V. Desai Eye Hospital, Pune. Kosamba centre is supported by one NRI family (Gulabba and Deviba's family members).

We have provided telemedicine facility at all the vision centres. Sagbara vision centre was the only exception. From January 2019 we could get broadband connection at Sagbara vision centre also, hence now we can diagnose & treat the patients of all the vision centres from Mandvi base hospital with help of telemedicine facility.

#### **Corneal Transplant**

Niruben Giloter (age 33) is native of vill. Nani Naroli Ta. Mangrol, Dist. Surat. She is housewife & her husband is mason. 3 years ago, Niruben had chemical injury in her both eyes and under went the treatment at some hospital. Some fifteen days ago (Before getting referred to Mandvi). She had again an injury and developed infection in her left eye. She visited some hospital nearby but O.T. was shut for some reason and was referred to Mandvi.

The doctor at Mandvi Tejas Eye hospital examined her and diagnosed that there was infection in left eye which should be cleaned & then it was necessary to do corneal transplant surgery. Niruben visited the hospital with her 6 years old son and naturally was hesitant to get admitted in the hospital. But it was an emergency to clean the infection, our staff counselled her for surgery.

We had arranged for an anaesthetist and surgery was done.

After surgery, Niruben got vision and had tears in her eyes to express her gratitude. Niruben & her family members are very happy as they had very hard time since last two months. But now they have come out of hard time and will live happy family life.

#### Protect vision by timely treatment

Vaishali S. Makwana is native of Jhagadia Dist. Bharuch. Vaishali is a trainee nurse at Jayaben Mody Hospital, Ankleshwar. One day while returning home from Ankleshwar, a monkey attacked her and her right eye was injured. She immediately rushed to nearby hospital but from there she was referred to Mandyi.

At Mandvi, our ophthalmologist diagnosed corneal tear as well as lid tear and advised emergency operation. Vaishali & her mother, both were afraid of operation. But our counselor assured them of free surgery and benefit of surgery.

As there was major injury, we had arranged for an anaesthetist, and surgery was done in presence of him. On next day, Vaishali's vision was restored.

Vaishali's father is no more, her mother is a Mid day Meal worker. She has two sisters, who are students. Looking to her socio-economic condition, the surgery was done free of cost and gave her a new life.

If this surgery would not have been done here, there was a chance of losing vision in case of Vaishali. So she & her family members are happy & very much thankful to Tejas Eye hospital.



## ල්ව Community based Rehabilitation Programme ල්ල

As stated in previous reports; community based rehabilitation programme has been started to help blind people to live with confidence & self respect.

The first CBR project was implemented at Mandvi taluka in 2012 for 3 years. We found 127 blind people and helped them to live better life. After that, the CBR project was implemented at Mangrol & Umarpada taluka from Jan-15. Here, we found 182 blinds. Now from January 2018 the project is implemented at Vyara taluka.

First, we searched for workers, then selected them by interview. After selection, we have imparted training to these workers during 12/3 to 25/3. The villages of Vyara taluka were divided in 10 clusters & then door to door survey was carried out from March-18 till Sep.-18.

The training for 2nd module was imparted during 10/9 to 30/9, during which last week training was given at Blind Peoples' Association - Ahmedabad.

CBR workers conducted school screening for schools of Vyara taluka. Similarly they did publicity for 1 day camps sponsored by Fullerton/DBCS/VFI.

The detail of school screening as well as survey work is given in table no. 11 & 12.

World Diabetes Day - on 14th Nov. was celebrated by organising a rally at Vill. Lakhali, Tal. Vyara.

3 CBR workers attended "Rasoi competition & Samuh Lagna" of blind girls held at C.U. Shah Pragnachaksu Mahila Seva Kunj, Surendranagar.

World Handicapped Day was celebrated on 3rd December. Total 110 disabled / handicapped people participated in different games.

One picnic to Gira Falls near Dang was arranged on 15th August for staff with family, total 65 people enjoyed the picnic.

During Diwali, our President Shri Bharatbhai Shah distributed sweets & clothes to all staff members. Apart from that our trustee Shri Omprakashji distributed sweets to all staff members. Over & above, Shri Rajendrabhai Karnik distributed sweets, namkeen & clothes to our peons, drivers & housekeeping staff.



### Financial Outlay

We are very happy to note that even in the Eighth year; we have performed 67 % operations totally free. The rest were either subsidised or paid. However, it is important to note that our charges are heavily subsidised against the prevalent market rates.

Total expenditure of the trust including hospital, diagnostic camps, training centre, research activities, C.B.R. programme, Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan, Janseva Medical & Optical store and staff welfare during the year was Rs. 7.74 crore including recurring and non-recurring expenses. Total recurring expenditure was Rs. 7.06 crore whereas total non-recurring expenditure was Rs. 68 lacs.

Patient income has remained almost the same against the last year which came to Rs. 2.01 crore. It comes to 28 % of the total recurring expenses. Apart from that, we receive support from District Blindness Control Society – reimbursement for free surgeries and from Rashtriya Suraksha Bima Yojana (RSBY scheme) – the insurance taken by the Govt. for the BPL families. Other than that, organisations like Vision Foundation of India, Mission for Vision, Helpage India, Combat Blindness Foundation etc. are of great help.


Kasturi bhojanshala which caters to the indoor patients & relatives, staff, blind children, guests and outstation OPD patients is getting support from Surat Manav Seva Sangh (Chhayando). Total number of dishes prepared and served is increasing year after year. Similarly, the expenses for Vivekananda Pragnachakshu Bhavan comes from Poddar Tyres, Mumbai under their CSR programme. We sincerely appreciate continuous support received from them every year. However, local support from the Mandvi town is also significant for blind children.


The turnover of Janseva medical store has also increased and more and more patients are getting the benefits of the subsidised facility available here. Whatever little surplus we generate from this activity, is utilised to provide free spectacles and medicines to the poor patients. Training and consultancy services makes a small contribution of 2.1 %. We have started Diwaliba Optometry College from this year under Uka Tarsadia University. All the

expenses will be born by us for the college. This year, being the first year, there were only six students and so, we had to give a substantial amount of money to the college. All the remaining expenditure is managed through donations. We received 28.2% from Institutional donors and 14.3% through Individual donors. We are getting substantial support from Lilavati R. Shah Medical Relief Trust, Mumbai for eco-friendly activities on a regular basis every year.

Of the total recurring expenditure, we spent 73.2% on the hospital activities, 15% on camp activities, 1.8% on training and research activities, 9% on Community Based Rehabilitation activities and 1.0% on staff welfare activities.

With the grace of GOD, all these eight years, we never had a problem with the recurring expenses. We have to put in some efforts to generate donations BUT we are able to meet ends. We are sure, the same support will continue from donors and well wishers like you and many others even in future. We are going to take up a major project to create a campus at Amalsadi soon after we get the donated land cleared for non agriculture purpose. It will be a big expenditure of Rs. 27 crore in first phase and for that we will need support from all possible corners of the society.


